MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Occupation Cost Estimates for Fiscal Years 1947 and 1948 - Civilian Pay and Breakdown of Pay and Allowances, and Subsistence and Maintenance as Reported in G-50365.

1. The subject named estimates are submitted to comply with Washington (WDDBT) radios WAR 82659 dated 10 October 1946, WAR 84899 dated 6 November 1946, WAR 87861 dated 18 December 1946, W90273 dated 22 January 1947 and W90623 dated 28 January 1947.
2. This estimate is submitted to comply to the civilian pay information desired in the referenced Washington radios and in accordance with paragraph A, SCAP radio G-50365 dated 24 February 1947, Civilian Pay.
3. The subject estimates were computed on a formula suggested by the Fiscal Director, that is: to determine the actual GI obligations incurred for the first half of the fiscal year 1947 and multiply the amount by a factor of two, to arrive at an estimate for one year.
4. There are no projected employment schedules available in this theatre for the fiscal year 1948. In the absence of such information the only way to estimate for fiscal year 1948 would be to use fiscal year 1947 estimates. This method manifestly has no foundation in the face of possible action on appropriations, therefore it is better to omit FY 48 estimates for the time being.
5. The Ryukyus estimate does not include the Okinawa District Engineers who are engaged in the construction of permanent army installations.
6. SARICA report estimates are in the process of being compiled and will become available at the conclusion of negotiations now proceeding between G-4 and ESC.
7. Indigenous Procurements are not available as the records and procedures are in process of revision.
8. War Department requested breakdown as among services on figures previously submitted by SCAP (G-50365). Particularly Pay and Allowances and Subsistence and Maintenance.

ZI armies notified direct. Theater commanders pass to all subordinate commands. Commanding Generals of continental armies and commanding General of Military District of Washington pass to class I and II installations within your area. Major Air Corps Commands pass to all subordinate commands.

Considerable delay and confusion in handling of electrical communications is presently experienced due to misunderstanding of use of internal relay and passing instructions by originators. Notify all originators of electrical communications that command routing is the only type of routing that originators will place in internal instructions in classified or unclassified messages. All other routing is responsibility of signal agencies involved. Command routing consists of passing message to another Hq for approval and reorigination to ultimate addressee. In all cases where direct communication is authorized and command routing not necessary originators will show addressees externally and omit internal routing instructions. 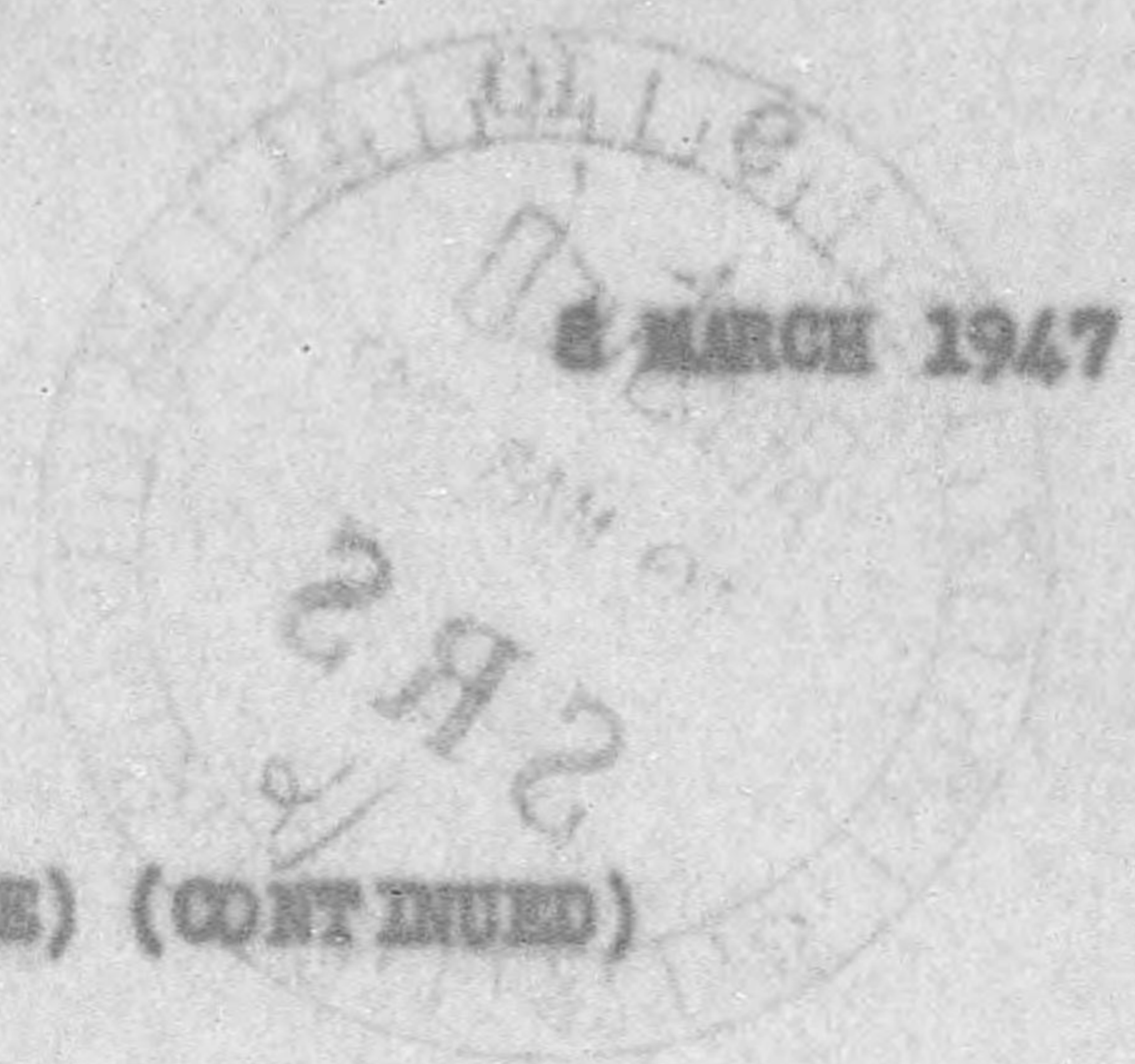

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:**SUBJECT: Occupation Cost Estimates for Fiscal Years 1947 and 1948**

1. The subject named estimates are submitted to comply with Washington (WDSDU) radios WAR 82659 dated 10 October 1946, WAR 84836 dated 6 November 1946, WAR 87861 dated 18 December 1946, W90275 dated 22 January 1947 and W90625 dated 28 January 1947.

2. The 1947 and 1948 estimates are transmitted by radio and consist of five occupation cost categories as follows:

a. Pay and Allowance

- (1) Total military estimates Fiscal Years 1947 and 1948 are \$371,513,996 and \$347,834,197 respectively. These estimates are comprised of U. S. Army, U. S. Army Air Forces, U. S. Navy, and U. S. Marine Corps occupation forces stationed in Japan, Korea, and the Ryukyus Islands.
- (2) U. S. Army estimates for fiscal year 1947 (excluding AAF) were computed on a basis of 162,617 estimated man years and 151,137 estimated man years for fiscal year 1948. The man year estimates were submitted by G-3 on check sheet dated 27 January 1947. Due to the fact that a breakdown for PACUSA as to Japan and Korea was not submitted for the first half of Fiscal Year 1947, the troop ceiling as of 1 January 47 was used for the 1947 troop strength estimate. There was a complete breakdown for Japan, Korea, and Ryukyus Islands for this period. There was no information available which would indicate projected troop ceilings beyond 1 July 47, consequently the 1948 estimates are based on 1 July 1947, troop ceiling strength.
- (3) The estimated man years were multiplied by weighted average factors which were submitted by radio W89884 dated 17 January 1947 from Washington (WDSDU). The factors used for this computation were: Base pay \$1368, Longevity \$181, Overseas pay \$241, and Rental quarters \$72.
- (4) U.S.A.A.F. estimates were computed on a basis of 31,408 estimated air corps man years for Fiscal Year 1947 and 31,408 for Fiscal Year 1948. These estimates were multiplied by the above U. S. Army weighted average factors plus a \$72 flight pay factor.

- (5) Parachute and glider factors are not included as strength figures were not available. Badge and medal factors of \$36 and family Allowance factor of \$405 are not included as these factors seem too high. Other factors were excluded as they were not considered relative to Cost of Occupation pay and allowance estimates.
- (6) U.S. Navy estimates for Japan were computed on basis of 1987 estimated man years for the fiscal year 1947 and 1395 estimated man years for the fiscal year 1948. These strength figures were submitted by COMNAVFE by letter dated 13 February 1947. The estimated man years were multiplied by the same weighted average factors as used for computing U. S. Army. There were no estimates submitted by the Navy for flying.
- (7) Navy estimates for the Ryukyus Islands were submitted by GECB Okinawa by radio 240605Z dated 26 October 1946 and are reported as submitted. No Navy personnel are stationed in Korea.
- (8) U.S. Marine Corps estimates for Japan and Ryukyus Islands are based on information received by FMFPAC radio 172041Z dated 19 October 1946 and MARCORPS radio 012126Z dated 2 November 1946. No Marine Corps personnel are stationed in Korea. Estimates are reported as submitted.
- (9) Civilian Pay and Allowance estimates are being computed and will be submitted as soon as they become available.
- b. Subsistence and Maintenance.
- (1) Subsistence and Maintenance estimates include both officers and enlisted men. The military estimate includes U. S. Army, U. S. Navy, and U. S. Marine Corps for Japan and the Ryukyus Islands. As there are no Navy or Marine Corps personnel in Korea, only the Army estimates are submitted.
- (2) The total military estimates were based on 198,553 estimated man years for the fiscal year 1947 and 185,716 man years for fiscal year 1948. The man year estimates are the same used in pay and allowance computations and derived from the same sources.
- (3) The estimated man years for 1947 and 1948 were multiplied by weighted average factors including subsistence, \$318, clothing \$265, individual equipment \$9, Welfare \$4, and Medical \$118. Other factors were not considered relative to Cost of Occupation subsistence and maintenance estimates.
- (4) Civilian personnel are considered on a pay as you go basis.

SECRET**d. Repatriation**

- (1) Repatriation estimates include only estimates for Japan, which are \$19,547,535 for fiscal year 1947 and \$2,086,200 for fiscal year 1948.
- (2) The estimate of fiscal year 1947 up until 1 January 1947 was computed by dividing the total number of repatriates repatriated as of the 30 June 1946, into the total cost of repatriation reported as of that time. By this method a cost of \$10.24 per repatriate was arrived at. As certain repatriation costs were still outstanding an estimated factor of 15 dollars per repatriate was used, consequently this cost is subject to change. The 15 dollar factor was multiplied by estimated 1,234,973 repatriates to be repatriated by 31 December 1946. These estimates include such items as petroleum products, ship charter hire, medical and quartermaster supplies, and loss of chartered U. S. vessels.
- (3) The estimates for the remainder of fiscal year 1947 and all of fiscal year 1948 were computed on the basis that other than U. S. shipping will be used for the remainder of the repatriation program. 12 LSTs are being held in reserve during this period. The basis for this period was \$475. per day each. This figure consists of \$300. a day each for rent and \$175. a day each for operating expenses.

e. Indigenous Procurements

- (1) These estimates are not available as the records and procedure are in process of revision.

f. Extraneous Costs

- (1) Apparent loss on exchange transaction, resulting from the conversion of illegally acquired yen to dollars at military rate of fifteen to one prior to currency changeover to military type currency. As of 31 December 1946 the total for the Army, Navy, and Marine Corps for Japan was \$75,433,659. There are no records available for Korea or the Ryukyu Islands. Reliable estimates of further reduction can not be determined.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Occupation Cost Estimates for Fiscal Years 1947 and 1948.

1. The subject named estimates are submitted to comply with Washington (WDSHU) radios WAR 82659 dated 10 October 1946, WAR 84839 dated 6 November 1946, WAR 87861 dated 18 December 1946, W90275 dated 22 January 1947 and W90625 dated 23 January 1947.

2. The 1947 and 1948 estimates are transmitted by radio and consist of five occupation cost categories as follows:

a. Pay and Allowance

- (1) Total military estimates Fiscal Years 1947 and 1948 are \$371,513,996 and \$347,884,197 respectively. These estimates are comprised of U. S. Army, U. S. Army Air Forces, U. S. Navy, and U. S. Marine Corps occupation forces stationed in Japan, Korea, and the Ryukyus Islands.
- (2) U. S. Army estimates for fiscal year 1947 (excluding AAF) were computed on a basis of 162,817 estimated man years and 181,137 estimated man years for fiscal year 1948. The man year estimates were submitted by G-3 on check sheet dated 27 January 1947. Due to the fact that a breakdown for PACUSA as to Japan and Korea was not submitted for the first half of Fiscal Year 1947, the troop ceiling as of 1 January 47 was used for the 1947 troop strength estimate. There was a complete breakdown for Japan, Korea, and Ryukyus Islands for this period. There was no information available which would indicate projected troop ceilings beyond 1 July 47, consequently the 1948 estimates are based on 1 July 1947, troop ceiling strength.
- (3) The estimated man years were multiplied by weighted average factors which were submitted by radio W89884 dated 17 January 1947 from Washington (WDSHU). The factors used for this computation were: Base pay \$1355, Longevity \$121, Overseas pay \$241, and Rental quarters \$72.
- (4) U.S.A.A.F. estimates were computed on a basis of 31,408 estimated air corps man years for Fiscal Year 1947 and 31,408 for Fiscal Year 1948. These estimates were multiplied by the above U.S. Army weighted average factors plus a \$72 flight pay factor.

- (5) Parachute and glider factors are not included as strength figures were not available. Badge and medal factors of \$56 and family Allowance factor of \$403 are not included as these factors seem too high. Other factors were excluded as they were not considered relative to Cost of Occupation pay and allowance estimates.
- (6) U.S. Navy estimates for Japan were computed on basis of 1987 estimated man years for the fiscal year 1947 and 1296 estimated man years for the fiscal year 1948. These strength figures were submitted by COMNAVFE by letter dated 13 February 1947. The estimated man years were multiplied by the same weighted average factors as used for computing U. S. Army. There were no estimates submitted by the Navy for flying.
- (7) Navy estimates for the Ryukyus Islands were submitted by COMNAVFE Okinawa by radio 240608Z dated 26 October 1946 and are reported as submitted. No Navy personnel are stationed in Korea.
- (8) U. S. Marine Corps estimates for Japan and Ryukyus Islands are based on information received by FMFPAC radio 172041Z dated 19 October 1946 and MARCOMPS radio 012126Z dated 3 November 1946. No Marine Corps personnel are stationed in Korea. Estimates are reported as submitted.
- (9) Civilian Pay and Allowance estimates are being computed and will be submitted as soon as they become available.

b. Subsistence and Maintenance

- (1) Subsistence and Maintenance estimates include both officers and enlisted men. The military estimate includes U. S. Army, U. S. Navy, and U. S. Marine Corps for Japan and the Ryukyus Islands. As there are no Navy or Marine Corps personnel in Korea, only the Army estimates are submitted.
- (2) The total military estimates were based on 198,553 estimated man years for the fiscal year 1947 and 185,718 man years for fiscal year 1948. The man year estimates are the same used in pay and allowance computations and derived from the same sources.
- (3) The estimated man years for 1947 and 1948 were multiplied by weighted average factors including subsistence, \$313, clothing \$265, individual equipment \$9, Welfare \$4, and Medical \$118. Other factors were not considered relative to Cost of Occupation subsistence and maintenance estimates.
- (4) Civilian personnel are considered on a pay as you go basis.

c. Repatriation

- (1) Repatriation estimates include only estimates for Japan, which are \$10,547,525 for fiscal year 1947 and \$2,000,000 for fiscal year 1948.
- (2) The estimate of fiscal year 1947 up until 1 January 1947 was computed by dividing the total number of repatriates repatriated as of the 30 June 1946, into the total cost of repatriation reported as of that time. By this method a cost of \$10.24 per repatriate was arrived at. As certain repatriation costs were still outstanding an estimated factor of 15 dollars per repatriate was used, consequently this cost is subject to change. The 15 dollar factor was multiplied by estimated 1,234,373 repatriates to be repatriated by 31 December 1946. These estimates include such items as petroleum products, ship charter hire, medical and quarter-master supplies, and loss of chartered U. S. vessels.
- (3) The estimates for the remainder of fiscal year 1947 and all of fiscal year 1948 were computed on the basis that "other than U.S. shipping will be used for the remainder of the repatriation program. 12 LSTs are being held in reserve during this period. The basis for this period was \$475. per day each. This figure consists of \$300. a day each for rent and \$175. a day each for operating expenses.

d. Indigenous Procurement

- (1) These estimates are not available as the records and procedure are in process of revision.

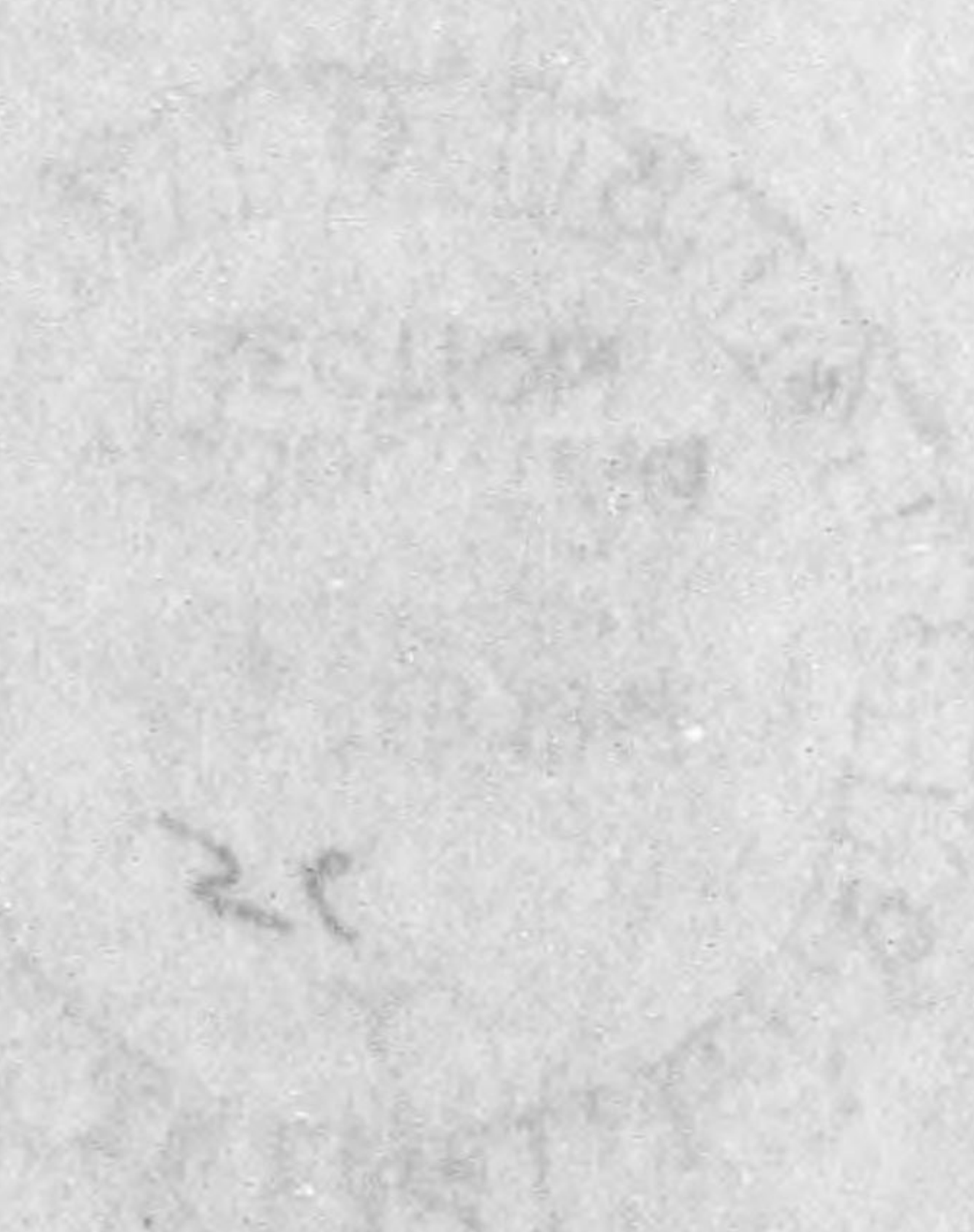
e. Extraneous Costs

- (1) Apparent loss on exchange transaction, resulting from the conversion of illegally acquired yen to dollars at military rate of fifteen to one prior to currency shakedown to military type currency. As of 31 December 1946 the total for the Army, Navy, and Marine Corps for Japan was \$75,433,659. There are no records available for Korea or the Ryukyu Islands. Reliable estimates of further reduction can not be determined.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. See Memo for Record, 26 Dec 46, and our radio Z-30583, 9 Jan 47, on subject of an interim directive proposed by Washington re assets in Japan of corporations with head offices outside of Japan.

2. In accordance with suggestion of Chief of Staff, SCAP's proposed reply to Washington radio WAR 87687, 14 December 46, was discussed with Mr. Warren Silver, State Dept. representative, temporarily attached to SCAP.

3. It was Mr. Silver's opinion that SCAP should not permit governments of other Far Eastern countries to pursue into Japan physical assets here of companies the assets of which those governments have vested outside of Japan, since such action would constitute an additional disruptive force in the economy of Japan.

4. Mr. Silver was also in agreement with previous opinion expressed by interested sections of SCAP (see Memo for Record, 26 Dec 46) that proposed interim directive is not required at this time in view of adequate controls over the operations of such branches in Japan presently being exercised by SCAP.

5. Attached radio to Washington emphasizes the above-mentioned factors and recommends against issuance of an interim directive.

6. This is a policy matter but not one of substance.

7. The interests of USAFIK are concerned.

8. The other interested Staff Sections of SCAP (ESS, DS, GS and G-4) have been advised of the alterations made in the original proposed reply and have concurred (by telephone) in the attached radio reply.

Summary of activity of Korean Interim Legislative Assembly follows:

The Legislature adjourned over New Year until 6 Jan. Sessions have been marked by heavy attendance, conspicuous seriousness of debate and respectful spectator attention.

Korean press comment generally favorable and hoped that legislative effort may be instrumental in evolution to independence. Controlled Communist press continued regard Legislature as tool of foreign capitalist oppression.

Sessions thus far concerned exclusively with 2 problems, seating of members and establishment of Assembly rules. All members have been seated except 5 containers among appointed group and 8 elected.

Assembly rules were passed under European Parliamentary practice of 3 readings. Rules appear to be usual proceeding provisions except that manner of filling vacancies including present vacancies in the membership is provided. This provision goes beyond jurisdiction of internal regulation of the Assembly and after official translation into English is received may have to be disapproved by Mil Govt.

War majority sentiment of Assembly was recognition of necessity of working under Moscow Decision, but holding it unnecessary to dignity argument of Communist opposition by rebutting it.

It appears that Han Kmlhemin Ju Dan (Korean Democratic Party) will be cooperative in present honeymoon stage and that political alignments will not be sharply drawn. They qualify this statement however as meaning control only on such vital issues as pro-Jap and land issues. Proceedings opened by Yon Chong Kwan of Peoples Party moving assembly make special investigation of recent incidents at Chonju, Cholla Pukto (during which police fired into crowd killing 6) and negotiate settlement with MG officials. Motion tabled pending adoption of rules and selection of assembly officials and staff members.

Thirty first through last article (97) of rules approved on second reading; discussion centered on articles 32 and 68.

Articles 32 amended provides 6 special committees: Qualifications, drafting provisional constitution and election laws, drafting regulations for administration and organization, food and price control measures (original draft read food control only) measures for dealing with enemy property, drafting laws dealing with collaborators, traitors, war criminals and profiteers.

Proposal of Kang Sun and Yon Chong Kwon to change expression "Nation" (Kuk Min) in article 68 to "People" (in Min) rejected. Pertinent passage reads, "Assembly cannot issue proclamation directly to the nation".

Motion of Kim Pung Jun to dispense with third reading of rules adopted after further change in article 2 on compromise motion of Ahn, Jae Hong. Pertinent passage now reads: "Interim assembly will terminate when North and South are united and a new legislative mechanism resulting from nation wide suffrage comes into being, or a unified provisional government based on democracy is established". Rules not yet fully translated into English.

Chee Dong O and Yun Ki Sop elected Vice Chairmen of assembly. Chair appointed Yi Sang Su Chief Secretary, Sol Chong Sik Deputy Secretary, Dr Chyun Kyu Hong (Chon Kyu Hong) office manager. Adjourned to 6 Jan 47.
