# Report of the meeting with the Wikimedia Foundation

- In May 9th, we held a meeting with WMF staff Tajh Taylor (VP Data Science and Engineering) and Guillaume Paumier (CoS Products and Technology)
- The meeting had two main objectives:
  - To present the manifesto collaborative methodology; How did we identified and agreed on the priorities, and;
  - To discuss the establishment of common Key Performance Indicators, leveraging the discussion process WMF has been adopting when deciding its strategic plans; What can we do together and how do we measure its operational success.

### **Technology Council**

• The Movement Charter proposes the creation of a Global Council, with four functions and areas of decision-making (committees). Pages 7-10 (<a href="https://w.wiki/ATbU">https://w.wiki/ATbU</a>)

"The Global Council coordinates across different Wikimedia Movement technology-focused stakeholders<sup>[1]</sup>, and provides advice and guidance on technological advancement. The Global Council assists and advises the Wikimedia Foundation in prioritizing technological changes,16 including the opening or closing of Wikimedia language projects, and helps the wider Wikimedia Movement understand the technological priorities as set forth in the strategic direction. The Global Council will exercise these functions in collaboration with Wikimedia Movement Bodies and online technical contributors.<sup>[2][3]</sup>"

- We also need to define metrics to accurately measure our progress towards them (KPIs);

## **Key Performance Indicators**

- Each of the 10 priorities were defined with goals, KPIs and deliverables
- The KPIs have been categorised into 3 Activity KPIs namely:
  - Community engagement KPI
  - Projects KPI
  - Events KPI
- These KPIs are qualitative and quantitative, majorly tracking:
  - Count of activities/metrics involved
  - Engagement from the activities
  - Feedback/participants' satisfaction
