PANORAMA EXHIBITION.

City of Paris, the Capital of the Kingdom of France is now exhibited in the building on the public square of Rampart street.

The view is taken from the roof of the south end of the palace of the Tuilleries; the spectator must therefore immagine himself pleaced on this elevated situation which commands in extensive prospect over the whole city.

Immediately under the eye of the spectator in a sorthern direction, is the roof of the King's apparements, and on the right that of the long picture gallery stretching each per dan for as the Louvie; -This gallery hands the place de Caousel on the south mide and the new gallery on the north, in the centre of this square is seen the stiusephel arch. On this square Banaparte was wont to review his botalliens previous to their departure for their respective despine. ms, and here oft the walls resulted ed with the clang of martial munic. On the west side of the palace the mecantor books down on the Garden of the Tucleries, and beyond that in the die mace is seen the palace of the Garde de Meubles, and the woods of the Champ Elystes in the distance.
