The guiding idea of this year's FIST is concerned the phenomena of the identity, more precisely the absence of it, mostly with the young people lost in the variety of possibilities offered by the madly rushing speed and rhythm offered and imposed by the 21st Century. People seem to have lost the compass which would guide them, due to too many possibilities and to many lost, but sometimes valid systems of true values. In fact the compass is still present, but seem out of order. It's needle is turning madly fast in circle – all directions confusing us, showing too many directions with no guarantee that none of them is good, right, proper and ours.

Dr Fist 04 is offering several suggestions and recipes for potentially solving the problem. Look into yourself at least twice a day! Throw away the old compass and find a new one in your own head! Don't pay attention to other choices and directions, but focus on your own, even though it may be entirely lonely and desolated, or even imaginary!

"On behalf of the newest performance of our workshop – the Sequences from the story of wandering – I had to reform my views about Theatre. During our work on researching and experiencing Theatre we have finally found its meaning, which we believe in. And that is the cross section of theatre and religion, and the unity of these two. By this we mean the gesture, which leads each person to the deepest parts of his or her soul, the gesture, which confronts each person with him or herself. It is this unity that we have to create on stage, to reach that point when it reveals the viewer's



secret for the viewer itself. We have also found the key for this, the CEREMONY, the RITUAL, which exists through collaboration of the actors and the director, who work together in the sake of creating this ceremony. We felt that our work can only be sustained by this ceremony. We had to find the notion of ceremony in our workshop, and we had to find its form, as well. We felt that we have to involve the spectators in this ceremony; we felt that they should be the part of our performance. We felt that we need moments when the actors and the spectators are doing the same thing. This common act can create an atmosphere where the actors can be together, while the spectators, not just indirectly but directly, as well. However, we realized that we shouldn't involve the spectators in a way, which may seem aggressive. We try to focus on the importance of silence, and we transmit it for the leaving spectators. That is why we do it. We believe the performance does not end, but silence lasts longer."






LIGHT IN THEATRE: AN APPROACH IN THEORY AND PRACTICE



FEAR OF PLAUTUS

The performance is sublimation of acting students' improvisations based on scenes from Mercator, Menaechmi, Aluloria and Captivi in TM.Plautus, not on the exact text, but on the situations, following the main idea of the performance - the futile getaway from the aloneness. On a half way between the theatre and the reality, a beggar meets the world of Menacechmos. In that weird world, everybody is a Menacechmo and everybody is absolute paranoid about someone named Plautius - the travelers, the postmen, the parasites, the policemen, the slaves, the reigns, the musicians, even the Gods are paranoid Menacechmos. If, by any chance you're not a Menecchmo and a paranoido, then you will certainly become one soon. The Fear of Plautius is, in fact, a one hour colourful jumble caused by terrified getaway from the scariest aloneness. The despised and miserable Menecchmo the fugitive walks on stilts, plaus as if in theatre, has stomach ache, prepare coup d'état, has nightmares, decodes maps of hidden treasure, fails to commit suicide, plays on empty plastic bottles as symphony orchestra, dances on Charleston rhythms, flies to the Moon and back, cooks specialties, joggles at fairs until they finally find out that everything was written long ago and there is nothing out there but His Majesty The Theatre.

Part 1 - DADDY'S GIRL

Iris is a young girl growing up in Finland. When mother leaves the family Iris gets in trouble with her overprotective and strict father. Single parent family enters financial problems and Iris is ashamed of her clothes, her fathers' profession and their ugly car. Childhood arguments escalate into total war in puberty. Mother returns and her hypocrisy triggers the final battle between the daughter and the father. Nevermind - Stories of Youth is teenage musical without music. Actually it's not a musical at all, but there is a lot of music in the end. See it for yourselves!
