

1. Infobox Walk Through

1. Let's go back to the Infobox we saw in the **Llanfair Clydogau** article. This is a handy factfinder which contains bits such as geotags and Post Code. The following two images show how it's created. On the left we have the wiki code and on the right is what appears on screen.




2. There are several **fields** in the code, the first entry is "Wales", which calls up a map of Wales. These are the only fields we need to fill in at the moment:

|official_name = |
|latitude = 52.144625 (We will find the relavant coordinates using Street Map)
|longitude = -4.010837
```

|unitary_wales = [[Ceredigion]]


Of course, you will need to change the last three!

- 3. Adding coordinates. To find the lat / long coordinates, use Street Map: https://streetmap.co.uk/grid/262420 251545 106
- 4. Underneath the map you will find a search window to input thename of your chosen Community:



Copy and paste the Community name into the search window and enter.

When you're satisfied that you have the correct location, go to the bottom of the map and click on "Click here to convert coordinates" Another window will now open which will give you the exact coordinates. It will look something like this:



Now copy the figures in brackets (52.145009 is the Longtitude etc) and paste into the infobox of your new article. Add as much info into the Infobox fields. If you can find out the Post Code for example (using Google) – do it!

Why should your new article stay on Wikipedia?

- 1. It contains only facts.
- 2. Some of the facts are cited (they have references)
- 3. The subject is neutral, unlike political articles, which would need more references.
- 4. It contains an Infobox this shows the wiki community that you're not a newby! The more fields you can fill in the better.
- 5. It contains "Categories": these are similar to the Dewy referencing system at a library.
- 6. If you can add links from other articles to your newly created one, then do it!

Enjoy sharing local information with the wide, wide world!

5. Article elements

Your new article now contains these elements:

- An Infobox
- Text (a paragraph)
- A placeholder for the references {{Reflist}}
- A Template: {{Ceredigion-geo-stub}}
- A Category: [[Category:Villages in Ceredigion]]

4. Infobox templates

Depending on what type of article you are editing, you can copyt and paste the following templates. Remember that an Infobox goes right at the top of an article – before the actual text.
