At the prices quoted the right of selection of Fruits, Plants, &c., is reserved, but the choice of the purchaser shall be adhered to as nearly as practicable. In no case will long lists of selected varieties be supplied at wholesale rates, but the usual discount allowed from retail prices.

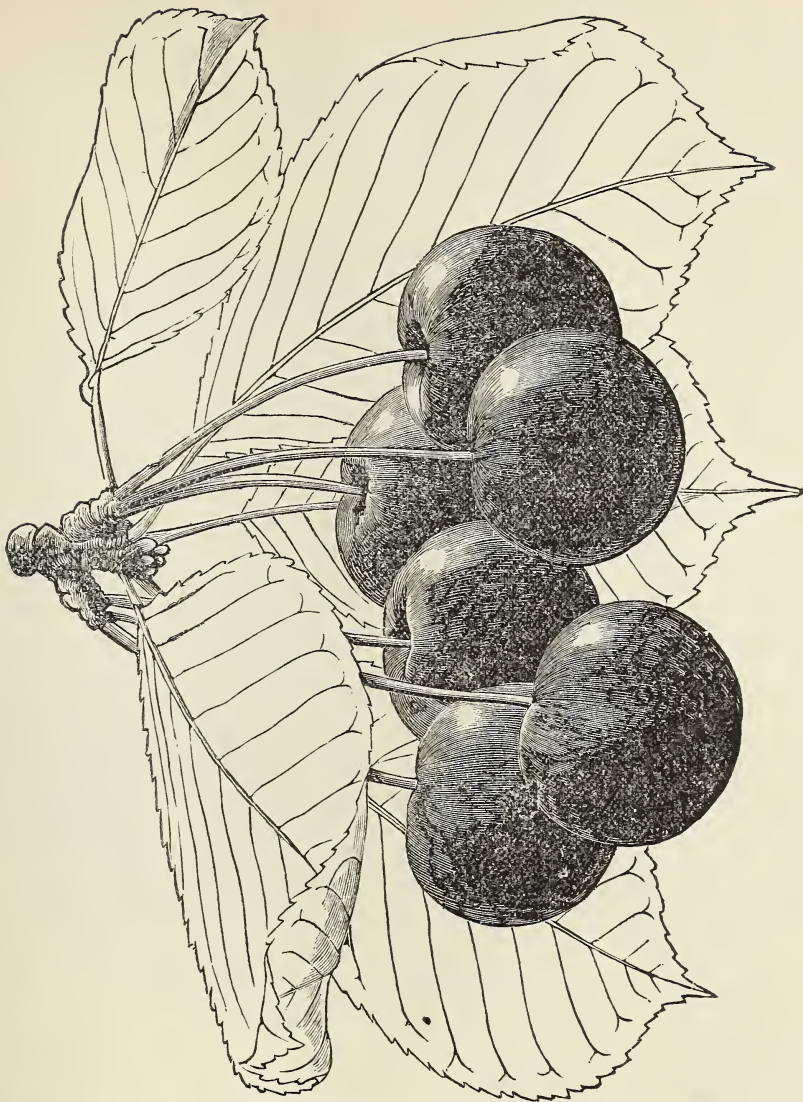

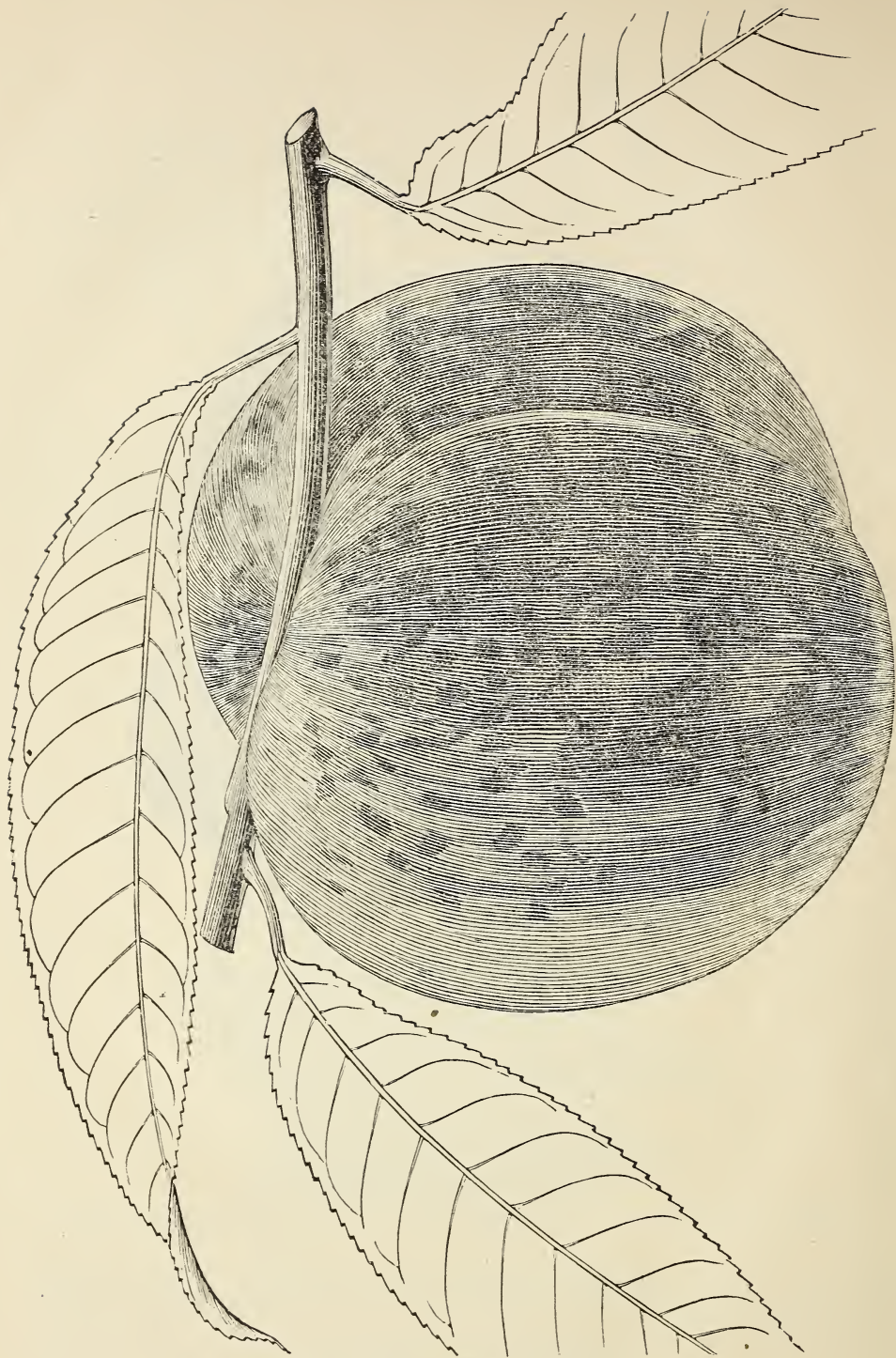

THIS noble Cherry was introduced into England by Mr. Rivers under the name of Bigarreau Noir de Schmidt, who has not been able to trace its history beyond the Société Van Mons, of Belgium, from which he received it. It is by far the largest of all the Black Bigarreau Cherries.

As will be seen from our engraving, the fruit is produced in clusters, and is of a large size, round and somewhat oblate. The skin is of a deep black color, and there is a large style mark on the apex. The stalk is stout, 2 inches long, and rather deeply inserted; flesh dark, tender, and very juicy, with a fine flavor. The stone is very small for the size of the fruit.
