POW. However at the time of the offensive it was erroneously believed to be subordinate to the 11th Army instead of the 12th Army as proven later.

d. The second paragraph (under the listing of enemy units) on page 7 expresses the view that the III Army Group may not have been completely organized at the time the offensive began and that the 60th Army only consisted of two divisions. This view is that held during the early days of the offensive in question. The confusion at that time regarding the organization of the Third Army Group stemmed from the fact that the Army Group was formed from divisions of three Army Groups and that PWs usually reported their former parent organization instead of their parent organization of that moment. Actually there is no doubt, using hindsight, that the III Army Group consisted of three armies of three divisions when the offensive started. By our standards perhaps the III Army Group organization was not completed. This can not be stated as true as far as CCF standards are concerned inasmuch as the elements of the three Army Groups were amalgamated into the III Army Group in China and were sent to Korea only when the reorganization was completed.

Recommend that this paragraph be deleted and the thoughts contained in this comment be substituted therefore.

e. The next to last paragraph of page 2 of the Foreword reads as follows: "So badly were they defeated, so decimated were their units that even a year later they were not capable or willing to move in force against the United Nations." This statement is in error as proven by the fact that the Communists launched another major offensive only three weeks later; in fact, one of these "badly decimated" enemy units (IX Army Group) made an extremely rapid march to the eastern front where they participated most aggressively as one of the major units in the second offensive. There is no disagreement among intelligence sources concerning the fact that much before "a year later" the enemy had re-acquired his capability for offensive action.

Recommend that this sentence be deleted in its entirety.

f. 60th CCF Army consisted of 179th, 180th and 181st Divisions and not 178th, 179th and 189th Divisions* (page 7).

g. IX CCF Army Group consisted of 27th, 20th and 26th CCF Armies (76th, 77th and 78th Divisions)* (page 7).

1. The monograph seems well written and makes informative reading, particularly for newly-arrived officers.

2. The only item bearing directly on the field of military intelligence, and hence, of interest to G2, is the footnote on page 14, referring to EUSAK War Dairy, 18 and 20 Nov 50, which states that more accurate intelligence might have resulted if the X Corps and EUSAK had been integrated. From informal opinions expressed by some officers who served in both commands in intelligence work, G2 accepts this view.

3. The general undercurrent of unemotional criticism and suggested solution throughout the study is appropriate due to the very nature of the report. However, the numerous references and inferences to almost constant friction between the X Corps and Eighth Army command prior to their consolidation and to some GHQ staff decisions are considered of sufficient importance to be called to the attention of the Chief of Staff.
