This was the usual Air Support mission supplied daily to OKINAWA. The only assigned target was an indefinite zone concealing enemy troops and mortar positions in Ta 7974, B.F. Most of the fighters armament was released at this point; the remainder was loosed against targets of opportunity in southern OKINAWA, namely: one artillery casemate (results unobserved), two trucks (one destroyed, one damaged), a large brick building in ITOMAN town (a little smoke indicating slight damage), and one bomb dropped in ARAGUSUKU town with unobserved results.
