Notification page user study findings

Goals

- 1. Understand whether the Notification page design offers needed functionality
- 2. Evaluate whether users can use the Notification page to
 - Understand what's new
 - Decide what to do next
 - Complete pending work
- 3. Evaluate the general usability of the Notification page interface
 - Filtering
 - Searching
 - Interacting with individual notifications & bundles

Methods

Interviewees

- 4 active editors
- Primary projects: en.wiki

Protocol

- Part 1: ask questions about current process
- Part 2: have participants perform tasks with notification page
- Part 3: elicit participants' impressions of the Notification page

Prototypes

- Variants with check and dot badges for unread

Notification page

Overview

- participants were enthusiastic about new notification features, especially the ability to 'thank' people within the panel, bundling, new icons
- participants had very little trouble performing tasks within the notification panel
- reaction to notification page redesign was generally positive as well, despite faceted filtering issues and limitations of the prototype

Overview

- participants were unclear whether actions they performed within the notification panel effected their watchlists
- participants wanted to have a 'diff' link (or other permalink) available for all notifications
- inconsistencies in wording within notification and menu content caused confusion. Examples:
 - "view reverted edit"
 - o "this page"
 - "left you a message" vs. "new topic was created"
 - "view settings for all events"
 - "watch new activity"

secondary actions

- participants had few, if any, issues discovering and identifying "..." this time around
- "watch new activity" (terminology & use of filled-in star icon) caused confusion
- participants often expected to find a diff, talkpage link in SE menu
- inconsistency in availability of SE options may be an issue

muting and volume control

- participants criticized the sound analogy, but understood it
- participants unfamiliar with Flow were confused by "mute topic"
- "adjust notification volume" functionality not directly tested (absent from prototype)

bundled notification

- expand bundled notifications was discoverable and well understood
- username + post preview were useful
- only bundled Flow notifications were tested

mark as (un)read

- "Mark all as read" was discoverable and well understood
- most participants were able to mark individual notifications as unread when prompted
- poor color contrast between read/unread notifications confused several participants

notification page

- link to "all notifications" was discoverable and well understood
- faceted notification (left rail) was not obviously interactive
- several participants attempted to perform the task using the Search/View widgets first, which were not interactive in the prototype

Next steps

Short-term design changes

- 1. make diff, talkpage links consistently available for all relevant notification types
- 2. revise design of faceted filter panel on notification page
- make identified changes to wording throughout the interface (see report)
- 4. increase color contrast between read and unread notifications

Future testing

- Test more fully-featured Notification page prototype
- 2. Test notification panel with more notification types
 - a. e.g. @mentions, translations, page links, non-Flow talkpage notifications
- 3. Test multiple approaches to bundling
- 4. Test multi-step volume control settings and muting workflows

General recommendations

- Avoid creating (or suggesting) interactions between watchlist and notification panel, settings
- Focus on complementing, rather than duplicating, current watchlist functionality
- Consider providing user education tips upon feature activation, to help adopters understand new functionality (cf. VE)
- Develop and publish detailed notification design guidelines to ensure consistency among current and future notifications

- what other research needs do you anticipate for this project, and when?
