The new bridge crossing the bridge was initially given its name during dedication monies on May 25, 1963.

The late Mr. Vanden Bulck. who died in 1962, was honored during the dedication ceremonies for the contributions he made to the nation's atomic energy programs both as a staff member with the Manhattan Engineer District and as Assistant Manager for Administration with the AEC's Oak Ridge Operations.

Mr. Vanden Bulck was one of the earliest of the military group to come to Oak Ridge to establish the initial project. He staved in Oak Ridge following the war as a top member of the AEC staff and retired in 1960 after completion of more than 36 years of federal service. He was awarded the Legion of Merit by the War Department for his outstanding service to the Manhattan Engineer District and was also recipient of the AEC's Distinguished Service Award, the highest recognition extended by AEC to one of its employees.
