Cannas should be planted in good, rich garden soil, mixed with half of old, rotten stable manure. Water sparingly for first two weeks after planting. Whell growing freely, water liberally. Set the plants 18 inches apart each way, and if more than one kind is to be used, be careful to plant the taller growing kinds in the center and the dwarf ones along the edge. This applies to planting in beds.
