Dear Sirs:

Our clients, Ipekdjian Brothers, whose offices in New York City are at 580 Fifth Avenue, and who are engaged in the import and export of diamonds, have submitted to us the following situation, in which we believe the intervention of the State Department would be extremely helpful.

Before Pearl Harbor, Ipekdjian Brothers were the owners of a substantial stock of diamonds in the Netherlands Indies. At the time of the Japanese invasion, they made efforts to have these diamonds sent to New York, but did not succeed in doing so in time.

They have recently learned that a very substantial stock of diamonds has been found in Japan by our Occupation Forces - stock which has been identified as originating in the Netherlands Indies and which, therefore, was presumably shipped by the Japanese invaders from the Netherlands Indies to Japan.

We would very much appreciate it if you would let us know exactly which agency within the Department, or in Japan, is handling this matter, so that we may submit full particulars and, perhaps, have the diamonds belonging to our clients identified in the stock now existing in Japan.

This presupposes that the stock found in Japan has been inventoried in some way, and we would also appreciate hearing from you where we can obtain some detailed information as to the contents of this stock.
