

Our prices mean seeds delivered to your nearest station.

QUALITY.—The seeds offered are in most instances market gardeners' private stock, the same as grown for their own use, and should not be confounded with cheap old seeds.

TERMS.—One terms are strictly eash, as we have not added a per eent, to our prices to cover losses by bad debts growing out of the credit system. Remittances should be made by bank draft on New York. Post-office money order, express money order, or by express or registered letter. Postage stamps, when clean and free from moisture, will be taken in small amounts. Postal-notes are convenient for small sums, but are not safe, as they are made payable to bearer, and, if lost, cannot be duplicated. One-fourth pounds at pound rates; pecks at bushel rates.

C. O. D.—We will ship seed, C. O. D.; when a small remittance is enclosed, with order to cover express charges, should the seeds not be taken.

Directions: Soil should be deeply plowed or spaded, mixing in plenty of rotted manure; this is necessary both for a sandy or heavy clay soil. Thorough preparation of the ground is required by finely pulverizing the lumps and removing the stones, etc., with a fine-tooth

iron rake. Seeds should be sown as early as possible, using at the rate of four bushels to the acre, which is about one quart to every three hundred square feet (20x30). It should be sown thick for best results. Seed should be raked in and ground carefully rolled. If a lawn is wanted for immediate use, sprinkle some oats with grass-seed, say one quart of oats to each four quarts of lawn grass-seed, and rake all in together. As soon as oats appear, commence mowing with lawn-mower and keep mowed all season. The oats will give a green sward, and at same time protect the tender grass sufficiently (if kept mowed); and in fall, when the grass has a good hold, the oats will have disappeared. By this method all weeds are kept down and a perfect lawn will be the result. We should be pleased to correspond with parties intending to make large lawns, and are sure we can be of value to them.
