Constitution of the Contoocookville Protective Union Company.

Art 1st This association shall be called
the Contoocookville Protective
Union Company

Art 2^d The officers of this Union shall
consist of a President, Vice
President, Secretary, Treasurer,
and a board of Directors of five
who shall be chosen annually by ballot

Art 3^r It shall be the duty of the President
to preside at all meetings of the
Union and perform such other
duties as are usually incumbent
on such an officer

Art 4^t It shall be the duty of the Vice
President to preside in the absence
of the President and in his
absence the Union may appoint
a member to act as President
Pro tempore.

Art. 5^d. It shall be the duty of the Secretary to keep a true and faithful record of all the doings of the Union give notice of the annual meeting and perform such other duties as the Directors may think proper.

Art. 6^d. It shall be the duty of the Treasurer to receive and pay out all funds of the Union: and make a report to the Union once in three months of the amount on hand received and paid out by him: but in no case shall the Treasurer pay out any of the funds of the Union except by order of the Directors. He shall also for the faithfull performance of his duties give bonds in such sum as the Union may direct.

Art. 7^d. It shall be the duty of the Directors to employ a suitable person as Agent to buy and sell the goods of the Union and shall require the the said Agent to give bonds in such sum as the Union may think proper for the safty of the same.

als also the Directors shall direct the
kinder quantity and amount of goods
to be bought shall assist the Agent
to arrange and mark all the goods
and take account of the Stock
of the Union once in three months
and report the same to the Union

Art 8th Any person wishing to become a
member of the Union shall certify
his wish in writing to the Directors
and if they think it will be for
the prosperity of the Union for such
person to become a member he
can do so by paying to the Treasurer
the sum of ten Dollars provided
he is not either directly or indi-
rectly in trade of the same kind.

Art 9th The funds of the Union shall be
appropriated for the purchase of
such goods as the Director may
think most beneficial to the Union

Art 10th Any person belonging to the Union who shall fail to pay his subscription to the Stock of the same for a longer term than two weeks shall have his name erased from the Union. And any person wishing to withdraw from the Union shall give the Directors of the same notice of such his intention and if they think it expedient may pay him the amount of his stock and if not he may sell it to any person acceptable to the Directors.

Art 11th This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two thirds vote at any meeting called for that purpose notice being given of the same at least twelve days prior thereto

Art 12th Any person putting into the Union more than the sum of ten Dollars shall receive the amount of six per cent interest for all above that sum

By Law

Art^{1st} The annual meeting of this Union shall be holden at Contoocook village on the third Tuesday of September in each year for the choice of officers and the transaction of any other business of the Union. The quarterly meetings shall be holden on the third Tuesday of December March and June

Art^{2^d} The account of stock shall be taken so that the directors can report at each quarterly meeting

Art^{3^d} The business of this Union shall be conducted strictly upon the cash or ready pay system

Art^{4th} All members shall be entitled to a certificate of membership which shall be signed by the President and Secretary


Art 5th The Directors shall call especial meetings when requested by ten members in writing stating the object of such call


Art 6th These by laws may be altered or amended by a two thirds vote at any regular meeting notice being of such alteration at least seven days from thence,

Rained considerable this morning before 7 o'clock. Wind from the west - strong - or rather from south-of-west. Sent John Patterson to the Mission to see about olive cuttings - found no one at home - Steak .50 John F. Patterson Dr Cash 5.00

Lecut P. Reade - and W. B. Collier - got separated from ~~the~~ party ^{stage} and returned to our hotel and stay all night - both were drunk of 2 am a judge -

Wednesday 20. Feb. 78

Lecut Reade & Collier left this morning for Mesilla N.M. - Eldridge planting olive cuttings - I rode in town with Warren - Attended Grange in P.M. and trimmed olives afterward -

Thursday 21, Feb 1878
At work on the olive cuttings
at the well - Eldridge also -

Friday 22 Feb 1878.
At work on olive cuttings
in A.M. and rode in
town in P.M. Eldridge
at the well putting in olive
cuttings and taking up
those set out in sand last
year and resetting the live
ones.

At home have been very lame

and agreed to read one
of H. W. Beecher's ser-
mons - in evening - I read
part and Sister part -

Monday 4^d Mar. 78
So lame I could not go
to the Mission with Warren
Sent box of olives by mail
to Wm. Holt Los Angeles
also letter to Southern Cal.
horticultural - on "Olives"
Postage ⁵⁰

Tuesday 5^d Mar. 78
Eldridge setting out olive cut-
tings at the will - took over
400 yesterday & had finished
them today - Mr May Day & Mr
Brown here to see me this P.M.

Wednesday 6 May, 78
Wrote to cat and die cut
wires, two hours - in the gar-
den. Rode with Warren to
Paradise valley and up South
branch to look for sheep - and
found that Etcherry had run


