ECLIPSES.

There will this year be three Eclipses of the Sun and two of the moon.

— On the 9th January and 6th June.—Eclipses of the Sun, invisible at Quebec.

— On the 22d June—Eclipse of the Moon, total, and visible at Quebec.

Commencement at 1 h. 45 m. morning. The Moon totally obscured by the earth's shadow at 2 h. 50 m.

Middle, 3 h. 53 m. The moon will set totally eclipsed at 4 h. 7 m. End of the Eclipse at 5 h. 19½ m.

Duration, 3 h. 33 m. Digits eclipsed, 16° 42 m. beginning on the Moon's northern limb.

— On the 30th November—Eclipse of the Sun, visible at Quebec, total and central in many places on the continent of North America.

Commencement at 1 h. 15½ m. evening. Conjunction at 2 h. 2½ m. Middle, 2 h. 29 m. End, 3 h. 43½ m. Total duration, 2 h. 28 m. Digits eclipsed,

9° 21' on the southern limb of the Sun's disk. The line of the total Eclipse will begin on the Russian territory in about 63 degrees of North latitude, and

thence extend along the range of the Rocky Mountains to the river Arkansas; from thence, diverging to the East, it will pass over the Mississippi and the

Southern States, and strike the Atlantic near the meridian of Charleston, cross the Bermudas and

end between the Azores and the gulf of St. Lawrence.

— On the 15th and 16th Dec.—Eclipse of the Moon, visible at Quebec.

Commencement on the 15th at 10 h. 38 m. evening. Middle on the 16th at 0 h. 7 m. morning. End on the 16th at 1 h. 36 m. Total duration, 2 h. 58 m.

Digits eclipsed, 8° 6' on the Moon's southern limb.

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ECLIPSES.

9 Janvier et 6 Juin—Eclipses de soleil, invisibles à Québec.

22 Juin—Eclipse de lune, totale, et visible à Québec :

Commencement, à 1h. 45m. matin. La lune totalement plongée dans l'ombre de la terre à 2h. 50m. Milieu à 3. h. 33 m. matin. La lune se couche totalement éclipée à 4h. 7m. Fin de l'éclipse à 5h. 19½ m. du matin. Durée, 3h. 33 m. Doigts éclipseés, 16° 42', à commencer sur le limbe septentrional de la lune.

30 Novembre—Eclipse de soleil, visible à Québec, totale et centrale dans beaucoup d'endroits de l'Amérique septentrionale :

Commencement à 1h. 15½ m. soir. Conjonction à 2h. 2½ m. Milieu à 2h. 29 m. Fin à 3h. 43½ m.—Durée totale, 2h. 28 m. Doigts éclipseés, 9° 21', sur le limbe inéquatorial du disque solaire. L'éclipse totale commencera sur le territoire Russe, vers les 63° de latitude N. ; elle parcourra ensuite toute la chaîne des montagnes rocheuses jusqu'à la rivière Arkansas ; de là, se détournant à l'est, elle traversera le Mississippi et les Etats du sud ; enfin elle entrera sur l'Atlantique vers le méridien de Charleston (C. du S.), passera aux Bermudes, et se terminera entre les Açores et le golfe St. Laurent.

15 et 16 Décembre—Eclipse de lune, visible à Québec :

Commencement, le 15 à 10h. 38 m. du soir. Milieu, le 16 à 0 h. 7 m. matin. Fin, le 16 à 1 h. 36 m. matin. Durée totale, 2 h. 58 m. Doigts éclipseés, 8° 6', sur le limbe méridional de la lune.

The French evacuate Belgium. Warsaw falls; renewed troubles at Paris but suppressed. Cholera Morbus increasing, great alarm for its spreading. Reform bill lost in the Lords. Cholera in England, Ireland and Scotland.

The allies ratify the treaty for the separation of Belgium from Holland—Don Pedro sails from Nantes and lands at Oporto with an expedition, to place the Crown of Portugal in the hands of his daughter Donna Maria. Reform bills for England, Ireland and Scotland, become law.—Resistance to tithes and disturbed state of Ireland. Otho, son of the King of Bavaria placed on the throne of Greece by the allies—new boundaries fixed.—Ibrahim of Egypt takes St. Jean d'Acre and Damaskus.—Unsettled state of Europe continues.—About 6 000 souls carried off by the Indian Cholera in Quebec and Montreal, from June to September; ravages in the country parts of the district of Montreal and some parishes in that of Quebec—spreads throughout the United States; great mortality at Charleston and New Orleans from cholera and fever.

Will show a light every evening from sunset to sunrise, between the first of April and the thirty-first of Decr. inclusive.

The following Notice was published by the Trinity House, relating to this Light House :—

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

That a Light House has been erected on **POINTE DES MONTS**, (or Cape Monts Pelés) on the north side of the River St. Lawrence, nearly opposite to Cap Chat, the Lantern standing one hundred feet above the water.

The Light House lays with the outermost part of **CARIBOU POINT**, N. 52° . East and S. 52° . West, by compass, and it can be seen over that point and to the Eastward of it.

Ships approaching the light from the Eastward, as they draw towards Caribou Point must bring it to bear W. by S.; they will then be in a good fair way, and if necessary they can near the land by their Lead.

After passing Caribou Point, and as they draw towards the Light House, they must come no nearer than 12 fathoms water to avoid two ledges of rocky one of which lays E.S.E. from the Light, with only 12 feet water on it ; the other lays S. W. from the Light, and E. S. E. from the Western extremity of

LIGHT-HOUSES.

Pointe des Monts, with 16 feet water on it ; but these rocks do not lay farther from the shore than half a mile at low water.

The Light House lays with the western extremity of Pointe des Monts N. 64° . East and S. 64° . West, and distant about one mile ; and when ships are to the Westward of the Point; the Light House is in one with the outermost Rocks off the Point ; and in the day time it forms a bold distinct Land Mark; and on this line of bearing ships are in the best possible fair way for the general purposes of Navigation, whether bound up or down.

For any particular purposes of Navigation, Ships may safely stand to the Northward, until the Light bears E. by N. ; they will then be drawing near the North Land ; and when it bears E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N. it is time to tack ; for when it bears East it will shut in with the High Land and cannot be seen to the Southward of East, and then they will be only one mile from the Land, and if they are off *Godbut* river, Pointe des Monts will bear from them E. by S. two leagues distant.

When ships are off Saint Nicolas Harbor, and the light bearing E. by N. they are in a good fair way from the North Land The S. E. spit of *Manicouagan* great Shoal, the Ship and the Light House are then all in one line of bearing.

Keeper—Lt. Harvey, h. p. Royal Navy.

A Light-House having been erected on the South West point of the Island of Anticosti, Notice is hereby given that a Grand Revolving Light, on the Argand principle, was shewn thereon for the first time, on the 25th of August 1831—and that the said

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LIGHT-HOUSES.

Light will continue to be shewn every night from Sun-set to Sun-rise, from the 25th day of March to the last day of December in each year.

When Ships are to the eastward of the Light-House, they may safely stand towards the Island until it bears N. N. W. by Compass—they will then be in a good fair way—and if they wish to make more free with the land they can do so by their lead. The land trends from the Light-House S. E. by S. or nearly so.

When Ships are to the Westward of the Light-House, they may safely stand towards the Island until the Light bears S. S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., they will then be in a good fair way from the Land, and as before mentioned they can make more free by their lead.

Nearly East and West with the Light-House, and about three-fourths of a mile from it, is the outermost part of a *Reef of Rocks*, which joins the S. W. point. These are dry at low water and are the only dangers near the Light-House; therefore a berth of a mile from the point is a good fair way.

Sixteen leagues to the eastward of the Light-House, at Shallop Creek, and sixteen leagues to the westward of the Light-House, at Grand Bay, and at the Light-House itself are *Depôts* of provisions for the use of Mariners in distress or other ship-wrecked persons.

A Light-House is now building on Heath Point at the east end of the Island of Anticosti, and will be completed about the middle of next summer.
