

THE QUANTITY OF BLOOM PRODUCED IS MARVELLOUS, the average production of bulbs 5 to 7 in circumference, even when forced, is from 5 to 8 flowers; and of bulbs 7 to to 9 inches, 8 to 12 flowers; and if desired a second crop of flowers frequently equal to the first can be secured the same season by drying the plants off after blooming for a time and then again starting them. In their native habitats it is nothing unusual for good bulbs to bear from 30 to 50 flowers and occasionally as many as a hundred or more.

A short time only is required to bring them into bloom. Bulbs are ripe and ready for delivery by the first of August, and if potted within a short time they can be had in flower in November if desired and

A succession of bloom can be kept up from November to May by bringing the pots of rooted bulbs in from cold frames at intervals throughout the winter; of course, the great desideratum is to bring large lots into bloom at Christmas and Easter.

**Blooming Plants in Pots** for typical Easter offering, and decoration of the window, table, house or church, nothing is more appropriately beautiful or more highly appreciated. Thousands upon thousands are sold in the large cities every winter for this purpose at from \$1,00 to \$2.00 per plant, and the demand, which is rapidly growing, has never been fully supplied.

As a Garden Lily it is of great beauty, being entirely hardy south of Washington, and in the Northern States only requires a protection of leaves or litter to the depth of 5 or 6 inches during the winter.




