

According to his preliminary information, the statement in the article to the effect that Oswald had been the one who had shot at Walker was based on an assumption made from information obtained from Walker during the course of the telephonic interview. Walker had not actually said that Oswald had shot at him, but had referred to the fact that he had been shot at. The reporter reached his own conclusion that Oswald had been responsible for this shooting. Mr. Smoydzin said that he hoped to have the full results of the inquiry in the near future, but was giving us the preliminary report because it appeared that the article in question was based on assumptions of the reporter and the editors and was not based on any factual information obtained in the United States.
