In the Year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty

An Act to Incorporate the Ladies' American Home-Education Society and Temperance Union

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled by authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. Sarah Hayward, Susan B. Holway, Frances S. Kettelle, Ruth Severance, their associates and successors, are hereby made a corporation, by the name of the "Ladies' American Home-Education Society and Temperance Union," to be established in Boston, in the County of Suffolk, for the purpose of establishing a Home and a school, to aid in the support and education of indigent youth, with all the powers and privileges, and subject to all the duties, restrictions, and liabilities set forth in the forty-fourth chapter of the Revised Statutes.

Section 2. Said corporation may receive and take by purchase, grant, devise, bequest, or donation, any real or personal property, and hold the same for the purpose aforesaid, and may manage and dispose of the same according to their discretion, provided that the whole amount of real and personal property held and possessed by the said corporation shall not exceed in value at any one time the sum of fifty thousand dollars. AN ACT

TO CHANGE THE NAME OF THE "LADIES' AMERICAN HOME-EDUCATION SOCIETY AND TEMPERANCE UNION."

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in General Court assembled and by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1. The "Ladies' American Home Education Society and Temperance Union," a corporation established in Boston, under the provisions of Chapter two hundred and eleven of the acts of the year eighteen hundred and fifty, shall be known as the "Nickerson Home for Children," on and after the first day of April, eighteen

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage. Approved March 11, 1880.

FORM OF BEQUEST

I, A. B., do give and bequeath to the "Nickerson Home for Children," the sum for the use and benefit of said ofInstitution, to be applied by the Board of Managers thereof to the general object of the Home. And I do direct that a receipt, signed by the President and Treasurer shall be a sufficient discharge.

CONSTITUTION

This Home shall be called the Nickerson Home for ARTICLE 1. CHILDREN.

ARTICLE 2. Its object shall be to provide a home for destitute children, under fourteen years of age, from every part of New England, especially half orphans, when the home is suddenly broken up by death or other causes, where they can enjoy all the comforts of a well-regulated family, and be instructed, not only physically, but intellectually and religiously. For the privilege of such a home a small board will be required, which, although not enough for the child's support, will serve to give to parents the feeling that he or she is doing what they can for the support of their little ones. A limited number of children, which will be increased as our means permit, will be admitted to the Home free of charge. Parents or friends may visit the children at the Home, or may remove them from it whenever their circumstances will warrant their assuming their children's support.

Article 3. The payment at one time of twenty-five dollars shall

constitute a life membership.

ARTICLE 4. The officers of this Home shall be a President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer and Auditors, and sixteen Managers. Seven shall be chosen as Trustees, of whom the President, Secretary, and Treasurer shall constitute a part. At any regular meeting convened, any number of the officers and Managers present may be competent to proceed with the business in thirty minutes after the appointed hour, and five may constitute a quorum.

ARTICLE 5. It shall be the duty of the President, in concurrence with the Committee, to call all special meetings, and to preside at meetings of the Board of Managers, each of which is to be opened with In the absence of the President, one of the Vice-Presidents prayer.

shall preside,

ARTICLE 6. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a record of the meetings of the Board of Managers, and at each meeting for business, the record of the preceding meeting shall be read, and on special occasions the Secretary shall notify the members of the Board and shall assist in any other duties the Board of Managers may assign.

ARTICLE 7. The Treasurer shall keep an account of the money received and expended, and shall present the bills due against the Home at each meeting of the Board, to be approved by them and signed by the President, and the Treasurer shall give a written report to the Managers. Such assistance shall be allowed to the Treasurer in collecting of funds, etc., as the Board of Managers shall deem expedient.

ARTICLE 8. At each meeting it shall be the duty of the Superintendent to report to the Managers the number of children entered and

discharged during the month.

Article 9. There shall be an Annual Meeting held the first Thursday in January, at 3 o'clock, P.M., when the officers shall be chosen. These offices will only be held by the faithful discharge of their official duties. An annual Report of the Secretary and Treasurer shall be presented, the report from the Board of Managers read, vacancies upon the Board filled, and such other business transacted as shall come before them. Meetings of the Managers are held on the first Thursday of every month, at three o'clock, P.M.

ARTICLE 10. At each monthly meeting one Manager for each week during the month shall be appointed to inspect the Home, as regards furnishings, cleanliness, and sanitary conditions, and make

a verbal report of such inspection at the following meeting.

ARTICLE 11. Amendments may be made to this Constitution by a majority of the members present at the Annual Meeting.

SEVENTY FOURTH ANNUAL REPORT OF SECRETARY

The Managers of the Nickerson Home upon the threshhold of the year 1910 realize as never before the truth of the words sent forth by the children's friend, the poet, Longfellow—

"Round about what is, lies a whole mysterious world of

what might be!"

As a band of co-laborers in a grand humanitarian cause, they also realize the fact that anywhere and everywhere in very unlikely or unfavorable places, among the hedges or by-ways, in the slums or highways wherever there is work to be done for the Master there they should labor and the opportunity has come through the avenue of the Nickerson Home for Children, this being located at present right in the very heart of this throbbing work-a-day world.

And as for this world "of what might be" — that is only the vast region of opportunity which is ever open, not to individuals alone, but to all representative bodies, like the Nickerson Home — which stand for the physical, social, educational, and moral uplift of the less favored by heredity,

circumstances and environment in our midst.

Now if the conditions for carrying on such a work, as has been undertaken at the Nickerson Home were always favorable, then might the official board of this Home avail itself of the many and varied calls upon its limited resources for aid; but such is not the case. Lack of room, for one thing, keeps many a deserving one from our door; for in this very accommodating "Buss" there is not room at times for even "one more."

This thought then naturally suggests that the seating, standing and sleeping capacity of this small vehicle, called a "Home" had better be enlarged. This change of basal accommodations for the comfort of the inmates of the Home would necessitate more funds in the treasury; hence the lack of money is the chief condition which cramps the working power of the Executive Board of the Nickerson Home as it tries to carry on a two-fold work — that for the little ones within its walls as well as that for a charitably disposed public without.

Hence our appeal for more funds to enable us to get a larger and newer building, as we send out our Annual Report.

That money is also needed for the necessary repairs on an old building is another factor that has to be taken into the account as we send forth this annual message; for until a new building is secured we have to keep the old one in a good condition to insure both the comfort and health of its various inmates.

During the past year we have been called to bear the loss of one of our most devoted, faithful and efficient workers — Miss Carrie L. Boswell, active as one of the Vice-Presidents and Managers of the Official Board of the Nickerson Home for Children. Always at her post we shall not only miss her as a co-laborer in the good work at the Home, but its different inmates who had learned to love and welcome her during her thirty odd years of service will feel the great loss of her kindly presence in their midst equally as much.

Our Superintendent, Mrs. Lola Holway, ever cheerful in the active performance of her work at the Home, perhaps, as much as any one, will miss the kind counsel and loving interest in her various plans, for the well-being of the Domestic department, — which this patient Griselda always showed

during her frequent calls at the Home.

Its Inmates

The Home has cared for ninety-nine children during the

past year.

Everything has worked as harmoniously as could be expected in this little world of human possibilities, of which each child is a part, and is to be trained possibly through its very environment into the future peace-loving citizen of our Commonwealth.

There has been no serious illness during the year. One of our girls was given special care for a month at the Tyler Street Hospital connected with the Boston Dispensary on Bennett Street. This little girl was later placed on a farm for fresh air treatment.

We owe many thanks both to the physicians and nurses of this Dispensary for their faithful care of the children who have been in attendance there, at any time during the year.

We would also acknowledge with thanks the continued services of Dr. David D. Brough as house physician and those of Dr. James Patterson as dentist.

Donations

We would thankfully acknowledge the annual subscription of twenty dollars by the Old South Guild as well as the

five dollars sent by the Primary Department of the Park

Avenue Church, Arlington Heights.

We are also grateful for the still further donation of five dollars from the Woman's Guild of the Park Avenue Church, Arlington Heights.

We were kindly remembered at Easter with cards sent

by the Rev. D. W. Waldron of the H. M. S. of Boston.

The money sent for clothing for the children by Mr. William Armstrong of the Bromfield Street Sunday School, was quickly applied to its legitimate purposes and we would thankfully acknowledge the same.

Osborne also invited one of our girls to her home in Somerville for three weeks. Then Mrs. Williams of Dorchester gave a week's vacation to one of the girls. For each and all of these kind favors we are deeply grateful.
