BUILDING OCCUPIED BY THE CONSOLIDATED PORTRAIT & FRAME COMPANY "THE COMPANY THAT HELPS AGENTS"

This cut shows the building occupied by Consolidated Portrait & Frame Company, located at 1029-31-33-35West Adams Street, near Morgan. The building is three stories' and basement, $81\frac{1}{2}$ feet wide by 125 feet long, stands upon a lot $81\frac{1}{2}$ feet by 190 feet, thus giving a large shipping yard in the rear. The building was planned by us and was built to fit the "Consolidated." Each floor contains 10,125 square feet of space, or, counting the four floors, make nearly one acre under roof.


The material is brick and Georgia Pine and is known as a mill constructed building, which is slow combustion in the event of fire. Every inch of space in this building was planned for a particular purpose and renders it the most convenient and most economically operated portrait building in the world. The courts on the sides admit light, and the building facing the street, running through to an alley, gives ample light to the ends, therefore there is not a dark spot in this great building, an important factor in our line of business.

The building is equipped with all modern appliances, electric elevator, electric motors for operating the box-making machinery, air pump or air compressor, has electric and gas light, steam heated throughout and has every convenience that would facilitate the handling of our business, two mammoth fireproof vaults, 10x12x12 feet, in which are kept pictures until entered, and all documents, books, etc.

The location of this building is such that we are convenient to all or nearly all the freight offices; the express companies have their wagons call at our door almost hourly, delivering packages from all parts of the United States.

HOW TO REACH US FROM DOWNTOWN OR FROM THE PRINCIPAL PASSENGER STATIONS— We are located on West Adams Street. The electric cars on West Adams Street reach the heart of the city going to State and Adams Streets, and pass our door going west. The electric cars on West Madison Street come within two short blocks of our place. The Metropolitan and Lake Street elevated trains come within a few blocks of our building. The electric cars on Harrison and Van Buren streets are only a few blocks away, therefore, when in Chicago it would be easy to reach us by any of the ways named. Merely tell the conductor that you want to get off at the "Consolidated."





GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

The following rules govern shipments, terms, and all business transactions with us. Read carefully and avoid any misunderstanding. No goods shipped unless the rule relating to that shipment has been complied with. We have numbered these rules for the sake of convenience and ask you to read them well and often.

Freight Shipments

RULE Will be made in our name; or in other words, to
Consolidated Portrait & Frame Co. We notify you when goods are shipped and endorse the Bill of Lading to you so that the railroad agent will deliver the goods when it is presented. In calling for freight ask in the name of the Consolidated Portrait & Frame Co. Our reasons for shipping in our name are first: To get better freight rates; second, to insure you against fraud and thieves, who are ever alert to make trouble by claiming to be you or your representative, thus depriving you of your shipment.

Freight C. O. D. Shipments

RULE Will be made as follows: When goods are ordered shipped by freight and are not paid for in full, the 2 bill of lading with draft attached, drawn for the amount of c. o. d. or balance due, will be sent to Bank for collection at the town to which the goods were shipped. If there is no Bank the bill of lading will be sent in a package c. o. d. by express for the balance due. Now bear in mind that you must have bill of lading to get a freight shipment, and it will always be at the bank or express office. Pay out the bill of lading first, and then present it to the freight agent as directed in Rule No. 1. After paying out bill of lading, no other payments except freight charges will have to be paid. The first thing for you to do is to get the bill of lading. When goods are paid for in full bill of lading will be sent direct to you, to the town where the goods were shipped, unless otherwise instructed.

Express and Mail Shipments

RULE Will be sent in your name. Now remember, in asking
for mail or express to inquire in your own name. For freight shipments see Rule No. 1.

Bills of Lading

RULE For all freight shipments must be presented to the
freight agent before goods will be delivered. No
Bill of Lading needed for mail or express shipments.

Our Responsibility Ceases

- RULE When goods are delivered in good condition to trans-
- 5 portation companies. We get a bill of lading or receipt which shows goods were in good order when delivered. All mail packages or shipments by mail

are sent at owner's risk. We under no circumstances make good packages lost in the mail.

RULE When the purchase amounts to \$10.00 or more. For amounts less we charge 50 cents, the actual amount it costs us. This rule applies to all shipments requiring the use of boxes and crates. Drayage in all cases free.

Credit to All Honest Agents

RULE We extend a line of credit of \$25.00 to \$1,000 to all honest men and women, allowing 30 days' time on each shipment before payment. If agents stand well at home and can prove that they do, we cheerfully accommodate them for any amount up to \$1,000. This plan allows delivery before payment of goods, and permits any honest man to go into the picture business without capital. (See plan fully explained by Rule 20). A "letter of credit" properly prepared for your signature sent free for the asking. See copy on page 221.

Credit Given All

RULE Who are rated in the commercial agencies, or who
8 furnish Chicago references showing they are entitled to credit. If not rated, see Rules 9 and 20.

Terms to All Not Commercially Rated

Rule Or who do not use letter of credit. All orders
amounting to \$10.00 or less must be accompanied by the cash in full; more than \$10.00 and less than \$25.00, half the amount, and goods will be shipped c. o. d. for the balance; \$25.00 and more, one-third cash, and goods will be sent c. o. d. for the balance. No other terms acceptable.

About Remitting

RULE Please remit as follows: First, send postal money
order. Second, express money order. Third, New York or Chicago exchange. Fourth, registered letter. If you send money by registered mail, always send bills, and not silver if possible to avoid it. Fifth, don't send personal checks. We have to pay from 10 to 25 cents to get them cashed. We hold all orders until personal checks are cashed, which often requires ten to fifteen days.

Our Portrait Guarantee

RULE Our guarantee covers likeness and workmanship of portraits made in Grades 7, 9, 12, 15, 17, 19, and 20. We do not guarantee portraits made in Grade 4 or Albumens, Bronnides, groups of three heads or more, too dim or badly defaced pictures. We do not guarantee or allow credit for portraits made from corpse pictures, nor when radical changes are made, such as removing hats, putting on a coat, changing style of hair, "dressing up the picture," making drapery modern when in original it is old style, or when any changes are made likely to alter the appearance of

the portrait. Refused or rejected portraits, if covered by guarantee, may be returned for credit any time within 90 days.

Entire portrait, unframed, must be returned by express with all charges paid.

Make list of each grade and kind showing lot number and price charged you.

Credit for rejects will not be allowed on shipments already made—neither will they be credited on frame orders.

Portraits returned for re-work must be accompanied by small picture and not be defaced or soiled.

Quality According to Grade

RULE All portraits will be made in the grade ordered.
12 Circumstances often govern the grade; that is, in some localities a cheap portrait answers all purposes, while in others the best is none too good. The party taking the order can determine this point better than anyone else, because the facts can be had while on the ground. In order to meet these conditions we have several grades, each finished according to the amount of money paid for it. A clothier has suits for \$5.00, \$7.50, \$15.00 and \$30.00. The \$5.00 snit answers one man's purpose, the \$15.00 another, and the \$30.00 still another. In some cases the cheap grade answers, in others the medium, and to satisfy some the best; hence, we supply just what is wanted.

Now remember, all pictures will be made according to grade ordered. If you pay for lean, we give you lean; if you want fat and pay for it, we give you fat, the best for the money. No honest house can sell one dollar's worth for 50 cents. Remember this.

Free Samples

RULE We agree to furnish free samples, and are very glad to do so, for each one sent out means more business. Now these samples are free, but to protect ourselves against those who would order just because they are free, we are obliged to require a small deposit as an evidence of good faith. When your sales have amounted to ten times the price paid for samples we cheerfully refund the amount, thus making them free, but this does not mean that samples will be given every time sales amount to \$10.00; neither will refunds be made until the \$10.00 is paid for portraits and not frames.

To Those Who Are Commercially Rated

Or who work upon the letter of credit plan (fully

explained by rule 20), samples are furnished without the deposit. All samples so furnished, or after amount deposited has been refunded, remain **our property** and must be returned after you stop working for us. We send out **no cheap**, **clumsy samples**.

Much Care is Given to Samples

And suitable carrying cases, etc. Subjects that make fine portraits are used. We send no samples that are not truly artistic, because the first impression is the lasting one. Yet the samples are a fair representation of our work. So in getting sample outfits from us rest assured that nothing but up-to-date goods go out. Always the newest and best. For the convenience of our customer, we furnish two portrait outfits, each suited to a special purpose.

We Have Original Pictures

Of many noted persons in the Unitel States, which are especially suitable for samples. We, therefore, furnish these subjects when supplying samples. If customers insist on furnishing their own subjects, they may do so, but the regular wholesale price will be charged.

How to Send Small Pictures

RULE The postal officials of Chicago (as they have a perfect right to do under the law) open every package that does not bear letter postage. To save the possible loss or misplacement of pictures by having the package opened at the postoffice, we advise that if the package contains any writing whatever, that you have the postmaster weigh it and put letter postage on it. Unless it is thus stamped, we can not be responsible for loss of your small pictures.

We reproduce below a copy of gummed label which, if pasted onto a package containing small pictures intended for us, entitles you to a rate of 10 cents for $1\frac{1}{2}$ pounds or less. Shipments of this kind go under what is known to the Express Company as "Section D." In order to obtain "Section D" rates the charges must be prepaid. If the package weighs more than $1\frac{1}{2}$ pounds there will be an additional charge of 8 cents per pound or one cent for every two ounces. Do not fail to send small pictures by express and insist upon the express agent receiving them at "Section D" rates.

About Writing Up Small Pictures

- RULE Experienced picture men as a rule need no instruc-
- 15 tions to guide them in preparing small pictures for the house. Still much confusion often arises on account of originals being incorrectly prepared, leaving us to guess at what is wanted, etc. New men should observe this rule closely and study the instructions until they are perfectly familiar.

We reproduce here two envelopes filled in, showing how each original should be prepared. Always stick an envelope on to each original, and carefully fill in each space as shown by figures "A" and "B."

How to Write Up Small Pictures

See "figure A." In the first line "kind of picture" always state kind wanted, whether crayon, sepia, pastel or oil. "How many copies," here say how many you wish from that particular picture; if one, two or ten are wanted. If you don't we make one only, as we can not guess at it. "What size". Don't fail to say what size is wanted. It may be 8x10, 14x17 or 25x30. You know. We don't. So be sure to say in all cases. Unless you do, we hold the original until the information can be had, thus delaying the order. "What grade." There are several grades in each kind of work. We can not guess at it; so please always say which grade you want. "Color of eyes." State the color here. Color of hair. Be careful to say what color the hair is. Send sample if you can get it; put into the envelope or paste onto back of small pictures. "Complexion." State whether fair, rosy or dark. "Color of dress etc." If water color, pastel or oil is wanted, state color of drapery here. If crayon, sepia or albumen, this is unnecessary.

"Remarks". If anything special is desired, or if additional instructions are to be given, state it here. If the picture wanted is in a group of two or more, say one of X only, bust; or three of X only, full figure, as the case may be. "Ordered by." These lines are for your information. The name of party giving the order with street and town should be written in here, but no state.

"What is the catalogue No. of frame you want?" Please state the number of frame here. If none is wanted say "none." The lines below this are for our use. Don't write on them. **Leave your name** off the envelope. Don't seal it.

'Figure B' shows an envelope prepared for a crayon portrait. There is no difference between "Figure A" and "Figure B" except color of eyes, hair and dress. No colors are shown on crayon, sepia and albumen. See catalogue, page 8. Use our envelopes—all you need furnished free."

Adding to an Order Already in the House

- RULE It requires just as much time to make picture one
 - 16 time as another, and every time you send pictures to be added to a lot sent at a previous time, it delays the shipment fully ten days for each addition made. We accommodate our patrons by doing these things, but extra time in all cases must be given in which to make shipments. It's better not to send additional pictures; save them for the next order; if you do send them make allowance for extra time.

Portraits ordered shipped by mail will cost 25c extra for packing for the first one and 5c for each additional.

Small Orders

RULE Are always appreciated and receive the same careful and painstaking attention that large ones do, but it don't pay you to send them. One picture and frame requires a box and costs just as much freight as ten pictures and frames, because transportation companies charge for 100 pounds if the shipment weighs only ten pounds. We charge fifty cents for boxing one picture and frame. Therefore send enough pictures to get the advantage of the freight and box paid for.

Order Blanks

RULE Should accompany each and every order, no matter how small or large. Order blanks are furnished free. Much pains should be taken in filling order blanks. If goods are wanted by freight, say so. If you want the goods by express, don't fail to state it. A shipment containing frames should not go by express, and it is impossible to send it by mail. If the goods are not paid in full, state to what bank you want bill of lading sent; if freight shipment (see Rule No. 2), state how much money you send and when goods are wanted, allowing from 10 to 15 days to get them to you.

Always sign your name, and give railroad town to which goods are to be sent. Also give postoffice to which you wish mail sent. Never fail to sign your name to all letters you write, and to give your postoffice and state. We receive thousands of letters, and can not guess at names.

When ordering portraits and frames, list frames on order blank. We do not take list from envelopes unless you so instruct.

Substitution

- RULE In filling orders we shall follow your instructions to
 19 the letter, unless in our judgment we shall deem it advisable to substitute so as to ship goods more promptly. In all cases where substitutions are made, we give as good or better value for the money. It frequently happens that a shipment could be made
 - from one to ten days sooner by giving an article which in appearance and quality is just as good, rather than hold the entire order waiting, perhaps, for one frame to be made. If you won't permit us to make these slight changes, say on your order "Don't substitute."

Letter of Credit Plan---Fully Explained

RULE In order to accommodate the many worthy agents, and to show that we are in deep sympathy with all 20 those who are trying to advance in business, we have inaugurated what we term a "thirty days' credit plan," by which it is possible for an honest, straightforward agent to secure credit for thirty days for all reasonable sums, in order that deliveries may be made before paying for the goods. It is possible under this system to employ sub-agents, for the reason that work can be supplied and a commission received on all sales, which in the course of a year's time would amount to a great many dollars. It is also possible, under this system, to operate a large crew, to employ good canvassers, and to reap the profit derived from their sales.

We have inaugurated this plan for the benefit of honest agents, and find that it works well and is very satisfactory. The old system of shipping goods c. o. d., requiring part of the money in advance, placed an agent with his limited capital at great disadvantage. For instance: If he is making a canvassing tour and has only a small amount of money to begin with, his ready cash is used in expenses; by the time his goods are ready to deliver he has nothing with which to pay his bill. We have known a great many instances where goods were shipped, and where it was utterly impossible for the agent to raise the money with which to pay the c. o. d. As a consequence the goods remained in depot until the time of delivery was past, and when he finally secured the money the goods could not be delivered, and resulted in a total loss. He not only lost the original amount of money invested, but had lost all chance of regaining that money by having delivery delayed so long that the customers would not accept the goods when offered. We simply illustrate this one point to show that, under the plan of buying goods on thirty days' time you have the advantage of ready capital and are in a position to do a large and profitable business without having much money to commence with.

Another important feature of the "thirty days' credit plan" is that you will not be delayed by loss of bills of lading. You have been in the picture business long enough to know that many times the original bill of lading can not be found; that you are forced to remain in a certain town a number of days or weeks, until all possibility of making a successful delivery had passed. It is to overcome these drawbacks of the picture business that we have inaugurated this well-known system of ours to assist the honest and worthy agent.

In view of all these many advantages, we think it only right and just to require some evidence of good faith on part of our friends, and as such we ask them to sign what we term a "letter of credit." This is filled out by us and will be forwarded for your signature and those of two of your friends who are financially responsible and whom we can accept as security for you. After this has been done, we will ship all the goods you need and allow thirty days' time to pay for them. In having the "letter of credit" signed, be sure to select two people whom you know to be financially responsible, as we always make careful investigation before accepting security given. If possible, give the name of a bank at which the sureties are known, or have the bank sign the "letter of credit." However, if that is not practicable, have two of your friends sign it.

We believe that you will agree that this plan is an "open door" to success. You can readily understand that it is possible to do a large and profitable business if you have a credit with some substantial house, by which it would be possible to have any quantity of goods shipped, so that you collect the money before paying for the goods.

Odd Size Frames

RULE We cut and make to order odd size frames from any moulding shown on pages 100 to 129, but no other.
Sample outfit, fully described on page 194, furnished for only \$1.00. You can do a big business in odd sizes with this outfit.

Remittances of Letter of Credit Men

RULE Letter of Credit customers are entitled to 30 days
from date of invoice before paying for goods. The object of a Letter of Credit is to enable an agent to do business without capital; to receive goods free of C. O. D.; to have an opportunity to realize something before forced to pay for goods, etc. This accomplished the Letter of Credit has served its mission. Many deliveries are made long before the 30 days have expired. Your plain duty is to remit immediately whether you have had one day or 30, because the object of the Letter of Credit has been realized.

Money owed others is a dangerous thing, for instance many men go wrong because of good intentions. The delivery has been made; the bill is not due; 10 or 15 days remain in which to pay; misfortune overtakes the agent or his family; temptation to drink, to gamble, to speculate presents itself; the money justly due the house is lost, spent or stolen; the bill is now due; no money to meet it, what is the outcome? Your good friends, who trusted you are forced to make good the amount squandered in a questionable indulgence.

Pay the moment you get the money, then you are safe.

Important Notice to Beginners

Almost every mail brings us letters asking one or more of the following questions. We like to get letters from our customers, but can save time and postage for you as well as for ourselves by giving a full answer here. It will be well for you to read them over carefully,

- Ouestion No. 1. "Do you want Agents?"
- Answer. Yes, everywhere. You can clear from three to five dollars daily taking orders for our goods.
- Question No. 2. "Do you pay a salary and expenses?"
- Answer. No, we do not. The nature of the agency business is such that no business house could afford to do so. Besides it pays you better to get all you make, and not be forced to divide with us. Also if you earn a salary for us, you can earn it for yourself and be your own boss meanwhile. Misleading advertisements often promise big salaries, but generally mean commission. It pays to work for yourself and not for someone else.
- Question No. 3. "How much commission do you allow for selling your goods?"
- Answer. We sell the goods to you at a certain price, and you sell them for what the circumstances will permit. We do not attempt to regulate your commissions. No one knows as well as you how much profit should be added to the goods, because you are on the ground and can judge better than we. We suggest that a reasonable profit be charged; that is, an article that cost you \$1.00 should sell for \$2.00 to \$2.50, depending upon the competition. If a portrait and frame cost you \$1.50, a good sale and a reasonable profit would be \$3.98. Still a half loaf beats none, and rather than miss a sale, make less profits. Circumstances always regulate the prices.
- Question No.4. "Will you give me 30 days' credit on goods?" Answer. Yes. Glad to. See Rule 20.
- Question No. 5. "Do you want a deposit on each order?"
- Answer. Yes, unless you are rated commercially, or give us a "letter of credit." We do not give you credit on references. If you have friends who will recommend you, they will sign a "letter of credit" for you. See Rule 20. Goods will not be sent c. o. d. without deposit. See Rule 9.
- Question No. 6. "Are your portraits guaranteed to deliver?"
- Answer. Yes. See Rule 11.
- Question No. 7. "Do you take back frames?"
- Answer. No. You can use them on your next order. Order less the second time, making allowances for the ones left over. Or, better still, al.vays keep sheet pictures on hand and sell them in the frames refused mor left over, to merchants, furniture dealers, or any one who wants them, at reduced prices.

Question No. 8. "Do you furnish free samples?" Answer. Yes. Fully explained under Rule 13.

- Question No. 9. "Will you make samples from my small pictures?"
- Answer. No, not free, and yes, if you will pay the regular wholesale price. See Rule 13.
- Question No. 10. "Will you give back the price paid for samples?"
- Answer. Yes, when your sales for portraits have amounted to ten times the cost of the samples. See Rule 13.
- Question No. 11. "How long will it take to fill orders?"
- Answer. Generally fifteen days for portraits. If you order other goods two or three days. If you order odd size frames it takes longer.
- Ouestion No. 12. "Do you ship frames and pictures together?"
- Answer. Yes, if you request it. If portraits and frames are ordered, we clean the glass, fit the portraits into the frames, and ship together.
- Question No. 13. "Do you pay express or freight charges on shipments?"
- Answer. No. There is nothing gained by so doing. Express and freight rates are no more from your town to Chicago than from Chicago to your town; hence we do not prepay transportation charges.

Question No. 14. "How do I know you are reliable?"

- Answer. See page 1 of our catalogue, and write to our references. Send stamp for answer. Besides, we have been in business over fifteen years, and have customers who have been with us the entire time. We must treat them right; don't you think so? We could not deceive them all the time.
- Oustion No. 15. "If I give "letter of credit" how do I know but that you will ship goods not ordered?"
- Answer. The letter of credit is not binding for any goods you do not order. It reads "If 'so and so' orders, goods, etc." If you don't order we could not force you to pay for them. We do not resort to such methods. Unless we can do business in an honest, honorable way, we prefer not to do any. Our long record speaks for itself.
- Question No. 16. "If I give good references will you ship goods on credit?"

Answer. No. See Rule 7.

- Question No. 17. "Do you make odd-size frames?"
- Answer. Yes. Any size from all patterns of moulding shown on pages 100 to 129.
- Question No. 18. "Do you furnish printed matter free?"
- Answer. Yes, such as envelopes, order blanks, etc., but nothing more.
- Question No. 19. "Do you charge for boxing?"
- Answer. Yes. See Rule 6.

Enlarged Portrait Department, or

Department of Finished Pictures

We wish to call special attention to this department. It is one of the vital departments of a well regulated portrait company and one, we regret to say, that is neglected by a great many concerns calling themselves copying houses. This department is run by competent people and is a credit to us as will be testified to by more than ten thousand happy, prosperous agents who have patronized this house in the past few years. We feel pardoned for emphasizing the fact that we are one of the largest concerns of its kind in existence and that this position has been gained solely and purely by honest, faithful, painstaking dealings.

A portrait company is more than an ordinary business enterprise. It is custodian for thousands upon tens of thousands of valuable pictures, many of which could not be replaced, if lost, and which to the owner are valuable and sacred. That is why we have provided such great facilities, not only for the handling with despatch of enlarged pictures, but the safekeeping of them. Our checking system is so perfect that it is almost impossible to lose a picture once it is in our possession.

The Kind of Subjects or Originals We Enlarge

We undertake to copy all kinds of small pictures, photographs, tin-types, daguerreotypes, kodak pictures, pictures from groups and in fact, any and all kinds. We do not claim to be able to make a firstclass portrait from any original, but if it can not be copied successfuly will be returned to the party sending it. We copy and enlarge small pictures to any size desired, from 8x10 up to as large as might be wanted. We can take one picture from a group; we can take any number of small pictures and make them into a group; we can make a bust portrait from a full figure; we can copy the original just as it appears on the card. We can change the drapery, the style of hair or make any alterations desired when it is thought best to do so. It is not wise to make changes for reasons explained in the first part of this book, but we will undertake to do so when ordered.

The Kind of Portraits We Make

We make every portrait known to the art world. Our specialty is Crayons, Sepias, Pastels, Water Colors, French Water Colors, Sepiaoles, Albumens, Bromides, Oils, Pearls, Emeralds and Rubies. We will make any kind of a portrait that is on the market. If our agents find a portrait of any kind bearing a name not enumerated herein and will send one of the enlargements to us, we will make as good or better than the one sent. There are many names given to enlarged pictures which mean nothing to anyone except the company or party making them, therefore, a picture bearing some peculiar name unknown might be a standard portrait.

Grades and Why They are Needed

We show in this catalogue, as you will observe by the following illustrations, five grades of portraits, that is to say, we make five grades in each and every kind of work except the Pearl. The grades are fully described and beautifully illustrated, but a word here as to why it is necessary to have grades might be in keeping with our purpose. We regret to say that the grade question or the grade system has been one in which much fraud has been practiced upon the unsuspecting public. Grades to a great many portrait companies and especially to those of no responsibility, are merely a pretext or an excuse for selling a cheap article at a high price. Fifteen years of practical experience in this business has taught us that, although frauds have existed in the grade system, it is absolutely necessary, for the well-being and for the successful operation of the canvasser, to have them. We can better illustrate this by saying that all well regulated commercial concerns, in all parts of the world, display goods of different grades at different prices intended to supply the wants of different customers.

A hat may be purchased for the sum of 50c, another for \$1.00, another for \$3.00 and up to \$10.00, or as many dollars as one would care to put in an article of that kind.

A suit of clothes may be had for \$3.00, \$5.00, \$10.00 and \$50.00. A watch may be purchased for \$1.00, \$10.00 or \$100.00 and so on. The cheap article answers the purpose of one purchaser, the medium of a second, but there are many who purchase the best. It is nonsense to think that there is no difference between a hat that costs 50c and one that costs \$5.00. It would be silly to think that a watch that costs \$1.00 would be as good as an Elgin or Waltham that might cost \$25.00. It then follows that a portrait that costs 50c can not be as good as one that costs 75c and would in no sense compare with one that costs \$1.50. It is then plain that if the house is honest, there must be an honest difference between the grades of portraits.

The cheap portraits will answer many purposes and, in fact, are made and sold by the thousands. **The country, however, has been "worked overtime."** so to speak, with cheap portraits. The cheap picture has been the medium through which the faker has reaped his greatest reward. **The agent who expects** to build up a thriving business and one that will pay him a profit from time to time should not be taken in by the cheap portrait. He should realize that a standard picture of a medium price will yield him more profit in the end than any other kind.

Department of Inspection

After hearing the experience of hundreds and even thousands of wide-awake, practical picture men and after our own experience in delivering pictures in most every State in the Union, we were convinced that a well regulated portrait company should establish a Department of Inspection. Acting upon this conviction we put into force this department about four years ago and can truthfully say that it has saved this house and our agents thousands upon thousands of dollars besides the great satisfaction given those who were kind enough to favor our agents with an order. We have in the Department a man who delivered pictures a great number of years. He is thoroughly practical in every sense of the word. His sole mission is to see that each and every picture, before it leaves the studio, has been made in accordance with the instructions and that the likeness is sure and absolute. If the portrait does not pass the proper inspection it is turned back to the artist who made it with the defects pointed out and remedied before it leaves our institution. It is plainly apparent to anyone that this system saves annoyances and losses.

Rejected Portraits and the Cause that Makes the Loss

The practical agents know what a great loss it is to have a picture refused. It costs just as much money, time and trouble to take orders that do not deliver as it does for the one that does. The causes that lead to these losses are many. We can not prevent all losses. That would be a foolish statement.

Losses occur from poor workmanship, the lack of proper inspection, the failure of the artists to follow instructions and the loss of likeness. Many are refused because the party ordering is not prepared to pay for the picture when it is offered for delivery. We might say before closing this paragraph that a great many causes for the non-delivery are due to delayed shipments.

All agree that a delay is more harmful than anything that could possibly happen to an order. The customer, after giving up all hope of receiving the picture or having been disappointed two or three times, spends the money laid aside for the portrait, and when the deliveryman presents it, has nothing with which to pay and naturally and logically finds an excuse why it should not be paid. So, it follows that it is just as necessary to ship goods on time as it is to make the picture right. Our records show that we do not delay one order in a hundred. We positively will not delay them, if the fault is ours. We would rather ship goods at a loss to ourselves than to have our friends and customers say they we caused them to lose money by not getting goods to them on time.

Artists and How They are Managed

We employ the best artists that can be found in this city or in any other city. We pay as good or better wages than the average portrait company in the city of Chicago. We are as careful as human beings can possibly be to employ none but the best talent. We realize that the artist's relation to the portrait business is as important as a carpenter's relation to the construction of a building. A poor carpenter does poor work. The same follows with an artist. We keep a list of all artists, investigate their standing and keep a check on the refused pictures made by each. If the losses on rejects credited to that artist exceeds a certain number within a given time, we immediately dismiss him from our service.

In addition to this precaution, we educate our artists. Our superintendent is a practical man and he makes it his business to drill them as a teacher would her class, pointing out weaknesses and defects and how they might be avoided. Our artists are also drilled in the importance of clean, honest, intelligent work and are made to realize that the agent's success is his bread and butter. If all the agents in the field were to quit the business, it would immediately put out of business all the portrait companies and likewise would make idle every artist in this great city, therefore, there is a common interest at stake. We must work hand in glove; the artists must be part of the portrait company's equipment and the portrait company must realize that the agent is its "life blood."

Studio and Its Equipment

Since moving into our new quarters and getting the studio in full operation, we can justly say that we have one of the most complete and most unique studios in the world. In the first place the light is unsurpassed. There are $81\frac{1}{2}$ feet north light. We have equipped the studio with a new kind of easel, our own invention, known as a telescopic, self-adjusting, used by no other concern in America so far as we know. This easel is made so that it may be adjusted to any height or any angle, or any position without bother or trouble to the operator. By this means we are able to soften the light, making it suitable to the picture in operation. In addition, we have the studio equipped with a high-pressure an compresser, run by an electric motor working automatically. The air pressure which operates the air brushes is held at twenty-five pounds, making it possible for the artist to always produce an even, uniform picture. In addition to the natural light, we have means of lighting artificially, so on cloudy days, or even nights, when the emergency arises, we can go ahead without delay and turn out the orders when promised.

Guaranteed Portraits

As will be observed by reading this catalogue carefully, we guarantee portraits according to Rule 11, on page 14. We do not guarantee all portraits made, for no honest house can make a crayon portrait, size 16x20, for 50c and agree to take it back if it is refused. Common sense will show that this would be an utter impossibility from a business standpoint. We do undertake to guarantee Grades 7, 9, 12, 15, 17 and 19. All portraits refused on account of lack of likeness or on account of not following instructions may be be returned to us according to Rule 11. We wish to caution our many agents and friends against misleading advertisements wherein it is stated that all pictures will be guaranteed regardless of cost. A statement of that kind is so misleading and so false that it should not receive serious consideration from an intelligent agent.

Why Our Portraits Deliver Better than

the Average Portrait Company's Production

We do not claim to have monopolized the artist supply. There are many good artists in Chicago not working for the "Consolidated." There are thousands of artists living in other cities that have never heard of us. It will naturally follow that those artists can and do make as good portraits as ours. Where we have the advantage over nearly all engaged in our line is our careful, painstaking way of doing things. We are practical in the first place, conscientious in the second and have a desire to help those who are trying to help themselves. We have often made the statement that we are grown-up agents. This is literally true. Every man in our employ has pulled door pells and smelled gunpowder, so to speak, therefore, we are more competent than most people in our line because of our experience and it follows that if we are competent, conscientious and ambitious, that we will do everything in our power to make the picture right and make our agent successful. We are the "Company that helps the Agents" in its true sense.

Closing Remarks

We would not have you think after reading the foregoing that there are no honest men engaged in this business except us, or that no other house can make a good picture. Such a statement would be silly, misleading or disgusting to the man of average intelligence. We do wish, however, to impress upon you the fact that our facilities, our long experience, our competent help and our desire to succeed places us in a position where we can do more for you than anyone else. We solicit a trial order, pledging you that we will execute it in a manner entirely satisfactory to yourself.

Description of the Various Kinds of Portraits

Experienced Agents need not be told what the different kinds of portraits are, but a description will greatly aid the beginner A thorough knowledge of the following will be an invaluable assistance in taking orders, as the purchaser often leaves the choice to the Agent.

What Crayon Portraits Are

Crayon Portraits are black and white. Eyes will be black or dark, drapery black and white; in fact, no colors whatever shown. Crayon Portraits are very beautiful and suitable for all people, yet judgment should be used in taking the order, because some subjects look better in other kind of work. Old people's pictures, whose eyes and hair are dark, make nice crayons. Bust figures are better than others.

What Sepia Portraits Are

Sepia means brown. Hence Sepia Portraits mean brown portraits. The principal difference between Sepia and Crayon is the color. Sepia costs more to produce, owing to the nature of the material. Sepia sauce is obtained from cuttle fish (the manufacture of which is too long to relate here). Sepia portraits are extremely beautiful, being warm in effect and natural appearance. Most all subjects are suitable for Sepia, except, perhaps, full figures and groups. These can be made, but are better in another kind of work. No color of eyes, hair or drapery shown in Sepia.

What Water Color and Pastel Portraits Are

In Water Color and Pastel all colors are shown. Color of eyes, hair and drapery are made just as they existed in the original. For children, young ladies, and, in fact, all people with light or auburn hair, with blue or gray eyes and fair or rosy complexion should be in Water Color or Pastel. Babies' pictures, and all portraits where original colors are desired, should be made in this kind of work.

Our Water Color and Pastel portraits are of the finest quality.

What Oil Portraits Are

When we say **Portraits in oil** we do not mean the common oleograph painted on tin, such as have been sold all over the country. We have added to our already large list of portraits a genuine oil portrait, such as a few years ago could only be had by the very wealthy. By the continual pressure of the times, all common commodities have been reduced to bedrock prices. The same pressure that affects common things, if persisted in long enough, will affect those of a higher order. The truth of this is evident when we offer you this, the highest class and finest production of art, at the astonishing figures quoted elsewhere. All oil portraits mounted on stretcher.

What Albumen or Plain Portraits Are

This is the proper portrait to order in small sizes or for groups in large sizes, if the original small picture to be copied is a good one, free from scratches or not too badly faded. Don't order this grade if the original picture is a poor one.

What Bromide Portraits Are

Bromides are a good imitation of crayons, and an exact reproduction of the small picture. All group enlargements where the original is clear and good, should be made into Bromides. No matter how many in the group, the price is the same.

What French Water Color or Pasteline Portraits Are

The above names apply to one kind of portrait which in reality is a tinted crayon with an artistically colored background. We recommend these where a cheap colored portrait is desired.

What Sepianole Portraits Are

One of the most beautiful as well as artistic combination offered to the art-loving public. A combination of Sepia, Pastel and Crayon. The Sepia employed giving the portrait that pleasing, warm effect which is lacking in most other classes of work. The Pastel employed gives this portrait that bright, cheerful effect so much desired, while the Crayon serves to form the shadows and blend the other colors into one grand production of art that is not found elsewhere.

What Oilettes or Enameline Portraits Are

These are imitation oil paintings. Are portraits of any kind, enameled. It is necessary to state whether or not the picture is wanted in colors. If so made it has every appearance of a genuine oil, and the inexperienced eye can detect no difference. No glass is required when framing these portraits. Oilettes crack when rolled, therefore can not be shown in rolls.

What Pearl Portraits Are

The "Pearl" is a blue portrait, just like Sepia is brown or Crayon black and is one of the newest and most lasting portraits made. It is a new portrait; only been on the market a short while. The "Pearl" takes its name from its close resemblance to the pearl or cameo.

It is suitable for all ages and can be shown to the best trade with all confidence. The "Pearl" is made in all blue, that is, the complexion, draperies, etc., will be blue just like a Crayon is black or a Sepia brown. The "Pearl" makes a good, warm picture.

What Miniature Portraits Are

Minature Portraits mean small or little portraits. The time has come when history repeats itself in the portrait line. We are swinging back, reviving and improving the minature,—the picture of our forefathers. Hence its popularity.

Minature are made in Crayon, Sepia and Pastel. What is said of the large size portrait applies to minatures, except size. Perhaps we may say bust or single picture picture only, should be made in miniature.









The Frame Department of a Portrait Company is of great importance. Portraits must be framed appropriately if best satisfaction is obtained. Great care is needed in selecting a frame suitable.
