NEW COUNTERFEITS.

Every counterfeit that has ever been made has one or more mistakes in it. Our aim is to show what that mistake is.

NATIONAL SHOE & LEATHER B'K,
New York City.

20s. A good imitation. The face of the bill and the lettering is well done, while the engraving on the back of the note is rather coarse. Very likely to deceive.

WESTCHESTER COUNTY NAT. B'K,
Peckskill, N. Y.

2s. imitation. The general appearance of the bill is good, although the shading under the title of the bank is very irregular and dark. The vign. on left end is blurred and very rough.

10s. imitation. Well done.

50 CENT FRACTIONAL CURRENCY.

New Issue—A very good counterfeit. The portrait of Lincoln is coarser and darker than the genuine, and the lathe work in the centre of the die is also darker.

5s. GREENBACKS.

The green ornamental engraving, lengthwise of the bill, in the counterfeit, is of a paler color than in the genuine, and has a brighter look than the dark green of the original. Seen under the microscope the engraving is coarse, but to the naked eye the bills have a very good appearance.

10s. GREENBACKS.

The engraving is coarse. The vignette of Lincoln is a very indifferent engraving, and the scroll work around the medallion is poorly imitated. Letter C, twenty-third series.

10s. GREENBACKS.

An excellent imitation of the genuine. Note the following discrepancies. In the genuine, the shading around the 10 in the medallion appears like a fine net work, and runs close up to the figures. In the counterfeit, the shading is "picked up," and becomes coarser as it reaches the figures, forming a light streak or circular haze. Another test is on the figure 10 within the light circle. The genuine has three and one-third dots on the left of the fig. 10, while the counterfeit has but three. Thus:

But the surest test is under the left wing of the eagle. The genuine has FOUR DISTINCT ROWS OF FEATHERS under the wing, while in the counterfeit the rows of feathers are undefined. One issue of this counterfeit is of the new series, letter D, No. 53; another is letter D, with a small 5 under the D, No. 23. These counterfeits are the best we have ever seen.

Newer issues have appeared lately, in which the defects above referred to have been corrected. We would advise our patrons to refuse all tens, greenbacks, unless they know the parties from whom they receive them.

20s. GREENBACKS.

A dangerous counterfeit. Green ink a good color, but the paper too yellow. Principal defect is the die. No clear and distinct lines around the 20. Looks more like a collection of several spots. Female well done, but the face rather coarser than the genuine.

50s. GREENBACKS.

Imitation. Observe the figures 50 on back of the bill around the margin. The 5 in the imitation runs into the 0 on the lower left corner, and reads 550 instead of 50. The buttons on Hamilton's vest which are very distinct in genuine are scarcely discernable in the counterfeit. Genuine has FIVE while in the counterfeit you can hardly see FOUR. The note is dated March 10th, 1863. We would advise our patrons to scrutinize carefully all \$50 Treasury Notes, unless they know the parties from whom they receive them.

The weekly statement of the City banks having, during the last three months, disclosed a continuous reduction of their surplus over the legal requirement of reserves, which, by to-day's statement, is revealed as amounting to less than \$10,000,000, attention in our financial and commercial circles is prominently directed to the prospects of the money market. As yet, the latter has remained undisturbed, owing chiefly to the extreme dullness and inactivity in all the markets—except the Gold market—on the New York Stock Exchange. But when *bona fide* and speculative operations will be revived with the return from watering and other places of recreation of our chief financiers and speculators, and the usual fall demand set in from the South and West for the removal of the various crops, it might be an easy matter for such combinations, as have heretofore manipulated the money and stock markets, to produce an extremely severe monetary stringency. "The street," therefore, expect not only considerably higher rates of interest for loans to soon set in, but also a fall in prices on the Stock Exchange, if not such a panic as that of last September. But most of the railroad and miscellaneous shares deal in at the New York Stock Exchange are, at present, held by those powerful cliques who control the respective markets, they having recently "buried the hatchet," and, for the time being, settled those difficulties, which for some time past had arraigned them against each other to antagonistic operations are, therefore, likely to harmoniously co-operate in the immediate future to counteract the natural influence of the course of the money market on the various stock markets. We advise our patrons to be careful, lest they come to grief, by finding themselves on the wrong side of speculation, to let "Wall-street operations" severely alone, and to "invest" their surplus funds only in sound securities.

Money is easy at 4@5 per cent on call. In commercial paper very little is doing. Prime single names and acceptances are discounted at 7@12 per cent, according to length of time. Inferior notes have to submit to higher rates of interest. Foreign Exchanges are, to-day, quoted at 109½@109¾ for bankers' 60 days' sterling, and 110½@111 for sight.

The Gold market has continued active and excited under the influence of the war between the Germans and the Napoleonic dynasty. The news of continual successes of the German armies producing higher quotations of American securities abroad and at home, and an expectation of an early peace, which caused the Bank of England to reduce its minimum discount rate to 4½ per cent, caused the premium to decline to 14½—Aug. 20th. Since the 22d inst., a powerful combination succeeded in producing a reaction to 18—24th inst.—from which it declined to 16½ the closing figure to-day. The highest figure attained during the month—since the 27th ult.—has been 22.

The estimated decrease of the public debt for the present month is between ten and twelve millions.

BANKS FOR THE ISSUE OF GOLD NOTES.

The Controller of the Currency has issued a circular in relation to the organization of National banks for the issue of gold notes, which incorporates the different sections of the act providing for the redemption of the three per cent certificates, and for the increase of National bank notes, approved July 12, 1870, having reference to the subject, besides other general instructions with reference thereto. The circular states that National banks for the issue of gold notes could be established, and would probably be successful and profitable at any point where direct trade with foreign countries is carried on to an extent sufficient to furnish employment to the capital and means of the bank, and in those cities and States where business is transacted chiefly on a coin basis. But in the small interior towns of the Atlantic or Western States, it is not at all probable that such institutions would be profitable or satisfactory to the stockholders. Banks for the issue of gold notes are to be organized, as provided in the original law on that subject. First, the parties subscribing the capital stock, not less in number than five, should execute articles of association, after which organization certificates should be prepared, forms for both of which are included in the circulars. A certified copy of the articles of association and the original of the organization certificate should be filed with the Controller of the Currency. The cash paid must be not less than fifty per cent of the entire capital subscribed. The amount of bonds to be deposited must never be less than \$30,000, no less than one-third of the paid-up capital of the bank. When fifty per cent of the capital is paid in, a certificate of the officers and directors of the bank, in the form provided by the circular, is to be filed. Before taking any decided steps for the organization of banks, parties are requested to correspond with the Controller of the Currency. Applications may be made by letter, and should state the locality where the bank is required, naming the city or town, the population, a general estimate of the kind and amount of business, the names of the principal parties who propose to organize the bank, with information as to their character and pecuniary abilities. The minimum capital with which a bank can be organized under the general provision of the act is \$100,000.

COUNTERFEIT FRACTIONAL NOTES.

An erroneous statement has been published concerning counterfeit fractional currency. Treasurer Spinner says the counterfeit is not on the new issue of fifty cent notes, as reported, but on the old issue, having the vignette of LINCOLN, and which old issue the Treasurer is now calling in. The new issue bears the likeness of STANTON. The Treasurer says he will give five dollars for the first counterfeit note of this class. The paper on which the new notes of all denominations are printed is manufactured under the supervision of the Government officers, near Philadelphia. The paper contains colored silk fiber, and Congress has declared its manufacture by any other parties a felony.

REDEMPTION OF MUTILATED BANK NOTES.

Under the rules of the United States Treasury, all mutilated bank notes are redeemed according to the degree of mutilation. A note with a certain portion of its superficial surface torn off is never redeemed at its full value, but in proportion to the quantity of superficial surface presented for redemption. Since greenbacks were introduced the redemption division of the Treasury has been constantly engaged in redeeming this mutilated currency, and an account of the discount has been kept, which shows an aggregate amount up to the present date of \$180,693, which the government has thus saved, all of which has, of course, come out of the pockets of the people.

CANCELLED U. S. BONDS DESTROYED.

\$180,000,000 United States Bonds purchased by Secretary Boutwell on account of the Sinking and Special Fund have been destroyed, comprehending only such cancelled bonds as has been purchased up to the date of the order of their destruction—July 15th, 1870. Since then \$3,000,000 more have been purchased, and they will probably be consigned to the flames at an early day. It is indicated that hereafter all bonds purchased on account of the Sinking Fund will be cancelled and destroyed immediately after their purchase.

THE STOLEN \$50s AND \$100s OF THE FIRST NATIONAL BANK OF JERSEY CITY, N. J.

The Comptroller of the Currency has found it necessary to again caution the public against receiving fifty and one hundred dollar bills of the First National Bank of Jersey City, N. J. The Central National Bank of this city will redeem all genuine notes of these denominations as fast as they may be presented. The object of the Comptroller is to defeat the purposes of the parties who stole \$12,000 of the unsigned notes of the above denominations from his office.

NATIONAL GOLD NOTES.

The Treasury Department has on hand quite a large amount of the buff or yellow paper prepared originally for the first issue of Postage currency. This paper Comptroller Hubbard proposes to use for the new Gold notes, with the same plates now employed in printing the National bank notes from. The only change being in the wording at the top of the notes, where the words "National Currency" occur, changing them so as to read "National Gold Notes."

BANK ITEMS.

The HOLLY SPRINGS SAVINGS AND INSURANCE COMPANY, located at Holly Springs, Miss., is engaged in a general banking business, and makes collections on all accessible points, remitting promptly for the same. Mr. Charles Demmon, a banker of twenty-five years experience, and late of Lyons, N. Y., has been appointed Cashier of the Commercial Bank of Kansas City, Mo. The other officers are—Theo. S. Case, President; L. K. Thacher, Vice President; W. S. Ide, Cashier.

H. G. Freeman has been appointed Cashier of the City National Bank, Green Bay, Wis., in place of G. A. Lawton, resigned.

ARREST OF COUNTERFEITERS.

On the 20th inst., Col. Wh they, accompanied by four of the secret service detectives, arrested at the Green Point ferry, Bill Gurney, one of the "most notorious shovers of the queer" in the country, and in his possession was found \$3,000 in counterfeit \$20s on the National Shoe and Leather Bank of this city. Jas. Bradshaw, who was in his company, was also arrested, and \$300 of the same "stuff" was found in his possession.

William Miller was brought before Commissioner Shields on the 25th inst., charged with attempting to pass a \$10 Greenback. A detective officer present swore that he had been watching him for some years past as a dealer in the "queer," but had only just caught him.

It is stated that the Comptroller of the Currency contemplates changing the entire printing of the National currency, owing to the many successful counterfeits that have been issued. The recent issues of \$10 and \$20 bills are so well executed, that they are calculated to deceive even experts, and they will no doubt prove a great loss to the public at large. New and improved plans of printing, ink, &c., will be considered by Mr. Hurlburd.

Persons who send out circulars offering to furnish "exact copies" of fractional currency, and enclosing fractional notes as specimens of counterfeits furnished by them, are not counterfeiters or dealers in counterfeit money. Their course of action is to send out genuine notes as samples, and when they receive remittance for a supply of similar notes, to return either nothing at all, or small photographs of genuine notes, trusting to the complicity of their dupes to save them from exposure and prosecution. As this species of swindling does not constitute an infringement of any law of the United States, it is not in the province of the Treasury Department to institute proceedings against those who practise it.

It is not customary for the Post Office Department to report to the Treasurer the result of its investigations concerning the loss from the mail of mutilated currency mailed to him for redemption, complaints in regard to which have been referred to it by him.

There is no fund out of which the Treasurer can make good to the owners remittances of currency lost in transmission to him by mail. Such remittances are always at the owner's risk.

Counterfeit Tobacco Stamps.

The points of difference between the counterfeit and the genuine stamp are so marked as to be easily detected by the glass. They are as follows:

- FIRST; The imprint in the counterfeit is badly engraved, and a trifle larger than the genuine. The words "Continental Bank Note Co., New York," in the genuine are small, distinct, and not connected, each letter standing separate, while in the counterfeit the letters are heavier, and more crowded, larger, and closer together, and in the word "Continental" the "i" joins the "n," making the "i" and "n" look like an "m," with a period at the end of the imprint in the counterfeit, which is omitted in the genuine.
- SECOND; In the sky of the counterfeit, over the mane of the horse, will be observed four small dots; in the genuine the sky is made of straight lines.
- THIRD; The ornamentations resembling small stars on each side of the vignette in the lathe work of the counterfeit look imperfect and blurred, while in the genuine they appear bright.
- FOURTH; Over the white faced figure "6" on the left side of the stamp in the genuine is a small black figure, a part of the lathe work pattern which is wanting in the counterfeit, and the imitation lathe work of the counterfeit has a muddy appearance, while in the genuine the patterns are clear and distinct.

Description of Genuine Bills.

NATIONAL BANK NOTES.

1s—vig. two females with hands clasped, one pointing upward, name and location of bank above—large figure 1 on left end, with the inscription: "This note is secured by bonds of the United States deposited with the U. S. Treasurer at Washington." On other side, vig. Landing of the Pilgrims.

2s—vig. (on left end) female seated holding flag, stars above, ships and buildings in background; large figure 2 lengthwise of note, name and location of bank below. Other side, vig. Sir Walter Raleigh, 1585.

5s—vig. Columbus discovering America, on lower left end; right end, Columbus introducing America to Europe, Asia and Africa, countries represented by female figures. Other side—vig., landing of Columbus.

10s—vig. Franklin drawing lightning from the clouds.—Allegorical representation of Genius of America, a female figure upon an eagle in the clouds grasping a thunderbolt. Other side—vig., De Soto discovering the Mississippi.

20s—vig. Battle of Lexington. Allegorical representation of Loyalty, figure of Liberty in foreground, bearing national ensign; farmers, artisans, &c., rallying around the flag. Other side—Baptism of Pocahontas.

50s—vig. Washington crossing the Delaware. Allegorical representation, Prayer for Victory. Other side—Embarkation of the Pilgrims.

100s—vig. Battle of Lake Erie. Allegorical representation, Maintenance of Liberty and Nationality. Other side—Declaration of Independence.

500s. vig. right end, arrival of the *Simus*, 1838—left end, female sitting on a gun overlooking the sea, steamship in distance. Other side—surrender of General Burgoyne.

1000s—right end, Capitol of Washington—left end, Gen. Scott entering the City of Mexico. Other side, Washington resigning his commission.

GREENBACKS.

1s, upper left end, a large oval portrait of Chase; 1 in green below—right end, 1 in a fancy die; signatures of Treasurer of United States and Register of Treasury on a green tint below; a strip of black lathework between signatures.

2s, lower left centre, a large oval portrait of Alexander Hamilton—left end, 2 on a die; 11 below on a green die; right end, 2 on a die; signatures below on a green tint separated by two strips of black lathework.

5s, in centre, FIVE DOLLARS across a green 5 and die work—right end, an oval male portrait; left end, female statue erect, with sword and shield, on a black ground work—fancy green back.

10s, upper center, eagle on a shield; 10 in green die each side; a strip of green lathework below—right end, female erect by pedestal holding tablet, etc.—left end a large oval portrait of President Lincoln—fancy green back.

20s, in center, a female erect, with sword and shield, between figure 20 and two green dies; figure 20 each side—TWENTY DOLLARS across each end in green die work—fancy green back.

50s left centre, oval portrait of Hamilton; Treasury die in pink on right of die; 50 on die on each end of note.

100s, upper left centre, large spread eagle sitting on a rock; Treasurer's die in pink and 100 in green die on right of vig.—right upper corner 100 on a black die—lower left corner 100 on a black die.

500s, in centre, portrait of Albert Gallatin encircled in a green die—right end, 500; FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS below—left end same as right.

1000s, in centre, portrait of Robert Morris in green circle—right end M with 1000 across it; ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS on a green die below—left end, same as right.

COUNTERFEIT GREENBACKS.

1s, (1st kind) can be readily detected by the inferior style of the engraving, particularly the head of Chase. The mouth is crooked, the eyes imperfect, and the hair on the top of the head resembles side hair brushed over to cover baldness. The back is of a lighter green than the genuine.

1s, (2d kind) the general appearance is very coarse and may readily be detected; green ink is very pale. On the imitation there is a black streak of ink under the red figures on the upper part of the bill; none in gen.

2s, imit., well executed. Coat of Hamilton badly done. The shirt bosom of Hamilton is very dark and uneven, but in the genuine white and plain. The shading of the words "UNITED STATES" light and broken.

5s, 10s, genuine notes without the red seal, and others reported without the usual number being printed upon them.

5s, imit., words "United States" heavily shaded. Gen. are clear, lightly shaded and plain. The words "Patented 30th June, 1867," under the words N. York are as on the counterfeit bill. All the counterfeits are letter A, and are 1/4 inch shorter than the genuine.

On the new series of letter "A," around the figure of Liberty on left end is a plain black line. On the counterfeits, this line along the bottom of the figure running towards the right of the note forms two distinct lines, on gen. only one. But this

may be a counterfeiter's dodge to have it described and alter it afterwards.

5s, imit., this bill is well calculated to deceive, and the only difference we can detect is in the die on the right end enclosing the figure 5. The genuine has three black circles enclosing the 5. The imit. has only two, and on lower right end figure 8, and on left end series 90.

10s. Paper very light, and the green ink of a lighter shade. Dated March 10th, 1862.

10s alt'd from 1s, portrait of Chase on left.

10s imit. There are 16 small Xs on upper right margin, and only 15 on the genuine. The words "Printed by the National Bank Note Co." on lower left margin extends over 9 of the Xs on imit. and 8 on the genuine.

10s, imit., has 14 small x's on upper right margin—16 on left. The gen. has 15 x's each side of engravers name. Portrait of Pres. Lincoln is very coarse and pale looking; imit. are dated Washington, March 10, 1862, letter C.

50s, very close imit. of gen., the engraving is good, in the center figure the foot of the female can scarcely be seen. On the left end bottom are the words "Payable at the Treasury of the U. S. at New York." The A's in payable are too small and uneven. The letter 'm' in the word 'The' is not crossed in the centre. The imprint is defective; the green ink is of too light a color.

50s, alt'd from 2s, portrait of Hamilton on left centre. The vignettes of the two-dollar and fifty-dollar Treasury note are the same. Ingenious persons are counterfeiting the body of the fifties and using the vignettes of the twos, producing a note that deceives experts.

50s, imit. observe the figures 50 on back of the bill around the margin, the 5 in the imit. runs into the 0, gen. does not. The word 'FIFTY' around the above 50 can scarcely be read. Words 'LEGAL TENDER' is very much blurred. Letter C dated March 3, '63. On the left lower corner the No. 550 instead of 50 enclosed in one circle.

50s, imit., observe the head of Hamilton, upon the face of the note, which represents the line of the waistcoat crossing the white collar at the neck. The acute angle formed by the shape of the collar, so far as it is shown, is perfect in the counterfeit note; but in the genuine the lines of the flesh were drawn by the engraver across the point of the collar at its junction with the waistcoat, for the purpose of relieving the angle of the sharpness it would otherwise have exhibited. This difference is not readily observed unless the notes are perfectly clean. The other discrepancy is in the shape of the ornaments in the border on each end of the face of the bills, and in the whole border on the back. The figures "50" are engraved on a green ground, of which the rim, in the genuine bill, is in octagonal form, rather well defined, though the angles are not sharp. The eight sides of what at first view appeared to be circles, may be easily discerned. In the counterfeit bill the border ornaments, containing the "50" are octagonal in only a very slight degree, and seem to be perfect circles. The general appearance of the counterfeit gives no indication of its true character.

100s, imit. the red figures are much larger than the figures of any Treasury Notes, the wings of the eagle are very coarse—the double rule running from it is heavier, and the curve twice as large, while there is a diagonal shading at the joint of the imprint with the rule, which does not appear on the genuine. On the right end of the back of the bill, the 100 in the circles are inverted, thus, 001. In the genuine this inversion is on the left end. The imprint, American Bank Note Co., is very uneven, and too large.

100s, imit., (2d kind) of the notes issued under the act of February, 1862, well executed. The spurious note is smaller, and the coloring on the back is paler than on the genuine bill. The words "one hundred dollars" on the right hand side of the counterfeit are smaller than on the genuine note.

100s, imit., (3d kind) the note is smaller than the genuine, the spread eagle is very coarse, and the shading of UNITED STATES is badly done. The bill is calculated to deceive.

COUNTERFEIT COUPONS.

The following are the words on the coupons: "Acts of July 17 and August 5, 1861. The United States of America will pay to bearer fifty cents for six months' interest due 1st January, 1867, upon bond No. 785, for \$500. L. R. Chittenden, Register United States Treasury."

FIVE CENT COIN COUNTERFEITS

Are in circulation. They may be distinguished from the genuine by the softness of the metal.

COUNTERFEIT

FRACTIONAL CURRENCY.

Old Issue.

50s, imit., the portraits of Washington differs one from another; in the genuine they are all alike; the green color looks light and pale.

25s, imit., well executed. Look out.

2d Issue.

10s, imitation. All gen. on the top has the word "Depositaries," the imitation reads "Depositories."

50s, imit., have a pale slate color. The small barrels on lower right corner are very indistinct. The gen. have six barrels perfectly clear and plain. Three on lower row, two on next, and one on top. The counterfeit barrels are black, and gen. are white.

50s raised from 5s.

3d Issue.

50c. imit.; two kinds of the new long 50 cent currency. The imitation of one kind has DESIGNATED on upper right corner instead of DESIGNATED. The second kind has designated correctly spelt, but on the little American Shield, under the Eagle, there is a black line drawn across the upright bars of the Shield. Not so on the genuine.

25s, imit., are very pale and coarse. The letter C in cents on left end is smaller than the other letters, and too far off.

New Issue.

25, imitation. Above the words "Treasury Department," on the bottom of the bill in the genuine there is a fine notched line—the counterfeits have a straight line.

Notice the shading of the "25" on the back of the note. The genuine is dark, while the counterfeits is very pale, and very little darker than the other green. The word "of" on the face of the genuine appears thus—"of"—on the counterfeit "of."

25s, imit., well executed, but may be detected by the absence of a period (.) after the word Treasurer under Spinner's name; the work is better than any we have previously seen and liable to deceive unless carefully examined.

25s, well executed; head of Chittenden; where it reads "Furnished only by the Assistant Treasurers" the Assistant is spelt "Assistatn." In the genuine the shading of the letter "E" in "Five" is unbroken, while the counterfeit has a little notch in it.

50s, well executed. The engraving on the face of the note is excellent. The adverse is slightly blurred. The notes are an eighth of an inch narrower than the genuine.

50s, the "y" in "Colby's" name crosses a line of the coat in the genuine, but not in the counterfeit.

50s, the line of stars on counterfeit between the figures "50" at the top and bottom of the back of the note have white centres, while the entire stars on genuine are in green. The reading in black on the genuine note clear and distinct, while on the counterfeit the bronze is printed on the black, the words "FIFTY CENTS" being almost obliterated.

50s, well done. The last "e" in the signature of F. E. Spinner is omitted in some, and the (.) after print. on one end, and the d. after March 30.

50s. New and dangerous counterfeits of the last issue of the fifty cent fractional currency notes, which bear upon their face the head of Treasurer Spinner, have been detected by the Treasury Department. It can be detected by the absence of a period (.) after the word print on the right end, and also under the letter "d" in "March 30," on the left end. The paper is thicker than that of the genuine notes, and the general appearance is calculated to deceive unless closely inspected.

COUNTERFEIT 7.30 BONDS.

The seal is slightly larger than the genuine; the red ink with which it is stamped is a shade lighter, and the points projecting from the seal are blurred and a little longer than the genuine. The imprint at the bottom of the face of the bond is set different in the margin, there being more space given it than in the genuine. The borders of the coupon which are attached to the counterfeit bonds are larger, while the red figures are finer than in the genuine. The borders of the ornamental lathework are blurred and somewhat indifferently executed. The figures denoting the bond are slightly uneven, while the blue ink in which they are printed is a deeper blue and lacks the metallic glossy appearance of the genuine.

A counterfeit coupon for three dollars, purporting to belong to a one hundred dollar 5.20 bond, has been received at the Treasury Department, which had been sent from Germany to New York, cashed here and forwarded to Washington for collection. The counterfeit is a lithograph, and when compared with the genuine coupon it could be easily detected by the most inexperienced persons; as the execution is rough and inartistic, the paper thin and common, and a trifle shorter than the genuine coupon. It assumes to belong to the 5.20s of 1862, fourth series, and bore the stamp of some German house on the back, but too indistinctly to be deciphered fully.
