

Pakistan – Floods

- Monsoon affecting Pakistan in the past 10 days is weakening; flood risk persists, however, and a significant flood forecast for river Indus at Guddu and Sukkur in N Sindh has been issued for 20-21 Aug.
- In Punjab: local media report more than 200 villages submerged by flooding of the rivers Tawi, Nullah Dek and Basantar in the N and infrastructure damage in Sialkot and Rajanpur, N and S Punjab respectively.
- As of 17 Aug (NDMA), as a result of the rains in the current monsoon season, countrywide there were 106 dead, 305 000 affected, 2 800 people in 44 relief camps.

Russia – Floods

- Floods caused by heavy rainfall in parts of the Far East area since the end of July 2013. Worst-affected regions are Amur and Khabarovsk (where river Amur has reached its historical maximum).
- Media report that 17 000 people have been evacuated as of 18 Aug in these regions, with another 100 000 people at risk. Local Media reported ca. 5 700 houses flooded.
- Floods also in the Jewish Autonomous Region.

CHINA – Floods

- On 15-17 Aug heavy rains affected parts of NE China.
- Liaoning province: severe flooding, particularly in Fushun city. As of 19 Aug (Chinese government): 54 dead, 97 missing, 162 000 people emergency relocated, more than 6 100 houses collapsed and 34 000 houses damaged.
- Jilin Province: 15 dead, 110 000 evacuated, 37 000 houses collapsed or severely damaged.
- Heilongjiang Province: 3 dead, 87 000 evacuated, 3 900 houses collapsed or severely damaged.
- Guangdong province (S China): due to heavy rains, 8 people reported killed in the past 2 days. All together with the impact of Tropical Cyclone UTOR on 15-16 August, 20 people have been killed and 19 000 houses collapsed or were severely damaged in this province.

Philippines, China – Tropical Cyclone

- TRAMI, formed on 17 Aug in the Philippine Sea, at 06:00 UTC 19 Aug was a Tropical Storm with max. sust. wind speed of 93 km/h and its centre was located over water. In the next 24h it is forecast to turn N and then NW, in the direction of Taiwan, strengthening, possibly reaching Typhoon strength. It might approach the Yaeyama islands (Japan) and the coast of northern Taiwan on 21 Aug.
- In the Philippines (locally named MARING), it has enhanced the SW Monsoon, causing heavy rains and floods over Luzon. As of 08:00 UTC 19 Aug (MDRRMC): 3 dead, 11 injured, 4 missing and 94 226 people affected in 5 regions (I, III, IV-A, CAR, NCR).

Sudan, South Sudan - Floods

- On 15 Aug, AFP reported 53 people killed and 200 000 affected since the beginning of heavy rainfall and floods on 1 Aug in Sudan. As of 17 Aug (local media) report that 17 000 families have been affected in the past week.
- As of 15 Aug, the IFRC launched an emergency appeal to assist the people affected by severe flooding in the states of Khartoum and River Nile.
- On 14 Aug (local media), due to the floods, the Nyeel refugee camp in Unity state (South Sudan), was going to close and its residents would be relocated.

Yemen – Severe Weather

- Heavy rainfall and storms affected Yemen on 16-17 Aug, causing flash floods in many places.
- A total of at least 50 people were killed by flash floods and lightning strikes over the weekend. 27 people were killed in the governorate of Taiz, 7 in Hodeidah, 6 in Udayn district (Ibb governorate).

Cambodia – Floods

- Heavy monsoon rainfall over Thailand and Cambodia since the beginning of Aug has caused overflowing of rivers in N Cambodia, affecting the provinces of Banteay Meanchey and Preah Vihear.
- As of 15 Aug (local media) report more than 500 families displaced in Banteay Meanchey, 7 dead in the districts of Poipet, Sisophon, Svay Chek and Thma Puok; 2 592 families affected throughout the province, 220 houses damaged.
- As of 16 Aug, the province of Preah Vihear had declared a state of emergency (Local Media).
