The weby 35 follo I, FUTAMI, Akishuro, served at Rashin in Korea as the Commander of the Rashin Fortress, from December, 1942, to March, 1945. The units under me were the headquarters of the fortress and a heavy artillery regiment. The fortress was equipped with four 15-centimetre cannons and eight 7.5-centimetre cannons. We had no guns of larger calibre. The 15-centimetre cannons were fixed batteries and the 7.5 centimetre mobile field guns. About March, 1944, according to the order of the Imperial General Headquarters, the main strength of the artillery regiment was transferred to Japan proper, leaving about 100 men. The batteries were also removed then and only several 7.5 centimetre cannons remained in Rashin. The Keiko district was outside my jurisdiction, but there was no fortress in and around Keiko.
