#### **BRIEF INTRODUCTION TO WIKIMEDIA**



#### WIKIMEDIA PROJECTS

- Set of projects created through an open, free and collaborative model.
- Every day, tens of thousands of people create, expand, translate or update content, working together.
- Wikipedia is the best known (335 languages, +61 million pages), but the Wikimedia universe includes others, such as Commons, Wikidata, Wikisource... each of them focused on an specific area of knowledge.



#### **WIKIMEDIA MOVEMENT**



These thousands of people are organised globally through affiliates, currently more than 180, including chapters, user groups and thematic organisations, all of which are supported by the Wikimedia Foundation.

#### **WORKING WITH GLAMS**

- This huge community focuses on different areas of collaboration, such as education, technology, diversity, or culture, as examples.
- And it is because of culture that we are here; the collaboration between Wikimedia and cultural institutions (GLAM-Wiki) makes Wikimedia projects a more reliable source of information, and in return it makes possible that, for example, their collections reach a global audience.











These collaborations cover a variety of initiatives, such as Wikipedians in residence, workshops and edit-a-thons, uploading of multimedia material, texts o databases, digitisation, backstage passes... among others. We will briefly mention a few of them.

#### **MET OPEN ACCESS POLICY**

- +388,000 images released on Wikimedia Commons.
- Visits to Wikipedia articles tripled.
- Traffic on the MET website increased by 57%.

#### **NATIONAL LIBRARY OF WALES**

- +12,000 images released on Wikimedia Commons.
- +10,000 new Wikipedia articles in Welsh.
- +33,000 new items on Wikidata.
- Served to revitalise the language through the writing of Wikipedia articles.




#### **SALVADOR ALLENDE'S SPEECHES**

- Digitalization of 50 speeches.
- Upload to Wikimedia Commons.
- Transcription on Wikisource.



#### **JOAQUÍN DÍAZ FOUNDATION**

- +2,000 old images of Spanish places,
  people, monuments and landscapes.
- +21,000 oral history files: recordings of popular songs and romances from different provinces of Spain.



## Apart from that, Wikimedia projects are excellent tools for digital preservation.



#### **HERITAGE THAT NO LONGER EXISTS**



#### **PETROGLYPH DO VILAR**

- A Neolithic monument in Galicia that was vandalised.
- Due to the nature of the materials, the restoration of this type of monuments is particularly complex; in some cases it is quite impossible.



#### **SAN FRANCISCO CHURCH, VALPARAISO**

It has suffered several fires, the last one in August 2013. While this church survived the catastrophe, other local monuments did not.



#### FORMER ARTILLERY BARRACKS, VALENCIA

- This gate, along with the building in the background, was demolished a few days after this picture was taken.
- The Parque de Artillería was not what is considered a monument, but it has an interesting history that is linked to the neighbourhood where it is located.



"As of 13 September 2023, UNESCO has verified damage to 289 sites since 24 February 2022 – 120 religious sites, 27 museums, 109 buildings of historical and/or artistic interest, 19 monuments, 13 libraries, 1 Archive.."







In 2022 the contest happened in the middle of the Russian invasion. Almost 14,000 images from 300 participants. The focus was documentation of cultural heritage. For security reasons, only pre-invasion photographs were allowed. This year, only those taken by June 30, 2023 will be accepted.

#### **DISASTERS**



#### **NATIONAL MUSEUM OF BRAZIL**

- 20 million items in the museum's collection
- Between 8-25 thousand items on display

#### On the Wikimedia projects:

- Commons category had 471 images
- pt.wikipedia had 8 articles
- Wikidata had 8 items








- But in September 2nd, 2018...
- 18,5 million items were destroyed, 92.5 % of the collection
- Luzia's skull was destroyed
- The building got complete burned down

#### The Portuguese Wikipedia community is in mourning



On the evening of September 2, 2018, a massive fire broke out at the National Museum of Brazil at Quinta da Boa Vista, Rio de Janeiro, destroying almost all of the historical collection spanning over two hundred years, which included over twenty million items in its catalog. In addition to this rich collection, the building itself was the former residence of the Emperor of Brazil. It was extremely damaged, experiencing cracks, the collapse of its roof, and failures of the internal slabs.






