## PREFACE.

---

The dispersal of this fine collection formed with much care and after considerable expense, by the late Wilhelm Boeing, Esq., will enable American collectors to enrich their cabinets with many very rare, quaint and fine Foreign Coins, notably the Series of German Thalers, which contains a large number of rare specimens not often seen in America, and which command large sums abroad, among which might be mentioned: Superb Series of Brunswick Coins, one of the most extensive yet offered, containing the Ten, Five, Four, Three, Two and One Thaler Pieces; Large Gold Coins of Argentine, Japan, Hamburg, Holstein, Mexico, Nuremburg, Peru, Munster, etc.; Rare Thalers of Moriz of Bentheim, Corvey, Munster, Paderborn, Mansfield, Henneburg, Stolberg, etc.; Fine Series of Swiss Coins, including the rare coin of Zug, with bust of St. Oswald; Early American Private Issues of Gold, \$50 Piece, Assay Offices, Mormon and other Coins.

The reputation of the Bridgman Dollars is so well known that it seems superfluous to draw collectors' attention to them in this Preface, but the remarkable quality compels them to be noticed. Such a fine Dollar as that of 1794 has rarely been seen, and those of 1795 (both types), 1796, the grand proofs from 1836 to 1859, should attract the attention of our advanced collectors, who will here find an opportunity that is seldom offered to acquire the proofs of years when but exceedingly few were struck, then generally only for gifts to some distinguished personage.

The Confederate Treasury Seal and Original Confederate States Cent in the Carlin Collection are worthy of the attention of collectors, and from their rarity should command a large sum.

Catalogues illustrated with four artotype plates of Greek and Roman Gold, Rare German Coins, U. S. Dollars, etc., price 75 cents in advance.

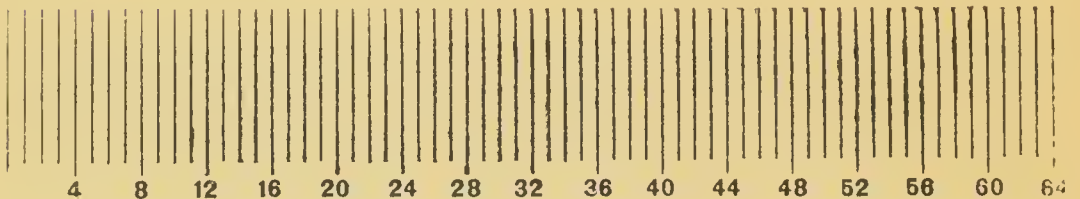

NOTE.—A letter from Mr. T. Frank Carlin, of Philadelphia, to the following effect accompanies this unique, highly valuable and remarkable relic of the Great Rebellion. In 1872 Mr. Carlin in superintending the removal of some rubbish from a cellar in a premises he had rented at 1502 Callowhill Street, Philadelphia, discovered a pair of soldier's blue pants greatly decomposed, and in picking them up the above die, some buttons and a brouze medal same as given by City of Philadelphia to Caps. Creighton, Low and Stouffer for aid to S. S. San Francisco were found in them. Mr. Carlin is still living and willing to make affidavit to this effect.

NOTE.—A letter from Mr. Carlin to the following purport accompanies this coin. In the early part of 1873 he purchased it from Capt. Funston (now deceased) who kept a saloon on Chestnut Street between 17th and 18th, Philadelphia, who

is believed to have received it as a cent (spent by mistake) from Mr. Lovett who cut the die on an order from the South, but who was afraid to deliver it and subsequently when this specimen was discovered, stated that he had lost or spent his personal specimen accidentally and this is believed to be the identical one,—may say is known to be. Had it not been for this to him unfortunate—at the time—loss, it is quite probable that the existence of the Confederate cent would have forever remained unknown. John W. Haseltine recognized the workmanship when he saw the present piece and accused Mr. Lovett of it—which was subsequently acknowledged and the dies dug up from their place of concealment in the cellar of Mr. Lovett's house,—who sold them to J. W. Haseltine and J. C. Randall who had restrikes made in gold, silver and copper and to their credit he it said, refrained from restriking any in nickel. The dies were subsequently destroyed after some 55 were struck in copper, 7 in gold, 12 in silver. Mr. Lovett struck some 12 in nickel in 1861. Mr. Carlin will make affidavit to the above.

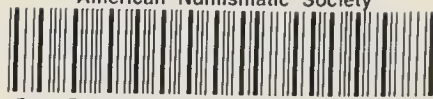
