MISSION: DAVAO ALERT.

FLIGHT COMPOSITION: W.C.Olsen, Madigan, R.Olsen, Lovette, Dake,
Doss, Cresham, Cates.

TIME: TFO:1245. ATA:1605.

WEATHER: Cumulus from 2-10000 feet, 2/10 coverage.

COMMENT: The target, given by fighter director, was the repair shops area above TUGBOK. Coming in from the Northeast, the first bomb hung and went out into the beandocks, a dud; the second exploded 100 feet from the east side of the road; the third dropped in a banana grove, presumably a trench area; the fourth landed nearby; the six 500-lb. bombs all landed in the target area. Results were not observed. Excellent coverage. The pilots strafed on an extra pass. Cates and Madigan refueled at MALABANG.
