W E TAKE PLEASURE in presenting to the Trade, this, our Wholesale Price List for the Spring of 1916, and are pleased to say that notwithstanding the continuance of the unfortunate and deplorable conditions throughout a large part of Europe from which we get many of our supplies of Seeds, Plants and Bulbs, we have at this writing, December 15th, received a fair portion of our contracts, and assurances that the balance will come forward with the least possible delay, so that we feel reasonably sure of being able to take care of the requirements of our customers almost as usual. Some few items which may be delayed are expected to reach us in ample time for planting, and can be sent on their arrival.

We would strongly advise our customers to send in their orders for Seeds, Plants and Bulbs as early as possible, not only to avoid the Spring rush, but to insure getting full requirements of anything that may be short.

We are also pleased to call attention to the fact that in spite of the difficulty of getting high grade imported stocks of all kinds, and greatly increased transportation charges, the prices in most cases remain unchanged. Conditions, however, make it necessary to call the special attention of our customers to the rule of the trade that all orders for growing crops and stock not actually in hand are accepted subject to crop failures, shortages, or other causes beyond control, and the right to advance prices without notice.

SEED DEPARTMENT—This is in charge of trained experts, and whether your wants may be in Flower, Vegetable or Agricultural seeds, you may be sure to get only the choicest.

- PLANT DEPARTMENT—Our stocks of the leading decorative and flowering plants are in splendid condition, and customers may rely on getting full value and prompt and careful service.
- SHIPPING.—By our careful and thorough system of packing, we Guarantee Safe Delivery of plants and perisbable goods, when ordered to be sent by Express, and we always ship this way unless we have positive instructions to the contrary, and when sent in any other way, are solely at purchaser's risk.
- **PARCEL POST.**—Many of our customers seem to have the idea that Seeds, Plants and Bulbs can be sent by Parcel Post at small cost, such is not the case, and it is invariably cheaper, safer and quicker to send packages by Express. We will be pleased to send such items as can be mailed by Parcel Post if customers will remit for postage. We do not deliver any goods free at Wholesale Prices.
- **PRICES.**—This list cancels all previous offers. The prices quoted in this list are net, and subject to no discounts. Articles offered in our Retail Catalogue or Garden Book and not offered in this list will be supplied at retail prices less the following discounts, viz.: Vegetable and Flower Seeds in packets, Bulbs and Plants, 331/3 %; Small Tools and Insecticides, 10%.

No order for plants or bulbs amounting to less than \$1.00 will be filled and packed at wholesale prices. Orders received from the trade for Plants or Bulbs amounting to less than \$1.00 will be charged for at retail prices, less 10 per cent.

TERMS OF BUSINESS.—Unknown correspondents desiring to open an account will please furnish three references to parties in the trade with whom they have had credit relations, and sufficient time to investigate same, otherwise cash must accompany order.

Remittances should be made by Post-Office Money Orders, Drafts on New York or Philadelphia banks, or Express Money Orders. Where it is not possible to obtain these, the letter should be registered. We cannot guarantee receipt of money sent in any other way.

Goods desired C. O. D. must be accompanied by a partial remittance to guarantee acceptance.

All goods are offered subject to crop failures, shortages or other causes beyond our control and to being unsold on receipt of order, and we reserve the right to advance prices without notice.






