




Q3: New vs. existing users


Q3: Conversion




New active editor numbers from mobile are just shy of Q3 goal (1.2k/month)




Monolithic vs. single-purpose Facebook apps:





A brief history of our collaboration

- Rob Moen from VE embeds with mobile web, Nov/Dec 2013
- Mobile web takes over all mobile VE-related work, hits brick wall
- Mobile web/VE agree on collaboration framework for remainder of work



Other unscalable things

- Mobile absent from product goals
- Mobile team owning mobilification of other products

How to fix this for the future?

- New products conceived/developed with mobile plan and goals
- Standardize on helper libraries/tools
- Minimize handoffs/dependencies
- Scale mobile-mindedness by sharing mobile engineers


Why build a Wikipedia App?

- High quality contributions
 - Significant individual upload in Commons App
- Ability to drastically redefine UI/UX
 - Apps give us fine grain control with little legacy
- Closing the loop
 - Notifications, Donations, etc

Who is the app for?

- Reader
 - Frequent readers who see Wikipedia as a destination
- Editor
 - Supporting editors getting to 5+ edits



The narwhal, or narwhale (Monodon monoceros), is a medium-sized toothed whale and possesses a large "tusk" from a protruding canine tooth. It lives year-round in the Arctic waters around Greenland, Canada, and Russia. It is one of two living species of whale in the Monodontidae family, along with the beluga whale. The narwhal males are distinguished by a long, straight, helical tusk, which is an elongated upper left canine. The narwhal was one of many species described by Carolus Linnaeus in his publication Systema Naturge in 1758.





