NOTICE.—The New Orleans and Carrollton railroad company, now in full operation, will be continuing the police regulations of the Parish of Jefferson, a large number of which are planned to run along their road, which have already caused some trouble and are still causing considerable damage to the road and the citizens on both sides of the line.

Being on the eve of starting the Legislature, it is proposed that the same will remain from this time forward, and will not stop to a stop. The company may, if necessary, put a stop to the road by their charter, section 11, to prevent the road against all injuries whatever, and wishing at the same time to prevent the occurrence of accidents, hereby notify the owners of cattle, that after the publication of the present, all such animals which shall be found upon the road from the lower limit of the parish of Jefferson to Carrollton, shall be taken up and conducted to the depot assigned for that purpose in conformity with articles 33, 34 and 35 of the original charter.

The parish authorities are requested to note that it is extremely dangerous to travel upon the road, either on horseback or in any vehicle whatever, within the limits comprised by the parish boundaries, within the limits comprised by the boundaries of the board.
