Lot N I Drawn by Richard Robert Baker, for his Wife Elizabeth Elliott, now the property of his four Daughters to wit: N 1 now of Mr George Evans, N 2 now Miss Elizabeth Baker, N 3 of Mr. Wm. Bradford and N 4 of Miss Charlotte Baker.

Lot N II Drawn by Mr. Mary Green late Mary Elliott, now belonging to Miss Amintia Elliott in exchange for N III to Miss Amintia Elliott

Lot N III Drawn by Miss Amintia Elliott now belonging (by exchange) to the said William Percy.

Lot N IV Drawn by Miss Catherine Elliott, now Mrs Percy's Wife to the said William Percy.

The Partition of the above four great Lots I, II, III & IV, is confirmed by an Instrument of Writing between the parties dated Foster's Creek Namlet May 20th 1774.

The Whole Body of Land contains 1516,700 square feet equal to 34 acres and 379,150 square feet equal to 0 acres and 6 ten 553 square feet.

N I Belonging to the estate of Mr. Richard Robert Baker dead is now divided between his four daughters to wit: N 1 Drawn by Mr. George Evans (for his Wife's Homot Baker), N 2 drawn by Miss Elizabeth Baker, N 3 drawn by Mr. Wm Bradford (for his Wife Mary Baker) and N 4 drawn by Miss Charlotte Baker.

The whole Lot N I contains 379,150 square feet equal to 8 acres and 379,150 square feet and each division contains 94,787 1/2 square feet equal to 2 acres 1 tenth & 379,150 square feet.
