MEMORANDUM FOR: IMPERIAL JAPANESE GOVERNMENT

THROUGH: Central Liaison Office, Tokyo

SUBJECT: Provision and Procurement of Japanese Communications
Services, Facilities, Equipment, Material and Personnel

1. Reference is made to memorandum from the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, (SCAPIN 1299), file AG 400.12 (29 Oct 46) CCS, dated 29 October 46, subject as above. This memorandum is issued in accordance with paragraph 2 of the reference memorandum.

2. Issue 1 of Appendices I, II, III and IV of (SCAPIN 1299) are rescinded and Issue 2 of these Appendices included with this memorandum as inclosures 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be substituted therefor.

APPENDIX IVPROCEDURES GOVERNING STATEMENTS OF SERVICES RENDERED FOR JAPANESE
COMMUNICATION SERVICES, EQUIPMENT, MATERIAL, AND PERSONNEL

1. Issue 1 of this Appendix, dated 26 June 1946 is cancelled and superseded by Issue 2. Issue 2 has been prepared to change procedures for the methods of accounting and to more fully explain the preparation of statements of services rendered.

2. This Appendix covers instructions for presenting consolidated statements of services rendered for all communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel furnished the Occupation Forces by the Japanese Government.

3. In the following paragraphs the word "services" includes facilities, equipment, material and personnel.

4. Statements of services rendered will be prepared for classes of services as outlined below:

a. Class I. Local telephone service and Japanese maintained installations used by the Occupation Forces.

(1) Telephone subscribers served from Japanese exchanges not used by the Occupation Forces exclusively.

(2) Cable pairs or exchange trunks wholly within the local exchange area of a city or town. Facilities listed under this heading shall include all exchange pairs not included under a (1) above or under a (3) below. As examples these pairs include:

(a) Pairs used for keying lines (not included in cables used exclusively for this purpose).

(b) Direct lines between buildings and headquarters.

(3) P.A.s, P.E.s, exchanges and switchboards used exclusively by the Occupation Forces, including trunks.

(4) Radio transmitter and receiver stations furnished with or without maintenance.

b. Class II. Provision of engineering, material and labor to construct or install exchange or long distance plant or equipment, provided for the use of the Occupation Forces, which cannot be ultimately included in the domestic system.

c. Class III. Long distance facilities and circuits.

- (1) Long distance lines and telegraph circuits wholly within one Ministry of Communications operating bureau or division. (Not including radio distribution circuits).
- (2) Long distance lines and telegraph circuits which extend beyond the boundaries of one operating bureau or division. (Not including radio distribution circuits),
- (3) Radio distribution circuits.
- (4) Long distance telephone and telegraph service of all types, such as the long distance service now furnished the Occupation Forces through Japanese central toll offices on a filed call basis.

d. Class IV. Personnel.

- (1) Personnel furnished by the Ministry of Communications to the Occupation Forces on a full time basis to work under Occupation Force supervision or who assist in the maintenance of Occupation Force installations for which the Japanese Government is not responsible.

e. Class V.

- (1) Bulk material and equipment furnished to the Occupation Forces for use in installations which are not the responsibility of the Japanese Government.

5. In general, it is desired that communication services covered by (SCAPIN 1299) be furnished as a service on a monthly rental basis. Except in special cases, ownership of equipment will be retained by the Japanese Ministry of Communications.

6. Inclosure No. 1, GPa Form 5 (revised), sheets 2-11, will be used for submitting monthly statements of services rendered. The following procedure will be followed in preparing and submitting the consolidated statement of communication services rendered:

a. Each operating bureau or division will prepare and assemble statements for services rendered within its area. Two copies of this statement will be translated into English and will be submitted direct to a designated Signal Corps representative. (The names of the Signal Corps representatives authorized to accept these statements will be furnished the Ministry of Communications by Civil Communications Section). One copy will be retained in the operating bureau files and one copy will be forwarded to the Ministry of Communications.

7. The Ministry of Communications will consolidate the operating bureau and division reports with those that are prepared by the Ministry

and forward three copies of the report through the Liaison Office to Headquarters, Eighth Army, (Attn: Signal Officer), citing (SCAFIN-1299), as authority. Consolidation will be in accordance with paragraph 9 of this appendix.

8. Following are comments regarding preparation of statement of services rendered on GPA Form 5 (revised), sheets 2-11, by Operating Bureaus.

- a. Sheet 1 shall be left blank.
- b. All columns, sheets 1-11, designated "Est. Dollar Value" will be left unfilled.
- c. Sheets 2-6 are self-explanatory and require no discussion.
- d. Sheet, 7 Monthly Statement of Services Rendered for Engineering Material and Labor for Occupation Force Construction and Installation:

The operating bureau will prepare this form for each city or town at which work is performed. Work or expense incurred under this classification will be reported at the end of the month during which the installation is completed. Only one report will be made for any one installation. Description of work will be in sufficient detail to indicate the extent of the job and materials used. As an example: - "Construction of one kilometer of pole line and installation of aerial cable between Occupation Force Headquarters. Materials used - 20 poles: 1 kilometer each of messenger strand and 51 pair cable". Care will be taken not to include projects on this form which are to be furnished on a monthly rental basis.

- e. Sheet 8, Statement of Services Rendered, Toll (Long Distance) Facilities:

Each operating bureau will prepare this form in the manner indicated to cover long distance telephone and telegraph circuits furnished to the Occupation Forces within the operating bureau and which do not extend beyond the bureau boundaries not including radio distribution circuits.

The Ministry of Communication will prepare this form as outlined above to cover all long distance circuits extending beyond the boundaries of one operating bureau, including all radio distribution circuits.

- f. Sheet 9, Statement of Services Rendered, Long Distance Telephone and Telegraph Service:

Each operating bureau will prepare this form for each city or town at which AF calls are placed. This form will also be prepared for each city or town at which Occupation Force telegrams are filed and for which statement of services rendered are required. EFM and prepaid outgoing SCM messages will not be included. The total number of toll calls filed and completed and total number of minutes circuits were used, or the total

number of telegrams filed and total number of words sent between the office for which the report is prepared and each office at which such communication terminated will be entered as indicated. Records of individual calls or telegrams will be maintained at the local offices as previously instructed.

g. Sheet 10, Monthly Statement of Services Rendered for Personnel Performing Work at Occupation Force Installations Which are not the Responsibility of the Japanese Government:

Each operating bureau will prepare this form for each city or town at which personnel are furnished. Under job description give a short definition of the qualifications of persons employed, such as teletypewriter technicians, manual switchboard maintenance repairmen, telephone operators, etc.

h. Sheet 11, Monthly Statement of Services Rendered, Bulk Materials:

This form will be prepared by the Ministry of Communications and will list all items furnished in bulk which are not to be installed by the Japanese Government. This includes such items as flashlight batteries, jumper wire, switchboard lamps, etc. It is planned to order such items as these on a quarterly basis in the future. In general, these items will be delivered to designated Signal Corps supply agencies for distribution to Occupation Force units through normal Occupation Force channels. All communications items furnished under Appendix V and listed on this sheet will be obtained through the Ministry of Communications.

9. GPA Form 5 (revised), sheets 2-11, has been designed to permit entries compiled by the smaller operating subdivisions of the Ministry of Communications. The Ministry, upon receipt of the detailed statements, will consolidate the Bureau reports as outlined below:

a. Sheet 2, "Ministry of Communications" will be inserted in space provided for the "City or Town". One statement will be prepared for each operating bureau showing the total of each item within the bureau.

b. Sheets 3 and 4, One statement will be prepared for all bureaus showing the total for each bureau separately and using the column "Occupation Force Unit or Headquarters Served" to indicate the name of the bureau for which the entries are given. "Ministry of Communications" will be entered in the space "Bureau".

c. Sheets 5 and 6, each transmitter and receiving station will be listed consecutively on sheets 5 and 6. "Ministry of Communications" will be inserted in the space provided for the bureau designation and the operating bureau in which the station is located will be included in the column "Name and Location of Station".

d. Sheet 7, each installation completed during the month for which the report was made will be entered on this form by bureaus in the manner covered by paragraph 8d, except Ministry of Communications will be entered in the space "Bureau" and space "City or Town" will be left blank.

e. Sheet 8, this statement will be consolidated into two parts:

Part 1 will consist of services furnished within bureau areas and Part 2 will consist of the statement of services rendered prepared by the Ministry of Communications in accordance with paragraph 8e. The operating bureau reports on this form prepared in accordance with paragraph 8e will be consolidated to show the total number of circuits within a bureau and the total length of circuits in the bureau as one entry. Circuits which have been used less than 15 days during the current month will not be included in this entry. Circuits used more than 15 days during the month being reported will be included. The columns "To", "Length and Kilometer Each" and "Number of Days Used" will be left blank. On both statements "Ministry of Communications" will be entered in the space "Bureau" and space "Town or City" will be left blank.

f. Sheet 9, one consolidated statement will be prepared to show totals for telephone calls and telegrams handled within each operating bureau. "Ministry of Communications" will be inserted in the space provided for "Bureau" and the space for "City or Town" will remain blank. The name of the operating bureau for which totals are given will be inserted in the column marked "To". The total number of calls placed within the bureau and the total number of minutes will be entered in the appropriate columns.

g. Sheet 10, "Ministry of Communications" will be entered in the space marked for "Bureau and City or Town" will be left blank. The total number of personnel furnished under each classification will be entered consecutively by bureaus under the column marked "Job Description". Totals shown for each classification of personnel will be the total for the bureau.

h. Sheet 11, one statement will be prepared in accordance with paragraph 8h of this Appendix.

10. The Ministry of Communications will arrange to have GPA Form 5 (revised), sheets 2-11, printed in sufficient quantities and will make such distribution as is necessary to permit statements of services rendered to be prepared in accordance with this Appendix. Quality of paper and type of printing will be similar to that used on GPA Form 8, Communications Order, copies of which have been furnished previously for information. All headings and titles may be in black. The form should not be produced as a book but as separate sheets to be assembled as described above upon completion of entries.

11. The first statement of services rendered to be prepared as specified in this Appendix shall be for services as of 31 December 1946. This report will include those services furnished for the month of December.

12. The Ministry of Communications will arrange to furnish a statement of communication services rendered to the Occupation Forces from 2 September 1945 until 30 November 1946 using GPA Form 5 (revised) for the summation. All services rendered during this period will be consolidated

within this one statement of services rendered. The following will be observed in preparing this statement:

a. In the space provided for "Month" enter 2 September 1945 to 30 November 1946.

b. Sheet 2, Local Telephone Service: Prepare one statement for each operating bureau. In the column "Total at End of Month" enter facilities furnished times the number of months that they were used to obtain a consolidated month's usage figure. As a simple case, assume that in a given operating bureau 10 telephones were used for 14 months for a total of 140 months service; 20 were used for 10 months for a total of 200 months service; 25 were used for 4 months for a total of 100 months service, the entry under the "Total at End of Month", Section a, Sheet 2, would be 440 months service. Similar entries would be made for b and c.

c. Sheet 3, Switchboards Used Exclusively by the Occupation Forces: Prepare one statement for each bureau, listing each switchboard furnished. Under the column "Occupation Force Unit or Hq Served" enter the dates between which it was furnished.

d. Sheet 4, PBXs, PAXs or Other Exchanges Used Exclusively by the Occupation Forces: Prepare in a manner similar to sheet 3.

e. Sheet 5, Radio Facilities (Transmitting): Prepare one statement for each bureau listing each station and beneath the name of the city or town indicate the dates during which services were furnished.

f. Sheet 6, Radio Facilities (Receiving): Prepare similar to sheet 5.

g. Sheet 7, Engineering Material and Labor Used for Occupation Force Construction and Installation: Prepare one statement for each operating bureau. List each construction or installation project which has been completed for the Occupation forces and the ownership of which has been transferred to the Occupation Forces. Under the column "Communications Order No." indicate the number of the procurement demand under which the work was performed, if known.

h. Sheet 8, Toll (Long Distance) Facilities: Prepare one statement for each bureau. This statement is to be prepared in accordance with previous instructions contained in this Appendix.

i. Sheet 9, Long Distance Telephone and Telegraph Services: Prepare one statement for each bureau. This statement is to be prepared in accordance with previous instructions contained in this Appendix.

j. Sheet 10, Personnel Performing Work in Occupation Forces Installations not the Responsibility of the Japanese Government: Prepare one statement for each bureau. These statements are to be prepared in accordance with previous instructions contained in this Appendix.

k. Sheet 11, Bulk Materials: Prepare one statement for each bureau listing those items delivered for the exclusive use of the Occupation Forces and for which the ownership has been relinquished by the Ministry of Communications. It will not be necessary to list separately each item covered by procurement demand, formal letter or directive. For items furnished in accordance with any of these, enter in the column headed "Description" the procurement demand number, the directive number or the letter in accordance with which they were provided, giving the date, subject, and the headquarters originating the correspondence and include a short description of the nature of items furnished. Items which were used in construction or furnished in connection with the maintenance of Occupation Force installations which are being furnished the Occupation Forces on a monthly rental basis will not be included in this list.

13. This consolidated statement of services rendered for the period 2 September 1945 to 30 November 1946 will be completed by 15 January 1947. Three copies of this statement will be forwarded through the liaison office to Headquarters, Eighth Army, (Attn: Signal Officer), citing SCAPIN 1299, Appendix IV, par 12, Issue 2, as authority. Care will be taken in the preparation of this statement since it will be used as a basis for the final entries on records of services rendered to the Occupation Forces during the period covered.



MEMORANDUM:

SUBJECT : Information of General Application Pertaining to Directive Number (SCAPIN 1299/1), file AG 400.12 (4 Dec 46)CCS, this Headquarters, dated 4 December 1946 , subject: Provision and Procurement of Japanese Communications Services, Facilities, Equipment, Material and Personnel.

1. With reference to subject memorandum, the following is published for the information of all concerned.
2. This memorandum provides for substituting Issue 2 of Appendices I, II, III and IV, (SCAPIN 1299) and for adding Issue 1, Appendix V.
3. Issue 2 of Appendices I, II and III includes rearrangement of items under the various classes of Japanese communications services, facilities, equipment, material and personnel being furnished to provide a more logical grouping. The changes do not change the allotment of items covered.
4. Issue 2 of Appendix IV is reissued to include more detailed information as to procedures for preparation of statements of services rendered to be prepared by the Ministry of Communications. It also includes GPA Form 5 (revised) which has been changed to provide for all statements of services rendered required by (SCAPIN 1299).
5. Issue 1, Appendix V, has been added to the original memorandum to provide for the future ordering of bulk materials. It is added in blank form at this time in order that instructions for preparation of statements of services rendered in this connection might be included in Issue 2, Appendix IV
6. Command channel instructions regarding changes outlined above will be forwarded to Headquarters, Eighth Army, by General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers.
