


### Pot-Grown Strawberries

Pot-grown Strawberry plants are much superior to the ordinary ground layers usually sold, as there is no loss of fine roots in taking them up. They can be transplanted at any season with scarcely any check

to their growth. The sooner pot-grown plants can be set out after June 1st, the larger they will grow and the more they will produce the next Spring. We only offer varieties that are considered the best of existing sorts.

#### Brief Directions for Culture

Strawberries require rich, well-tilled soil. The plants should be set 15 inches apart, in rows 2 feet apart. One hundred plants will plant four rows 30 feet long, if set above distance apart. For horse cultivation set plants 2 feet apart in rows 3 feet apart; 7,260 plants at this distance will plant an acre. Firm the plants well in the soil, keeping them thoroughly cultivated and cut off all runners. About the middle of December, cover bed with salt-meadow hav, straw or leaves. In April, as soon as the plants show indications of growth, push the covering away from the plants to allow them to come through. The mulching protects the plants from cold in the winter and heat in the Summer, keeping the fruit clean and prevents the growth of weeds.




Tall Shape Tye Shape

### Planting Table For Beds of Bulbs

A circular bed 6 feet in diameter, with bulbs 6 inches apart, requires 110 bulbs; 5 inches apart, requires 160 bulbs; 4 inches apart, requires 300 bulbs.

#### Depth at Which Bulbs Should be Planted



Many of our customers are frequently puzzled to know the proper depth and distance apart at which bulbs should be planted. The accompanying diagram, reproduced from **Popular Gardening**, conveys the information much more clearly and briefly than we could describe it. The chart will bear careful study. **Outdoor planting should be done early in the Fall** to secure healthy plants, vigorous foliage and beautiful flowers.
