



- 1 As targets of opportunity eight bombs were dropped on SW tip of Shikoku Island on the town of Okuuchi, and nearby irrigation installations. Damage slight.
- 2 Dropped 4 x 2000 pound bombs on dock area and radio station at Murato Sake on Shikoku. Set fires at dock area and damaged or sank two small craft and a Sugar Dog.
- 3 VF jettisoned bombs.

XII. TACTICAL AND OPERATIONAL DATA:

Flight Resume:

Although the carrier was operating in a clear area, this flight ran into impossible flying conditions about 100 miles out. As shown in the squadron narratives a few planes dropped their bombs on targets of opportunity on the coast of Shikuku, others jettisoned their bombs. No planes were able to reach the targets at Kure Naval Base.

VF Narrative:

This six plane flight (VF) was unable to reach target due to zero ceiling conditions enroute and attarget. Ordered to jettison bombs by target coordinator, an attempt was made to drop over enemy land installations. However, ceiling was so low that this was impossible and when bombs were dropped the flight was over water.

VB Narrative:

Approximately 100 miles out the weather closed to \$\phi_-\phi_\cdot\$. VB climbed thru a partial hole, going on instruments at 6500 feet and breaking thru at 11,000 feet and continued toward the target but were instructed not to proceed all the way in, since the target area was overcast. VB found an opening on the SW tip of Shikoku and glidebombed a small town.

VI Narrative:

VT squadron flew to the coast of Shikoku under the low overcast. Being unable to get across the mountains, it was decided to attack targets of opportunity. Four planes got enough altitude to release. The remainder of the planes jettisoned their bombs. Strafed two Sugar Dogs and a radio station at Muroto Sake.
