2. Civil Education. Reference is made to Daily Bulletin Item, paragraph 3, a, Daily Bulletin No. 117, this headquarters, 20 July 1949, in which information on O.D. No. 64 and SCAPIN No. 1944 was given. Misunderstanding has arisen concerning this item. If SCAPIN 1944 is consulted, the misunderstanding will easily be cleared up. "Misuse of educational facilities" does not mean the use of auditoriums or classrooms for PTA or Information Committee meetings, for example. It means the actual occupancy of the buildings by other than educational agencies. Usually this means that during the War schools were occasionally vacated by the educational authorities and taken over by commercial interests. After the war, however, the school buildings should have been returned for educational use but were not. The above-mentioned SCAPIN 1944 directs that such buildings be turned back for educational use, and O.D. 64 gives Civil Affairs the surveillance function to ensure compliance of the Japanese. In addition, this most recent interpretation of O.D. 64 and SCAPIN 1944 means that in the cases where upper secondary schools, for example, vacate a building for purposes of consolidation of schools, the building is at the disposition of the board of education for educational use. Usually the best use of such schools is to help relieve the lower secondary school building shortage.

3. Public Welfare Officers: It is recommended that the information in PH & W Weekly Bulletin No. 132 on community chests be given to prefectural welfare officials in writing, and that it be carefully discussed with them. Keeping them out of control of the chests has been difficult because of the genuine concern on the part of both chest and prefectural officials that the chest drives would fail without their active participation. Perhaps welfare officers can help those concerned to analyze this fear through discussion of the factors that produce it. Understanding of these factors will lead to ways of succeeding with less reliance upon the officials.

4. Use of Official Passenger Vehicles. The attention of all commanders is directed to Messageform, Eighth Army, 13 July 1949, file AGGO 451, effective 1 August 1949. Reports required by paragraph 8 of above Messageform will be consolidated by Divisions and units and forwarded to arrive at Region Headquarters not later than the 3rd day following the expiration of the quarter. First report is due 3 October 1949 for the quarter 1 July - 30 September 1949, which requires immediate maintenance of adequate records. (E)

5. Wearing of New Type Chevrons. New type chevrons have not been received in the Far East Command. Present regulations governing the wearing of old type chevrons will govern until new type chevrons are received and general distribution through normal supply channels is available. Individuals are not authorized to wear new type chevrons secured from outside sources prior to normal issue. (AG)



2. Legal and Government Section: Reference is to letter to all teams from hq Kagawa C.A. Team subject: "Special Study of Local Procurators offices of Kagawa Prefecture", dated 15 July 1949. Inclosure 3 of this ltr (comparative figures on monthly basis, Jan-May 1949 as against Jan-May 1948, of cases handled by Procurator's offices under jurisdiction of Takamatsu District Procurator's Office) indicates that the present increase in the backlog of cases is seasonal and that the number of cases awaiting settlement will decrease toward the end of the year. L-G officers are requested to make similar comparisons. Should contrary evidence be found, L-G officers will report findings to this headquarters.

3. Civil Education Section:

a. Pertinent to the use of school buildings for purposes other than education, Eighth Army has informed this headquarters that SCAPIN 1944, AG 000.8 (22 Oct 45) CIE, 29 November 1948, subject: "Misuse of Public Educational Facilities," and O.D. No. 64, Headquarters Eighth Army, 22 December 1948, subject: "Misuse of Public Educational Facilities," are still in effect. This means that governors or other public agencies cannot use schools for anything but education. O.D. 64 also gives Civil Affairs units permission to implement SCAPIN 1944 to see that it is observed.

b. Attention of CE officers is drawn to letter, Hqs I Corps, AG 000.8-BA, 28 December 1948, subject: "I Corps Plan for the Organization of Adult Education Course," paragraph 9. This reference requires Civil Affairs team monthly activities report to contain statistical information on the progress of the Adult Education Course. To date, the required information has been somewhat erratic and I Corps has complained about it asking that team CE officers refer to and comply with letter mentioned above. This means that the information is wanted every month along the lines laid down by reference.

4. Labor Relations Officers: The following message was passed from I Corps to this headquarters for relay to CA Teams:

"Mr Dougherty, SCAP, states that there are a number of cases reported in which some companies are violating the Trade Union Law by loaning money to unions for an indefinite period to be paid to full time union officials. It is the opinion of SCAP and Dr. Suehiro, chairman of the CLRC, that it is an outright violation of the law and no different from paying union officials directly."

Labor Relations officers will be especially alert for such violations and will cause any violations to be brought to the attention of the proper authorities. Reports of violations will be communicated to this headquarters.



Civil Education: This headquarters has been notified by the Shikoku Branch of the Facilities Office of the Ministry of Education that a quantity of special (wired) window glass will soon be made available for schools only. At the instruction of SCAP, the ESB and the Ministry of Education are making this glass available to all schools in Japan. Reports are being sent to each school as to how they may obtain glass. They must tell the Prefectural Construction Section (Dobokubu Kenchikuka) how much glass they want. The Construction Section will then send schools tickets with which to buy glass from any glass dealer. However, before this the Construction Section will send a report to the Ministry of Education as to how much glass is needed. The glass will then be allocated to local areas according to demand and amount of glass available. The notification of the availability of this glass stressed the fact that there was not too much glass available and that if Shikoku schools wanted to take advantage of this opportunity they must not lose any time in making their wishes known. It is suggested that CE officers look into this situation and see that there is no breakdown in the administration of the system. CE officers might also encourage the Japanese to take advantage of this opportunity to get sufficient window glass for their schools.

2. Economic Section: The following information was received from I Corps  
Mil Govt Economic Division

a. Mil Govt Teams or custodians of reparation plants will not prepare or submit special reports on reparation plants upon the request or recommendation of SCAP field dispatchers, unless these reports are required by 8th Army OD's.

b. When errors are discovered in reports which are submitted as required by OD's, appropriate corrective action will be made.

3. Legal-Government: Capt RUSSELL, PSD, G-2, SCAP, will visit all teams between the period of 21 Feb and 10 Mar to coordinate operation of MP and NRP.

4. Civil Education:

a. At the Shikoku CE Officers' Conference, 3-4 March, CE officers will be asked to report briefly on boards of education and secretariats and on reorganization of the school system with special reference to upper and lower secondary schools. Allocation of time for reports is ten minutes for boards of education and secretariats and five minutes for reorganization of the school system. However, if necessary, more time can be allotted to either subject. It is suggested that CE officers bring with them all necessary written material pertinent to such reports. This material would include 1949 budgets, structure of the secretariat, and school survey facts and figures.

b. The conference for assistants to CE officers will be held as scheduled on 24-25 February. Disregard any previous word as to the cancellation of conference or shortening of it. Assistants to CE officers, before they come to conference, should have read and studied the new pamphlet, "Techniques of Democracy," the pamphlets, "Discussion - A Technique of Democracy" and "Panel Discussion," prepared by this headquarters, and "Democratic Organizations" and "Committees and Programs in Democratic Organizations," prepared by CIE SCAP. Particular study should be given to the first two pamphlets mentioned. It is emphasized that without this preliminary study it will be impossible to achieve the objectives of the conference. There will be no time to explain every small point in the very large fields to be discussed. Considerable background on the part of assistants will be necessary.

3. Civil Information: Increased Rice Production. Tokushima Prefecture has already organized 9 teams to show the Baloptican Kami-shibai of "Hachi-San and Increased Rice Production," at least twice in every village between 1-30 April. The program was arranged jointly by the Information Section, Agricultural Extension Section and the Agricultural Experiment Station. A preliminary conference, demonstration lecture and briefing will be held on 27 March.

4. CE Section: Attention of CE officers is particularly drawn to Parts II and III of the Ministry of Education publication, "Curriculum of the New Upper Secondary Schools." These two sections are probably the best material which can be used by CE officers and the Japanese in working on reorganization of the school system with particular reference to the upper secondary school. For practical guidance of both CE officers and Japanese educational authorities, pages 1-3 of Part III are especially good. In addition, pages 5-11 of Hatsugaku No. 534, "Handbook on Preparatory Steps for the Organization of the New Upper Secondary School," are very pertinent to the upper secondary school reorganization now under way on Shikoku. The first publication mentioned should be in Japanese hands now or very soon, and CE officers should check to see that Japanese educational officials - especially superintendents of education and boards of education - have it and Hatsugaku No. 534 and are studying and using both documents. (If CE officers themselves do not have any of this material in English, this headquarters should be notified immediately.)

2. Troop Information Report: Teams will submit Troop Information Reports so as to reach Region Headquarters not later than the 1st day of each month.

4. Civil Education: The following information has been received from I Corps.

a. Dr. Loomis, CI&E, SCAP, will make a recommendation to the Ministry of Education that, in the possible revision of the Board of Education Law or supplementing Government ordinances thereto, boards of education be set up in districts which can support a twelve-grade school system. Special districts possibly larger than gun (possibly smaller, too) will be set up. These may be selected by prefectural boards of education for the purpose of setting up local boards of education. These district units must have comprehensive programs. Military Government should not encourage any local school boards this year. In fact, they should be discouraged. Except for the last two sentences, this is for information only and is not directive in nature.

b. Due to many misunderstandings with regard to the Board of Education Law, CI&E, SCAP has given the interpretation that there should be no bu (部) in the secretariats of prefectural boards of education. Instead, there should be only ka (課). In addition, guidance and research sections, called for by the Law, do not have to be ka but can be part of ka.

c. The Japanese in some prefectures have been misinterpreting the Educational Public Service Law, 12 January 1949, Item 31, as an order to keep all present personnel at present salaries and present jobs. Dr. Loomis, CI&E, SCAP, says that this article was effective only in the immediate transfer of the entire education department from the governor's control to the board of education. The board of education can transfer personnel within the secretariat or in the schools or between secretariat and schools as they see fit according to present needs.

d. Mr. M. Orr, Chief of Education Division, CI&E, SCAP, is "upset about Capt Dupel's, Tokyo MGT CE Officer, release to newspapers regarding student strikes." CI&E SCAP is studying the problem. The present policy is: Settling of student strikes should be left up to the administration of private schools and to boards of education or superintendents of education.
