1. The Problem. Mr. Miron Grossman, owner of U. S. House No. 650, Karuizawa has petitioned for the release thereof.

House No. 650 which is qualified for release.

1. Reference. Attached letter from Mr. Miron Grossman, 30 May 1950.
2. Request comments and recommendations relative to the release of property (House #650 located at 1-125 Karuizawa-machi, Kitasaku-gun) described in above reference.
3. Recommendations should include a replacement residence of similar size and type, other than non-enemy owned and already on procurement demand, that can be assigned (if necessary) to the Australian Mission concurrently with release of referenced property.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

SUBJECT: Petition for Release of NEOP #72 - M. Grossman, Karuizawa (BCSAT)

1. The Problem. This is a petition for the release of a house (#650) in Karuizawa from Mr. Miron Grossman, a Pole, who in 1949 had taken out his first naturalization papers. House appears on the NEOP list as number 72 and was procured under JPNR #100.

2. References. a. M/R, subject: Petition for Retainment of Property (Miron Grossman), 11 May 1949 (G-4 Journal No. 82388).

b. Letter from Mr. Miron Grossman, dated 30 May 1950.

3. Discussion of Facts. a. (1) Reference 2a states that by letter dated 4 May 1949, Miron Grossman (Polish National with first papers for naturalization as an American) requested release of his house (#650) at Karuizawa. In an interview with Mr. Grossman in May 1949 C&RE determined that he was returning to the states and wanted his house released for rental purposes.

(2) Because of the above Mr. Grossman could not qualify for the release of his house and was so notified by SCAP in letter, GHQ, SCAP, AG 095 (4 May 49)GD, 16 May 1949.

(3) This house was assigned to OC BCSAT in lieu of Rest Hotel privileges. 8th Army at one time inadvertently released it from procurement demand and it had to be reprocured to avoid the necessity of replacing it with a similar resort facility.

b. Reference 2b states that Mr. Grossman's house has been on procurement demand since May 1946; that he is in Japan as a Foreign Trader from USA: that he ^{has} no other residence in Japan and requests the house be released from PD for his personal use.

4. Additional Data. a. Property does not appear on list of BCOF properties now in possession of G-4 (P&O). Regional Post Engr in Karuizawa area is responsible for repairs and utilities connected with this house.

b. Capt. Lofts, BCSAT (Ebisu Camp), stated on 6 June to G-4 (Maj. Smith) that this house had been allocated to CG BCOF who had in turn sub-allocated it to the Australian Mission and that he had intended to ask for reassignment of the house to the Australian Mission in the phase out of the BCOF.

MEMO FOR RECORD: CONT'D

c. Ambassador Hodgson, Australian Mission called G-4 (Major Smith) on 7 June 50 and stated that:

- (1) The mission did not want to lose the house.
- (2) That if the house must be released the mission be allocated another house to replace it.
- (3) That the mission has a complete roster of BCOF personnel visiting the house throughout the summer and they would not want to break that up.

d. Major Smith stated that the release, if effected, would probably not take effect until after the summer season.

5. Conclusions. Inasmuch as this house had been sub-allocated to Australian Mission by OC BCOF and the mission would like to retain it or have another house in lieu thereof, instant action forwards petition to CG 8th Army for comments and recommendations on the release of the property *and the assignment of a residence, other than non-enemy owned already on PD in that area, to the Australian Mission concurrently with the release of referenced property.*

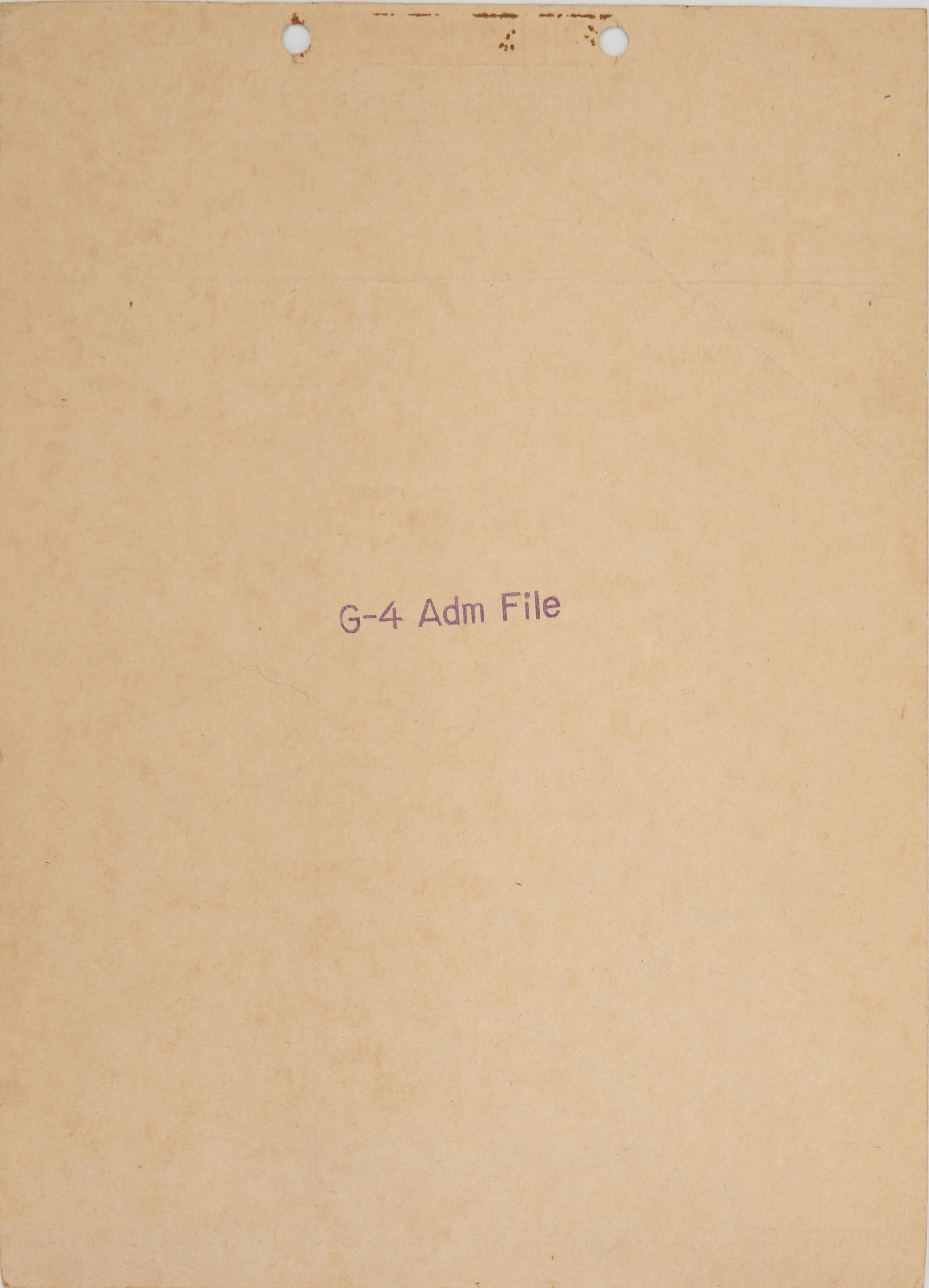
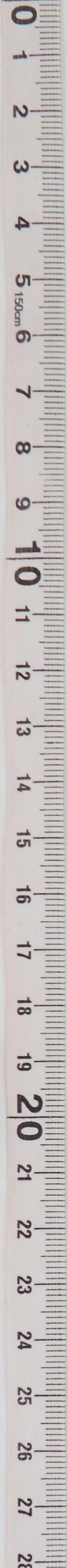
