With reference to the Italian Diplomatic Mission's memorandum no. 500 of June 9, 1949, the Mission is advised that the Supreme Commander in his memorandum no. AG 248 (6 July 48)GD of August 9, 1949 to the Mission agreed to provide the Diplomatic Representative with a suitable residence (U. 5. House No. 1035) and with indigenous labor for its maintenance on a reimbursable basis. It was, however, the understanding of this Headquarters that any further requirements for housing by the Mission would be obtained through private rental agreement. For that reason, Meadquarters considers that servants for houses acquired through direct negotiation should be acquired in the same manner. It is therefore regretted that the Mission's request for twelve additional servants to staff houses of members of the Mission procured by private rental agreement can not be favorably considered.

- 2. The Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers agreed to provide the Italian Diplomatic representative with a suitable residence (U.S. House 1035) and with operating indigenous labor for its maintenance on a reimbursable basis, (reference lamabove). It was also agreed that any further residences required would be obtained by the Italian Mission through direct negotiation with the owners. It is the position of the Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers that servants for houses acquired through direct negotiation should be staffed with servants by the same method.
- 5. The request from the Italian Diplomatic Missien for twelve indigtnous employees represents personnel now employed by different members of
  the mission living in housing produced by private rental agreement. In view
  of pelicy as at ted in paragraph 2 above, request of the Italian Diplomatic
  Mission cannot be favorably considered.



- 1. By R/S dated 16 June 49, DS forwarded to G-4 for information on which to base a reply, request of Italian Diplomatic Mission that they be provided with the services of twelve Japanese personnel through Headquarters and Service Group. Subject personnel are now employed by direct hire by
- 2. By previous action, G-4 Journal No. 63788, dated 9 August 1948, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers authorized the employment of indigenous labor for the Italian Diplomatic representative (U.S. House No. 1035). At a conference held on 20 July 1948 between the Italian Diplomatic representative and G-4, it was agreed that only one house staffed with necessary operating personnel would be provided for the Italian Mission and any other requirements would have to be secured through private rental arrangements. It follows then, that servants necessary to staff houses other than the one provided for the chief of mission would have to be secured by private arrangements and payment made direct to the employee..
- 3. This action advises the Diplomatic Section that request of Italian Diplomatic Mission for twenty indigenous laborers to be employed as domestic servants in housing other than that of the chief of the mission, cannot be favorably considered.

Reference is made to: a. Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers letter, AG 248, (30 Jun 48)GD, dated 6 July 1948, subject, "Payment of Domestics." b. Conference between The Italian Diplomatic Representative and a representative of the G-4 Section, General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, on 20 July 1948. 2. As requested by reference 1b, arrangements have been made for the provision and payment, by the Japanese Government, of indigenous labor employed in the residence of the Italian Diplomatic Representative (U. S. House No. 1035) retroactive to 1 June 1948, with the understanding that the Italian Mission will reimburse the Japanese Government in dollars, or other acceptable foreign currency, readily convertible into dollars, at current exchange rates in the New York market. 3. Inasmuch as the amount to be reimbursed may fluctuate from month to month due to labor turnover, the monthly payment for servants will not be included in the rent, but will be handled separately. Attached herewith as inclosure one is a schedule showing the wage scale for indigenous labor normally employed in occupation force households. Reimbursement by the Italian Mission for domestics employed in U. S. House No. 1035 will be in accordance with the rates shown in inclosure one. 4. The Headquarters Commandant, General Headquarters, Far East Command has been informed of the number and type of servants now employed or required in U. S. House 1035 as ascertained by reference 1b and has been requested to communicate with the mission concerning the recruitment and method of reimbursement for same.
