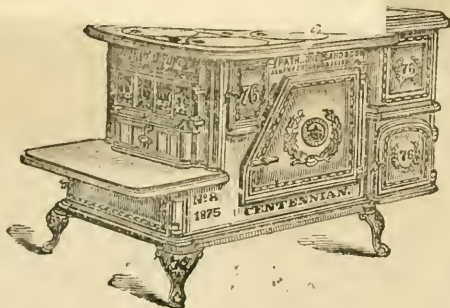



HISTORICAL SKETCH

OF THE

CITY OF RALEIGH.

In the year 1587, on the Island of Roanoke, a village was built, and named in honor of Sir Walter Raleigh. But this new-born city of Raleigh had utterly disappeared upon the return of Governor White from England, in 1790. From that date, for two centuries, there was really no Capital City of what is now known as North Carolina. The Governor and all the Provincial and State officers resided where it best pleased them, and only for the four years beginning with 1771 was there any fixed locality assuming to be the real seat of Government. After the completion of the palace built by Governor Tryon, in Newbern, until the breaking out of the Revolution, that City on the Neuse was the residence of the royal Chief Magistrates, and the designated scene for the enactment of laws by the General Assembly. With the upheaval and confusion of 1775 Newbern lost this short-lived importance, and for thirteen years, though some of the Governors lived in the palace, others did not, and the General Assembly met at whatever town might best suit the majority of the members.

Fayetteville, Halifax and Hillsboro soon, became the most favored of the many towns which desired and struggled for the honor and emoluments obtained in entertaining the Governor and the Legislature in the annual sessions of the latter. Judge Gaston, in a speech delivered in the Convention of 1835, asserted that this annual contest over the next place of meeting for the General Assembly had grown into an intolerable nuisance, and absorbed a large portion of the time and attention of the legislators. It was made a matter of more importance than the gravest legislation, or the filling

of the highest offices, so many of which then rested in the keeping of the General Assembly. The territory now forming the State of Tennessee was then a portion of North Carolina. Members from that far-off region generally insisted upon the selection of Hillsboro, while the populous counties of the east would rarely consent to go further west than Fayetteville. It was at last determined that this wandering about of the seat of Government should cease, and the people were directed, by the act of Assembly calling the Convention of 1788, to vote upon the question as to whether that body should settle upon some point as the future seat of Government. Fayetteville, then a town of two thousand inhabitants, had been the foremost in candidacy; but the Convention acting in pursuance of the popular instructions, ordered that the Legislature should select some spot within ten miles of the farm of Isaac Hunter, in the county of Wake. This result was said to have grown out of the defection of Timothy Bloodworth, of New Hanover, who had previously, with all the Cape Fear people, supported the pretensions of the town in Cumberland.

Notwithstanding this ordinance of the Convention, the Legislature was in no hurry to carry out the decree. Years elapsed before the matter was finally settled, and it was only in 1791 that a bill was passed by which Frederick Hargett, Willie Jones, William Johnston Dawson, Joseph McDowell, Thomas Blount, James Martin and others, were directed to select and purchase a suitable place for the future City. When a like bill, in the previous Legislature, was brought to its third reading in the House of Commons there was a tie vote of fifty-one for, and the same number opposed to its passage, Stephen Cabarrus, of Chowan, then Speaker, gave the deciding vote, and it went to the Senate with like result, when General William Lenoir, Speaker of that body, defeated the measure by voting in the negative. On the 4th day of April they met, and having chosen the plantation of Col. Joel Lane, at Wake Court House, they purchased the same. The tract contained a thousand acres. On four hundred of these were located lines describing the streets and boundaries of the City of Raleigh. The Commissioners reserved five squares of four acres each for public use, and sold at auction two hundred and seventy-six lots, containing one acre in each parcel. The central reservation upon

which the State House was to be located, was called Union Square, and the four others were named in honor of Governor Richard Caswell, Judge Alfred Moore, Governor Abner Nash and Governor Thomas Burke, respectively.

The Commissioners who were thus the founders of Raleigh were distinguished men. Frederick Hargett was long prominent as a Senator from Jones County. Willie Jones had then retired in disgust at the adoption of the Federal Constitution, but for many years previously had even surpassed Governor Caswell in the real depth and permanence of his influence in the Provincial Congresses and State Legislatures. Col. McDowell was his successor in Democratic control. He had been a gallant soldier, and was generally respected for his high character and unvarying wisdom. Col. James Martin was the brother of Alexander Martin, then Governor of the State, and had also given distinguished service to the patriot cause in the Revolution. Mr. Dawson was highly educated and respected, but died early while a member of Congress from the Edenton District. He lived at Eden House, in Bertie, where his ancestors, Governors Eden and Gabriel Johnston had likewise resided. Messrs. Blount and Dawson were specially entrusted with the expenditure of the funds devoted to the erection of the State House, and they also supervised the progress of that work. Blount, like Dawson, was born in Bertie but dwelt in Edgecombe, where he was greatly valued. He was long prominent in the State Assembly, and also a member of the United States Congress for twelve years. He was a brother of Governors William and Willie Blount, of Tennessee, and of General John Gray Blount, of Beaufort County.

A single session of the General Assembly had been held at Wake Court House during the progress of the Revolution, but it was still a mere hamlet and not even worthy to be called a village. The buildings for public use were not fit for occupation until late in 1794. In the month of November in that year the Legislature held its first session in the new City of Raleigh. The State House was a large building of brick and wood, located where the present Capitol so majestically stands. It was built of the proceeds of the City lots recently disposed of at auction. It had no ornaments to relieve its huge ugliness, and cost twenty thousand dollars. Its form and arrangements were very much like those of the present building. It was used for a variety of pur-

poses, and when not graced with the assembled wisdom, was a house of worship on the Sabbath, and a theatre or ball-room during the week.

The sale of lots produced much competition among purchasers, who came to the sale in a majority of cases to invest their money in speculation. Many lost heavily in those ventures and realized upon actual sale far less than the sum expended. The State had paid Colonel Joel Lane at the rate of seven dollars and a half per acre for that portion of the tract still uncleared, and five dollars an acre for the old field west of Fayetteville street, the whole sum amounting to less than seven thousand dollars. The sale of lots produced six thousand, six hundred and twelve pounds and fifteen shillings; that is, thirty-three thousand and sixty-five dollars. In 1801 a quarter of an acre on Fayetteville street, above Hargett, only brought sixty dollars, though now worth full fifteen thousand. In 1796, during the rule of Governor Ashe, a great sensation grew out of the land frauds of Glasgow, Armstrong and others. The Governor was warned by letter of conspiracies forming in Tennessee to shield the culprits. There was a ball at Casso's tavern, and during the festivities a negro announced that burglars were forcing an entrance into the State House. A colored servant of one of the guilty men was captured and afterwards hanged. He was seeking to abstract the records, whose locality were so familiar to Tyrel, his master.

The first newspaper established in Raleigh, in 1799, was the *Register*, a weekly journal of the usual small size seen at that day. It was the property of Joseph Gales, who had been conducting a paper in Sheffield, in England, and was forced to leave his native land to avoid a prosecution growing out of his expressing liberal views, and the Government's intense alarm at the aspects of the French revolution. Mr. Gales was a wise and honorable man, and was a great acquisition to the infant City. He combined, as did most editors of that day, book-selling with his press engagements, and not unfrequently devoted a broadside of the paper to advertising his fresh arrivals of literary treasures.

Up to 1807 the city had but about seven hundred inhabitants. There was then no church building, and the three hotels were of the humblest pretensions. The Academy was established in 1802 by the following trustees: John

Ingles, William White, Nathaniel Jones, Henry Seawell, Simon Turner, William Boylan, John Marshall and Joseph Gales. Mr. Boylan was the proprietor of a second newspaper, called the *Minerva*, established a few months after the *Register*. The war of words sometimes grew bitter between the two editors, and in one instance proceeded to personal conflict. Mr. Gales was a Democrat-Republican, while Mr. Boylan was ever unyielding in advocacy of the perishing faith of the Federalists.

In 1804 the Raleigh Academy had won enough popularity to justify the employment of a faculty, numbering three persons. These were Marin Detargney, Chesley Daniel and Charlotte Brodie. Six years later Rev. Dr. Wm. McPheeters came from Virginia and assumed control, and was further announced by the Secretary of State, William White, as "Pastor of the City." Dr. McPheeters was considered a most faithful and competent teacher and of like good fame as a dispenser of the truths of religion.

The Governor had been required by the statute of 1802 to reside in Raleigh, and at the time now reached in this narrative occupied a two-story framed house on Fayetteville street, filling the present site of the State National Bank.

In 1813 the Assembly agreed that an Executive Mansion, not to exceed in cost twenty-five thousand dollars, should be built at the foot of Fayetteville street. Judges Potter and Seawell, William Hunter, Nathaniel Jones of Crabtree, Theo. Hunter and Capt. William Pearce were made Commissioners. This structure, which had inherited by popular courtesy the former title of Gov. Tryon's magnificent residence in Newbern, is yet a discredit to the liberality of the State and the taste of the Commissioners. The old Burgesses of 1767 voted seventy-five thousand dollars for an executive mansion, when perhaps the public means were ten-fold less than were in the reach of their Republican successors. They doubtless remembered the odium incurred by the men of a former day on the charge of profusion, and erred in the opposite direction. Gov. William Miller, of Warren, was the first occupant of the new mansion, and presided over the State's destinies for the three years of war and disaster, when America was renewing her battles for freedom against the power of Great Britain.

Judge Potter mentioned above was a Granville man by

birth, and Judge of the United States District Court in North Carolina. He succeeded John Sitgreaves, who died in 1801, and he lingered in office for more than a half century. He was good and true, but never an able man. Very different was Henry Seawell. He had left his trade as a carpenter to become one of the most powerful and overbearing advocates ever seen in the State. He was "cock of the walk" as a criminal lawyer, and perhaps a match for even John Stanly in the strength and violence of his oratory.

Capt. William Peace and his brother Joseph were models as wise and reputable tradesmen. They were to accumulate large fortunes, and dying perpetuate their names in the institution now so prosperous under Presbyterian auspices as a female college.

Colonel William Polk was probably the most conspicuous citizen then in Raleigh. His brilliant service in the Revolution, his large wealth and social position gave him great weight and consideration. He dwelt at the head of Blount street in the house now used as the Baptist Female Seminary, and was the first President of the Bank of North Carolina. He married Sarah Hawkins and was the father of the late Bishop, Leonidas Polk, and Mrs. Kenneth Rayner. John Haywood was then Treasurer of the State, and with his brothers, Sherwood, Stephen and William Henry Haywood, was also a resident of Raleigh. John Haywood was the first Mayor of the town, and was universally admired and beloved for his soundness of head and heart. His kinsman, Judge John Haywood, had gone to Tennessee, but is yet remembered as one of the very ablest lawyers ever seen in the State. This remarkable family have still continuance in this respect, for in Col. Edward Graham Haywood, now of the Raleigh Bar, there is a reproduction of his astute and learned collateral ancestor. William Boylan was reared a printer and was laying the foundation of a fortune, which was to become of great proportions in the hands of his son. He was a man of much gravity in his demeanor and an intense Federalist in his political views. James Comans was a prosperous merchant, occupying the only brick store in Raleigh. Col. William White, of Lenoir, had succeeded the disgraced James Glasgow as Secretary of State, and was a man of much prudence and wisdom. His daughters married Daniel L.

Barringer, Gov. David L. Swain and Gen. Boone Felton, being the granddaughters of Governor Caswell.

The Raleigh *Star* was established in 1809 by Jones & Henderson. Col. Thomas Henderson was much admired for his *bonhomie* and high spirits. He and a Scotch merchant named Callum on one occasion narrowly escaped drowning, and were only rescued by the bravery of Jacob Johnson, father of the late President, who occupied the humble position of porter to the Bank of the State of North Carolina. The future Chief Magistrate of the nation was then a child, and is said to have been born in the corner lot next to the Capitol, where Stronach's grocery is now to be found. It was then a tavern, and was afterwards for many years the bookstore of H. D. Turner, whose name yet survives in the valuable almanacs issued by Mr. Enniss. President Johnson was reared as a tailor, but left upon growing to man's estate, and in Tennessee won his way to fame and fortune.

The first church built in Raleigh was erected by Rev. William Glendenning, an eccentric and partially demented O'Kelleyite, who traded and preached to a congregation who made small returns in the shape of salary. The Methodists next erected a building of wood upon Edenton street. The Baptists in 1813 followed with another, which was moved over from its original position to Moore Square. This denomination at that day had strangely avoided the towns in their church efforts. They were strong and aggressive in the rural districts, but had just begun to seek for foothold in the populous centres. The Presbyterian church, still standing near the Capitol, was erected in 1817, and it was not till 1829 that Christ church was erected by the Episcopalians.

The fires of 1820 and 1821 led to the formation of fire companies. The ineffectual water-works, which had been erected in 1815, had already been abandoned. Time and again a large portion of Fayetteville street was burned down, and to this day the best supply of the only means of combating the destroying element consists of cisterns sunk in the streets and kept filled for an emergency.

Raleigh received a considerable benefit in the creation of the Supreme Court on its present basis in 1818. This was accomplished chiefly through the exertions of Bartlett Yan-

cey, of Caswell, who was equally distinguished as a lawyer and statesman. Chief Justice Taylor took up his residence at the place afterwards the home of Judge Saunders and now occupied by Capt. Samuel A. Ashe. Judge Taylor was a great addition to the permanent society of the city, and was well called by the late Gov. Swain the "Mansfield of North Carolina." Gavin Hogg and Peter Browne were the most prominent of the resident lawyers. Mr. Hogg had been reared in Orange, but came from Windsor to Raleigh, having in Bertie laid broad the foundation of his ultimate success at the bar. He was an austere man, with great powers of invective and thorough comprehension of legal technicalities. His rival, Peter Browne, was a Scotchman, and also an able lawyer. Both made large fortunes, and as Browne was a bachelor, many of his Raleigh friends are said to have indulged in great expectations as to the terms of his will. After discussing the merits of unnumbered good dinners at their expense, Peter Browne slept with his fathers, and gave his half million of dollars to a nephew in Scotland. Moses Mordecai was another good lawyer and prominent in the courts.

In 1825 the Capital City was moved to its core with the famous visit of Gen. Lafayette. Chief Justice Taylor and Col. Wm. Polk went to Jackson, in Northampton county, to meet him, and the great Frenchman honored his old comrade-in-arms with a hearty embrace. He and Col. Polk had served together under the immediate eye of Washington and a sincere attachment grew up between the two, who were then both very young. The Marquis was *feted* and honored as his great services in the past had deserved, and he went on his way, everywhere receiving the greetings of a people that he, a half century before, had shed his blood and treasure to defend. His portrait in an engraving may be yet seen in the Capitol as he stood with Miss Elizabeth Haywood admiring the noble proportions of Conova's statue of Washington. Alas! this splendid work of art was soon to be lost to the world. In 1831, while a mechanic was engaged in some repairs on the roof of the Capitol, he accidentally set fire thereto and consumed the building, with the costly work of art.

The sessions of the Legislature, the residence of the Governor, and the Supreme Court room made Raleigh a place

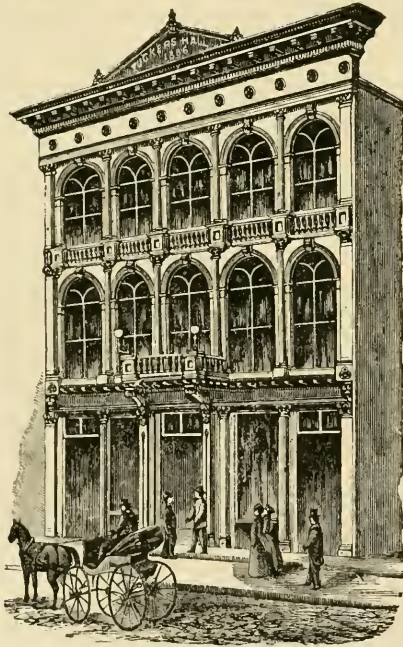

of great advantage to men of culture and professional attainments. Judge George E. Badger, Judge R. M. Saunders, Thomas Pollock Devereux, Bartholomew F. Moore, Gov. James Iredell, John H. Bryan, James B. Shepherd, and others, came from the rural districts and immensely added to the legal and social coteries. The inland situation and want of means for transportation of merchandise made the city's growth very slow until the inauguration of the internal improvements. In 1833 a railroad was chartered to be built from Raleigh to the Roanoke. It connected with the Petersburg and Weldon route at Gaston. This work was finished in 1840, and was thus coincident with the completion of the new Capitol, the building of which had been begun in the same year with the railroad. The Capitol cost considerably more than a half million of dollars.

Messrs. Joseph and William Peace had long and prosperous lives and grew rich as merchants. In 1818 Ruffin Tucker and his brother William C. Tucker commenced business with slender capital, in a small framed building on Fayetteville street on precisely the same site where his sons are now each year selling goods amounting to hundreds of thousands of dollars in value. This establishment is the oldest and strongest in the State, and has long been characterized by large enterprise, strict integrity and abundant success. In the darkest hours of the State's prostration after the ruin of the war W. H. & R. S. Tucker proceeded, in advance of all similar improvements in Raleigh, to erect their spacious building, which is yet unapproached as a store-house in North Carolina.

Upon the death of Joseph Gales, in 1842, he was succeeded in the editorial management of the *Raleigh Register* by his son Western Raleigh. This paper, upon the formation of the Whig party, became its organ, and was a great favorite with its supporters. W. R. Gales was a genial and excellent man, and like his father, devoted all his days to the conduct of his paper and the duties of his office when Mayor of the city. William Dallas Haywood came after him in dispensing justice to minor offenders, and remained Mayor until about the time of the breaking out of the late war between the States.

In 1843 Rev. Aldert Smedes came to the city and established St. Mary's School for the education of young ladies.

This most deserving and popular seminary was under the patronage and visitation of Right Reverend L. Silliman Ives, then Episcopal Bishop of North Carolina. It rapidly grew into public favor and is yet recognized as a chosen seat of learning and the feminine graces.

Another great impetus to the growth and trade of Raleigh was the inauguration of the North Carolina Railroad, in 1848. At that time the Raleigh and Gaston route had become almost a complete failure. The track was in wretched repair, and the travel and traffic of a year would scarcely equal that of a single month at the present time. The small, worn-out engines consumed about twenty hours in passing from Gaston to Raleigh, and were fast making railroads a mockery in the estimation of all who knew of other and better sustained lines of travel. A great change was to come as the iron tracks went back to the mountains, and opened into other States. In no quarter was a larger benefit to be realized than to Raleigh. As a general thing the Democrats had opposed the building of railroads by the General and State Governments, but the great scheme of 1848 was reported by William S. Ashe, of New Hanover, as chairman of the House Committee on Internal Improvements, and finally passed the Senate by the casting vote of Mr. President Calvin Graves, of Caswell, who was also a Democrat. No modern people have been able to keep abreast with the world's civilization without sufficient highways. They are the truest tests and exponents of the real culture and resources of a community, and without them the toil of men and fertility of soil are alike abortive and fruitless.

With the breaking out of the great war, in 1861, Raleigh became, more than ever before, the head and heart of North Carolina. Here were gathered into camps of instruction a large portion of the army, numbering first and last almost one hundred and twenty-five thousand men, sent out by North Carolina to uphold the Southern Government. The City furnished many men who were brave and true in the unavailing contest. General L. O. B. Branch, Lt.-Col. George P. Bryan, Major James J. Iredell, like many other former citizens of the place, were brought home on their shields, having sealed their faith with their blood.

Raleigh, in all its history, was never in such peril as

when ex-Governors Graham and Swain, accompanied by Surgeon-General Edward Warren, went forward to arrange the terms of the Capital's captivity under General Sherman. Conductor D. T. Ward, of Franklinton, had charge of the railway train, on which they penetrated the Federal lines, and, at serious peril, besought the devastors of the South to spare the City. The recent surrender of Gen. R. E. Lee, and the utter hopelessness of Gen. J. E. Johnston's position, alone saved Raleigh from the fate of Atlanta and Columbia.

Since the war the population has increased three-fold. Palaces of trade and stately mansions have grown up in every quarter. In nothing has there been so marked an advance as in the means of education. First, the Baptist Female Seminary, and then the Peace Institute, and then Shaw University, and the Graded School, and others followed in rapid succession, until pupils in the corporate limits are numbered by the thousand.

The noble State charities seen in the Asylums for the insane, and for the blind and dumb were never in more admirable condition than at present. Dr. Eugene Grissom has become national in his reputation as a skilful restorer of lost reason, the saddest and direst of human calamities.

We conclude this sketch with an extract from the columns of *Hale's Weekly*, setting out various matters, better known to the local editor, Col. Frederick A. Olds, than to this writer :

All North Carolinians are interested in and proud of their Capital City. The name it bears is significant and appropriate. Its central position makes it the heart of the State, and its beauty and growth are the honor and hope of all the people. Born with the century, it grew naturally because it was the city of residence of the State Government. It was nothing more. There was little enterprise, and no business, as the word is now understood. Its population was made up of those who came here as officers of the departments, wealthy eastern planters who made it a summer resort, and the people who relied upon the drippings from the disbursements of the public funds for a livelihood. Its mild and healthful climate, its situation, and the abundance and sturdy beauty of its trees made those who came as sojourners remain to live and die in its limits. "The City of Oaks" was worn as a title by the young capital. A refined

and cultivated society was the consequence of these conditions, but there was a dearth of the push and eager desire for riches that make men risk present comfort for the sake of future ease and plenty. There was enough and to spare, and there were no paupers. It was a skeleton city; a beautiful village. The main thoroughfares lay like a cross on the city with the Capitol, one of the handsomest public buildings in the Union, at their intersection. They began at Union Square, stretching their broad lengths indefinitely to the points of the compass. Built of wood, fires found easy prey, and more than once devoured the thickly settled portions of the city. It grew by accretion.

ITS WAR GROWTH.

When the war broke out upon the country Raleigh became the military head-quarters of the State. Camps of instruction were established on its outskirts. It was a supply depot. The immense number of transient visitors created a demand for accommodations. Temporary buildings became permanent. The quick sale of all the necessaries of life begot business. The fluctuations of the currency, and the desperate affairs of men aroused a spirit of speculation, and into this excitement came the energy and shrewdness which it naturally attracts. From these beginnings came the present Raleigh.

THE AFTER-WAR GROWTH.

Immediately upon the cessation of hostilities, Raleigh was occupied by a large force of the Federal army. The troops were paid off, and a large amount of money was put in circulation. This stimulus increased the pace of its progress. Then came the days of re-construction. The wild schemes of the adventurers were set on foot and matured at the Capital. The vast army of subalterns that was employed in affecting the change in the Government of the State had to be paid off in fat jobs. Workmen were paid good wages for completing them. The leaders were as reckless of their own suddenly acquired wealth as they were avaricious of obtaining it. They sowed greenbacks broadcast, and prudent and far-sighted business men came behind them and

reaped a golden harvest. Money was spent in every conceivable way in the years from 1865 to 1870, and this period was undoubtedly the "flush times" of Raleigh. The material progress was now evident. Handsome stores and dwellings rose rapidly, and enterprise was manifested in many ways. Property was held at high figures, but found ready buyers, and the place began to lose its old appearance, and assume that of a growing city. Its population had grown from 4,000 in 1860 to 8,000 in 1870. The improvement did not prove ephemeral, but continued steadily. The panic of 1873 came, but did not blight the growth of the city, whose prosperity then became assured. No business houses suffered during those dark days, and the people did not lose heart through the period of depression which followed.

A STEADY PROSPERITY.

The growth of the city, though great in all parts, has been mainly in the eastern and northern portions. In 1870 the progress made in those portions is really wonderful. Shady streets and rows of elegant houses stand where, but a short time past, were but bare fields or woods.

THE COTTON BUSINESS

had assumed large proportions on account of the high price of the staple, and year by year increases. The cotton of this section ranks high in the markets, and is always in special demand. In other branches trade has increased, until now the quiet old town has developed into a bustling new city.

RAILROAD FACILITIES.

There run into the city four railways, the Raleigh & Gaston, from Norfolk; the North Carolina, from Morehead City; the North Carolina, from Charlotte; and the Raleigh & August Air-Line, from Hamlet. These give ready access to all points, North, South, East and West, and place the city in direct communication with other business centres. Another road is proposed to run from Raleigh to Williams-

ton, and thence to Washington, and this route has been surveyed.

THE COTTON TRADE.

As has been stated, this trade has assumed large proportions. It did not really begin until 1870, and has since shown a steady and gratifying increase. The dealers are reliable and well acquainted with the staple, and the farmers have found that no place in the State is so good a market as this. We present below the figures, showing the number of bales sold here in the various years since 1874, with the increase, etc. :

BUSINESS HOUSES.

The trade in all departments of business is good during the season. Large stocks are kept, and full lines carried. There are three banks with a capital of \$1,000,000. The wholesale trade has increased rapidly, and the city now supplies several of the counties adjacent to Wake. The extension of the Raleigh & Augusta Air-Line has developed a fine trade, and goods are sold extensively on all the lines of rail.

FACTORIES, SHOPS, ETC.

There is in the city three iron foundries, one boiler shop, five large planing mills, which, together, give employment

to some 250 persons. At the Raleigh & Gaston Railroad shops excellent work of all kinds is done, and the engines and cars there built will compare with those made anywhere in the country. There are also two furniture manufacturing, in which good work is done. There are two excellent quarries near the city, from both of which granite of a fine quality is taken, as well as three brick-yards, which are located near the city, and two marble and stone-cutting establishments.

CHURCHES.

Our city has an unusually large number of churches. There are ten of these for whites: of these three are Episcopalian, three Methodist, two Baptist, two Presbyterian. There are also one Roman Catholic chapel and one Jewish Synagogue. There are seven colored churches—two Methodist, two Baptist, two Congregational and one Episcopalian. In addition there is one white and one colored chapel at schools. A new church is being built for the Second Baptist congregation, white, and a large brick one for the colored Baptists.

SCHOOLS.

The city has first-class educational facilities, its schools having a wide reputation for the ability of the instructors and the thoroughness of the instruction given. There are three white female colleges carrying on the rolls 250 pupils. There is a male high school, at which 70 boys are in attendance. The white graded school has on its roster 610 children. There are also seven other white schools, two of them parochial, all preparatory, with an attendance of about 150; making a total of 1,080 white children at our schools. There is a colored normal school, for male and female teachers, at which are some 60 students; a large colored mixed school—the Shaw Collegiate Institute—with 150; three colored graded schools, with 750; and a colored school at Oberlin, with 100—a total of over 1,000 colored children. Thus we find that there are at our schools 2,180 pupils.

PUBLIC BUILDINGS.

The Capitol, one of the finest buildings in the South, is in

Union Square. A mile away stands the Lunatic Asylum, one of the three State institutions for those unfortunates. Near at hand, and in the city, are the Institutions for the white and colored Deaf and Dumb and the Blind. The United States Government has completed a magnificent Court-house and Post-office. The city has a Metropolitan Building, containing a public hall, Mayor's court, guard and assembly rooms and a market, which is commodious. Near the city, two miles away, are located the Fair Grounds of the State Agricultural Society, covering forty acres, and which are admirably arranged.

SUBURBAN HOMES.

There is a growing taste for houses in the suburbs. Quite a town, composed almost entirely of colored people, has grown up a mile northwest of the city. The length is more than a mile, and it has some 750 inhabitants. It has been given the name of Oberlin. There is another suburb, called Brooklyn, in the same direction, with about 100 residents. The houses in the city are almost entirely of wood, but little stone or brick being used in the construction of dwellings. An ample space is given each dwelling, and this causes the city to cover much ground. One of the public squares is used as a cotton yard, and another as an ornamental garden.

CITY GOVERNMENT, &C.

There is but little crime, comparatively speaking, here. The city authorities are a Mayor and Board of Aldermen. There is a Chief of Police and a force of ten men; a Health Officer; a Street Superintendent and a street force of twenty laborers. There is one steam fire company, one colored fire company, and bucket and hook and ladder companies. Five companies of State troops are here—two white, three colored; one artillery, four infantry. The city is lighted with gas and gasoline. There are 58 miles of streets open, 150 lamps, and 87 public pumps. There are thirteen fire cisterns finished or in progress, with a total capacity of 275,000 gallons. There is a charity hospital for the indigentsick and disabled.

THE YEAR'S IMPROVEMENT.

During the year, up to the first of September, there were

completed three brick stores, five of wood, and thirty-one dwellings of all descriptions, many of them handsome ones. There are now in progress three stores, of wood; two churches; three brick dwellings, and twenty-eight dwellings of wood. A number of improvements have been made on the streets and side-walks. The roads out from the city afford excellent drives, and the citizens have an unusually large number of fine equipages.

GENERAL NOTES.

There are ten papers published here. Of these three are dailies, six weeklies and one monthly. Two of these are for colored people, one of them being an industrial journal. The colored people will hold an Industrial Fair during the coming autumn.

There are three white cemeteries, and one for colored persons, and a National and a Confederate cemetery.

There are six hotels, nine boarding houses and five restaurants in the city, which afford ample accommodations to visitors.

The professions are represented by men of high intelligence and character. Trade is carried on by honest merchants, and work in all departments is done by thrifty and sober workmen. A good understanding between employers and employees has avoided any necessity for strikes, and the labor of the year moves on as quietly as the days succeed the nights. Raleigh needs factories of all kinds. It can bear double its population without extending its limits, and then its population would not be dense enough to increase its mortality, that is now insignificant in comparison with other cities of the Union. The people of Raleigh are given to hospitality, and strangers coming amongst us linger with delight and leave us with reluctance.

CENTENNIAL GRADED SCHOOL.

This school was established for whites in 1876, in the old Governor's Mansion, at the foot of Fayetteville street. On the first of August in that year it was opened. There was an attendance of 406 pupils during the first month of its existence. Capt. Dugger was then, as now, the Principal,

and was assisted by eight teachers. The greater portion of the teachers had but little experience, and found the new systems of instruction somewhat hard to master, but they soon became proficient. During the year 1876 there were 568 children on the rolls. In 1877, the second year, there were 503 enrolled. In 1878 there were 611 pupils, and another teacher was added. The present term opened with 618 children on the rolls during the month of August. There are now ten teachers—three male, seven female. Of the pupils 314 are boys and 304 girls. The average age of the children is ten years, though many are there who are nearly grown; no children attend under six years. In the Kindergarten department are 175 children of an average age of seven years. There is much music about the building, and to it all the motions of the scholars are executed. In the play grounds, which are large, the children are kept entirely separate. The school obtains from all sources about \$5,000 per annum; the building is rented from the Governor, and has been somewhat altered in the interior to better fit it for its present uses. There are now ten rooms, but they are illy adapted for use as a school. The system of teaching in a graded school permits one teacher to instruct more pupils than could otherwise be taught by two persons. The school is generally liked in the city, though of course, as in all public institutions, there are some objectionable features.

THE JOHNSON SCHOOL.

This is the largest in numbers of the colored graded schools, and is situated near Hillsboro street, rear of the Methodist church, colored. It was organized as a school in 1855, and was then altogether in charge of white teachers from the North. Now the teachers are all appointed by the School Committee, who have jurisdiction over all such matters. There are at this school 180 pupils, who are in three departments—first and second intermediate, and first and second primary. The Principal is Miss Louise S. Dorr, and there are four teachers—three male, one female. In the highest department of instruction there are classes in Latin, algebra, chemistry, etc. Special care is given in this to fit pupils to become teachers.

THE BAPTIST SCHOOL.

This colored graded school is held in the Baptist church on Halifax street, near the Raleigh & Gaston Railroad shops, and the school was established this year with pupils taken from the old school at Tupper's church. There are now enrolled 159 pupils. The teachers are three in number—one male, two female.

THE ST. AUGUSTINE SCHOOL.

This other branch of the former graded school at Tupper's church, is held at St. Augustine church, near the Deaf, Dumb and Blind Asylum. It is small in numbers, there being only thirty pupils enrolled, with one teacher—a female—in charge.

EAST RALEIGH SCHOOL.

This school is also a graded one. It is situated on Davie street, in one of the old wooden buildings used at the old Fair Grounds. The number of pupils the present session is 73, who are in charge of a male teacher. The school was first organized in November, 1878.

It will be seen from the above that there are now on the rolls of the white graded school 618 pupils, and on the rolls of the four colored graded schools 442 scholars, giving a total of 1,060 in attendance at the public schools of the city. There is also a graded school in Oberlin for colored children, which carries on its rolls about one hundred. One thing noticeable is the absence of proper school buildings for either the white or colored public schools. All save one are held in wooden buildings, while the white school is in a building in nowise suitable. As public spirit becomes improved, it is hoped that the city will erect two large and substantial structures, one for each race, with accommodations for two thousand children. The growth of the city will in all ways demand this in the near future.

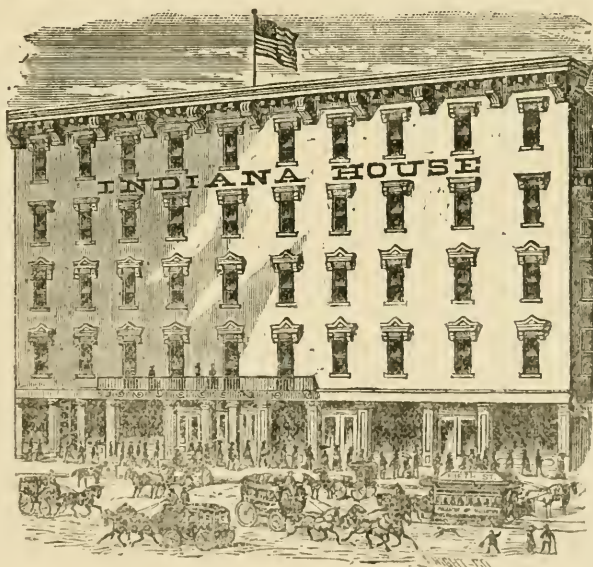

Educational.

(Statistics compiled by Col Fred A Olds.)

Raleigh is graced by three admirable schools for young ladies, which have not only a State reputation, but one which extends all over the South. Their sphere of influence is large, and constantly widening, and they merit success by the perfection of their instruction and other facilities. The oldest of these is

ST MARY'S SCHOOL.

Situated in a large grove of oaks, on Hillsboro Avenue, this school has the advantage of a beautiful situation, while the buildings, three in number, are both handsome and commodious. The buildings were erected in 1834, and a school for young men was held there under the auspices of the Episcopal Church of the State. The first Principal of this was Dr. Cogsdell, a Northern man, who was succeeded by Dr. Empie, of Wilmington. There were about 150 students, many of whom were preparing for the ministry, and among them were several lights of the church in after days.

In 1841, the school was broken up and in the spring of 1842 was opened as a female school. The first Principal was the late lamented Dr. Aldert Smedes. For thirty-five years he presided at its head, and made it one of the most admirable institutions in the country. The corps of teachers was of marked ability, and the course of instruction thorough. During the war the school never closed its doors, but became not only a house of learning but of refuge also, Mrs. Jefferson Davis and children, and a daughter of Gen. R. E. Lee, being among the sheltered there. In 1865 the Federal troops occupied the buildings, but the exercises of the school were not interrupted. In 1876, full of years, honors and faith, the venerable Dr. Smedes passed away from earth. His son, Rev. Bennett Smedes, assumed control as Principal, with Mrs. Kate DeRosset Meares, as Lady Principal, and an able corps of instructors in all its departments. The school has been a success under their management, and there are now about seventy-five scholars on the rolls. Since the be-

ginning of the school more than two thousand pupils have entered, and its 75th session finds the school as useful as ever.

THE PEACE INSTITUTE.

A few years prior to the war, the late William Peace gave \$10,000 to found this school. Work on the building began, and when the war came it was nearly completed. During that dark period it was used as a hospital. In 1865 the U. S. Government occupied it as quarters for the Freedman's Bureau. With some difficulty the Trustees recovered the property, and during 1871, the work of construction was carried on, and the handsome brick four-story structure completed. In 1872, it was taken by the present efficient Principals, Rev. R. Burwell and Mr John B Burwell, who had before conducted a female institute at Charlotte, and earned much reputation as instructors. The first session opened in September, and at the end of the year the number of pupils was over a hundred. The teachers were all chosen for marked ability as instructors, and the results are shown in the high rank the school takes in the South. The school is under the auspices of the Presbyterian denomination. The cost of the building was over \$40,000, and it is a model structure. The concerts are notable for the high degree of musical skill shown by the pupils. The patronage of the Peace is large, there being this term about 100 pupils present. To the usual courses of instruction a cooking school has been added, and there is also a large gymnasium, where all are taught exercises at once healthful and graceful. The situation of the school is excellent, and the pupils enjoy at once the pleasure of a city and a suburban home.

THE RALEIGH FEMALE SEMINARY,

or, as it is commonly called, the Baptist School, is situated in the most delightful part of the city, and is in charge of the Baptist denomination. There were several attempts by the Baptists of the State to found a school here, but they did not bear perfect fruit until 1872. Dr. Wm. Royall, formerly of Wake Forest College, opened the school then in

the Exchange Hotel building, on Hillsboro street. The Rayner place, on Blount street, was purchased, and in 1873, Dr. Royall, who associated with him Prof. F. P. Hobgood, moved into the present building, which has been altered and enlarged. The teachers are able and the instruction complete, and the Principal, a gentleman of marked judgment and ability, succeeded in elevating the school to a high plane of merit. The present Principal, Mr. F. P. Hobgood, succeeded Dr. Royall, and continues to make the school an honor to the State and city. There are at this term about seventy-five pupils. The course of study is complete, and calisthenic exercises are also taught.

CENTENNIAL GRADED SCHOOL.

This school was established for whites in 1876, in the old Governor's mansion, at the foot of Fayetteville street. On the first of August in that year it was opened. There was an attendance of 406 pupils during the first month of its existence. Capt. Dugger was then as now the Principal, and was assisted by eight teachers. During the year 1876 there were 568 children on the rolls. In 1877, the second year, there were 503 enrolled. In 1878 there were 611 pupils, and another teacher was added. The present term opened with 618 children on the rolls during the month of August. There are now ten teachers, three male, seven female. Of the pupils 314 are boys and 304 girls; the average age of the children is about ten years, though many are there who are nearly grown; no children attend under six years. In the Kindergarten department are 175 children of an average age of seven years. There is much music about the building, and to it all the motions of the scholars are executed. In the play grounds, which are large, the children are kept entirely separate. The school obtains from all sources about \$5,000 per annum. The system of teaching in a graded school permits one teacher to instruct more pupils than could otherwise be taught by two persons.

THE JOHNSON SCHOOL.

This is the largest in numbers of the colored graded

schools, and is situated near Hillsboro street, rear of the Methodist Church, colored. It was organized as a school in 1865, and was then altogether in charge of white teachers from the North. Now the teachers are all appointed by the School Committee who have jurisdiction over all such matters. There are at this school 180 pupils, who are in three departments, first and second intermediate, and first and second primary. The Principal is Miss Louise S Dorr, and and there are four teachers, two male, two female. In the highest department of instruction there are classes in Latin, Algebra, Chemistry, etc. Special care is given in this to fit pupils to become teachers.

THE BAPTIST SCHOOL.

This colored graded school is held in the Baptist church on Salisbury street near the R. & G. shops, and the school was established this year with pupils taken from the old school at Tupper's church. There are now enrolled 159 pupils. The teachers are three in number, one male, two female.

THE ST. AUGUSTINE SCHOOL.

This other branch of the former graded school at Tupper's church, is held in St. Augustine church near the Deaf, Dumb and Blind Asylum. It is small in numbers, there being only thirty pupils enrolled, with one teacher, a female, in charge.

EAST RALEIGH SCHOOL.

This school is also a graded one. It is situated on Davie street, in one of the old wooden buildings used at the old fair grounds. The number of pupils the present session is seventy-three, who are in charge of a male teacher. The school was first organized in November, 1878.

It will be seen from the above that there are now on the rolls of the white graded school 618 pupils, and on the rolls of the four colored graded schools 442 scholars, giving a total of 1,060 in attendance at the public schools of the city. There is also a graded school in Oberlin for colored children, which carries on its rolls about 100.

RALEIGH MALE ACADEMY.

This school for boys is held in what is known as Lovejoy's Grove, in an old fashioned wooden building, which is one of the landmarks of the city. The school has a history which connects with that of the city, and the fact that so many of our best and most honored citizens received their instruction in it, endears it to the people. The school was opened in 1811, as a mixed school for boys and girls, by Rev. William McPheeters, who was assisted by Dr. Alexander Wilson. They conducted it until 1827, when Dr. Jonathan Freeman, father of the late Edmund B. Freeman, Esq., took charge. He was succeeded by Judge Grant, now of Iowa, in 1830, who was followed by Peter LaMesurer, in 1832. The next Principal was L. B. Johnson, who came in 1834 and remained three years, after which he removed to New York, where he bought Johnson's Island, to which his name was given. That able instructor, Mr. Jeff. Lovejoy, was the next head of the institution, which had become by 1837, the year he assumed control, altogether a male school. He conducted it with marked success for over thirty years, without an intermission, and during that time made it one of the best known schools in the State. In 1867 he left Raleigh, but returned in 1871, and again became Principal, holding the position until his death in 1877. The school, after such a history and so many changes, is now conducted by Capt. J. J. Fray and Prof. Hugh L. Morson. Graduates of the University of Virginia, and of high order of intelligence and educational ability, these gentlemen have well kept up its reputation. They took charge in 1878, opening in September with fifty pupils. There are now in attendance sixty-five scholars, most of them from this city, but one or two are from South Carolina.

THE SHAW UNIVERSITY.

This institution for the colored race is situated in the southern part of the city, near the Governor's Mansion, and its handsome buildings attract attention by their size and design. The school was founded in 1865, and was then held in the old Guion House, or Eagle Hotel, now the Na-

tional Hotel. A few years later it was removed to the building on Blount street known as Tupper's Church. In 1870, the property of the late Hon. Daniel M. Barringer was purchased, with ample grounds. The school was then named after Mr. Elijah Shaw, of Wales, Mass., who gave \$8,000 in aid of the institution. A building of brick, four stories high, with thirty-five rooms, was finished in 1872 and named the "Shaw" building. J. Estey & Bro., the organ makers, of Brattleboro, Vermont, next gave \$8,000 to erect the "Estey" building, which was completed in 1874. It is five stories in height and contains fifty five rooms. The sum of \$5,000 in aid of the building fund was raised by the colored singers of this city, who made a tour of the entire North. These sums were but portions of the amounts raised at various times for the erection of the school buildings, for contributions of all kinds and amounts were made. At present a new chapel, of brick, one hundred feet in length, two stories in height, is being built. The cost of the buildings and grounds thus far has been \$105,000.

Rev. Mr. Tupper has been in charge of the school from its foundation. He is a man of great energy, and an able Principal. There are at present fourteen regular and assistant teachers in the school, and 267 scholars, of which number 153 are males and 114 females. The school has always been a mixed one, and the system is said to work admirably.

ST. AUGUSTINE NORMAL SCHOOL.

This institution for the colored race was founded in 1867, and is located near Oakwood Cemetery. Soon after the war Rev. C. R. Avery, of Pittsburg, Pennsylvania, bequeathed several millions of dollars to aid in the instruction of the colored race in the South. Rev. J. Brinton Smith, the Principal of the school, went to Pittsburg and secured \$25,000. The property, which is ninety acres in extent, was purchased, and five wooden buildings erected, at a cost of some \$30,000. The school is under the control and supervision of the Episcopal Church of the State, and the property is held in trust by the Bishop of the diocese and several prominent clergymen and laymen. The institution has a fund of some \$50,000, which is invested principally in real estate.

It is the plan of the school to educate teachers, male and female, for the colored race, and a good work has been done in this direction, more than one hundred teachers having been sent out. On the death of Rev. Dr. Smith, in 1872, Rev. John E. C. Smedes took charge as Principal, and has made an excellent one in all respects. There are three teachers and about 125 scholars of both sexes. The pupils are from all parts of this State, some from Florida, South Carolina, &c., and from Cuba. It is strictly a normal school and all the scholars have to take a regular course to prepare them for their duties as instructors. During the vacations, and sometimes during a part of the terms, the pupils earn money by teaching, and many thus pay the expenses of their education.

PUPILS IN THE SCHOOLS.

Recapitulating, we find that the number of pupils in the various schools in Raleigh is: In the public schools, 1,160; in the three white female schools, 250; in the schools at the Deaf, Dumb and Blind Institutions, 155; in the Shaw University, 267; in the St. Augustine Normal School, 125; and in the Raleigh Male Academy, 65. The total number is 2,022, of which 1,040 are white, 982 colored; 942 males, 1,080 females. There are also two white parochial schools, and three schools kept by ladies, wherein small children are instructed. The number attending these is probably 100, which increases the total number of white children to 1,140.

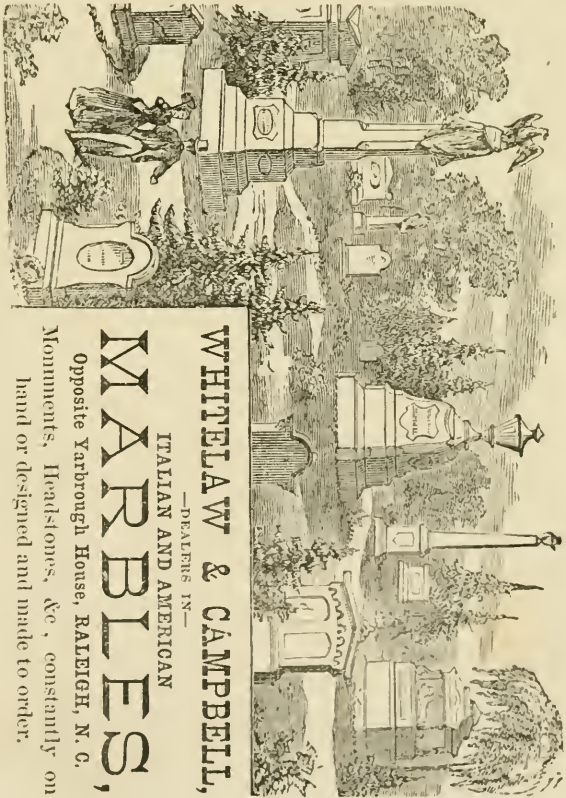
