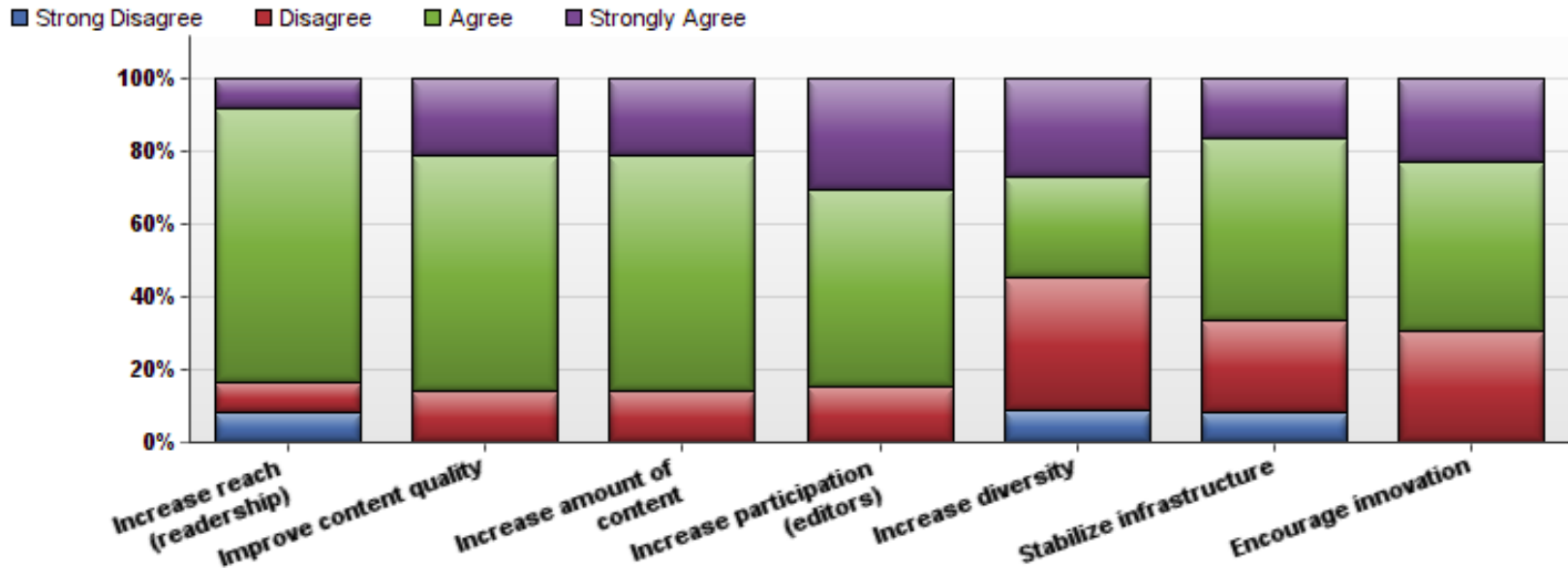
“The goal of FDC is to make decisions about how *effectively allocate* movement funds to achieve Wikimedia’s mission, vision, and Strategy.”

Summary

- Respondents have spent 94 hours on average for APG/FDC related work, and 64% of them feel it's about right.
- Respondents think that APG helps increase participation, content, quality, but not diversity and infrastructure.
- Majority of respondents think that FDC helps increase community voice in how movement funds are spent.
- Majority of respondents agree to a less degree that the application requirements were reasonable.

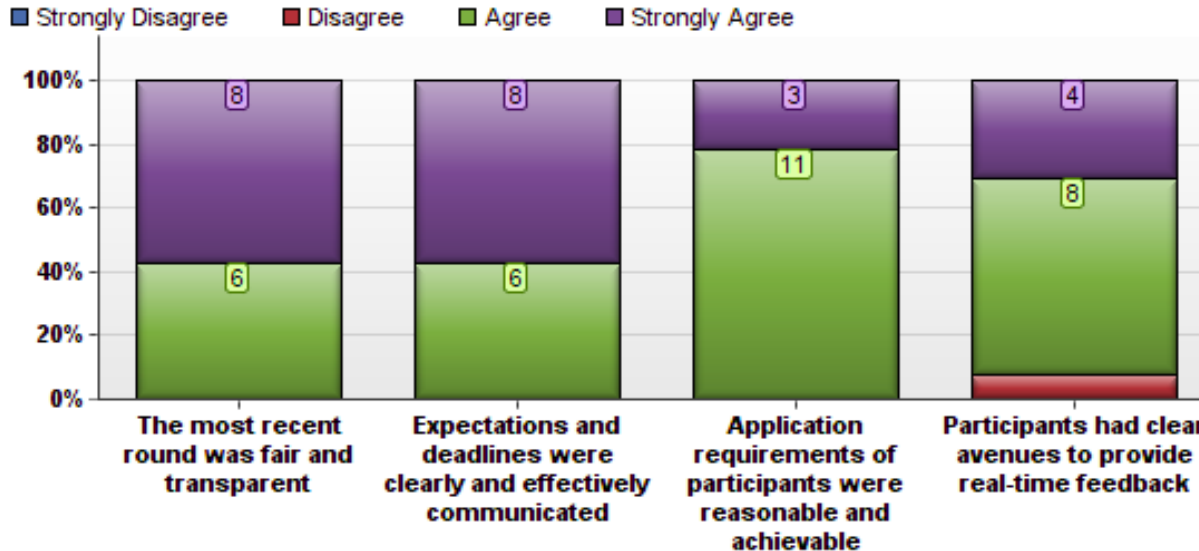
Respondents agreed that APG funds help increase participation, content and content quality, readership reach, *more than* helping increase diversity readership and infrastructure.

Respondents strongly agreed that the recent round was fair and transparent, as well as it expectations and deadlines were clear and well-communicated. They have agreed to a lesser degree that the application requirements were reasonable, and to a lesser degree that the participants had clear space to provide feedback.

Recommendations

- Consider reducing the application requirements to reduce number of hours for the FDC, and organizational fatigue.
- Consider funding more programmatic activities that focus on specific areas such as diversity.
