The aircraft was on a positioning flight from Glasgow to Edinburgh Airport. About 10 minutes into the flight, at an altitude of 4,000 feet, the 'door unlocked' caption on the warning panel illuminated. The handling pilot reduced speed to about 160 kt whilst the other crew member went aft to visually check the door where he found that all the handles and latches were correctly stowed. However, about 2 minutes later the upper door opened suddenly, followed about 30 seconds later by the lower door which broke away from its hinges in the slipstream. It has not been recovered at the time of preparation of this Bulletin.

As the aircraft seemed to handle normally, the flight was continued to Edinburgh, where Air Traffic Control were informed of what had occurred. The aircraft landed without further incident. The

pilot-in-command has stated that the door closing procedures were correctly followed prior to the flight but "the lock pins must have not locked properly".
