Harriet Martineau's Publication Timeline

Including major life milestones and dates

- 1802- June 12th Harriet Martineau is born in Norwich, Norfolk, England
- 1805- James Martineau is born, Harriet is closest with her brother James
- 1813- Harriet goes to Mr. Perry's school
- 1814- Harriet's deafness begins to develop
- 1818- Harriet goes to Aunt Kentish's school in Bristol
- 1820- Harriet needs to begin using an ear trumpet
- 1822- Harriet publishes her first articles in the *Monthly Repository: "*Female Writers of Practical Divinity" and "On Female Education"
- 1823- Harriet is introduced to John Worthington by her brother James
- 1824- Harriets oldest brother Thomas passes away
- 1824- The Martineau's textile business takes a hit when the economy crashes
- 1826- June, Thomas Martineau, Harriet's father, passes away. John Worthington also falls ill
- 1827- May, John Worthington dies
- 1829- Martineau family business collapses, leaving the women in the family to earn an income for themselves.
- 1831- Harriet uses prize money awarded to her from her essays to visit her brother James in Dublin, starts writing about political economy will in London and staying with her cousin
- 1832-34- Harriet publishes 25 copies of *Illustrations of Political Economy*, the first volume sold 5,000 copies and the series as a whole sold on average 10,000 copies a month
- 1832- Harriet moves to London with her mother
- 1834- Publishes Illustrations of Taxation and Poor Laws and Paupers
- 1834- Travels to America
- 1836- Returns to England
- 1837- Publishes *Society In America*. Harriet begins keeping a diary, offered a job within an economics periodical. Has her first appearance in *London Westminster Review*

1838- Publishes *Retrospect of Western Travel and How to Observe Morals and Manners.* "The Martyr Age of the United States" in the *Westminster Review*

Travels to Scotland, becomes ill in Venice and is brought back home by her brothers 1839- Publishes *Guide to Service* and *Deerbrook*

- 1839-44- Falls ill at Tynemouth
- 1841- Publishes The Hour and and the Man and the Playfellow Series
- 1844- Recovers from her illness and publiches Life in the Sickroom
- 1845- Publishes "Letters on Mesmerism" in the *Athenaeum* and *Dawn Island*, Buys plot of land in Ambleside and plans to build her home- The Knoll
- 1845-46- Publishes Forest and Game Law Tales
- 1846- April moves into the Knoll. Starts 8 month trip to Middle East
- 1846- Publishes *Esstern Life, Past and Present*Mother dies at the age of 76
- 1849- Publishes A History of England During the Thirty Years' Peace and Household Education
- 1851- Publishes Letter on the Laws of Man's Nature and Development
- 1852- Travels to Ireland and publishes Letters from Ireland
- 1852-66 Begins to write leaders regularly for the Daily News
- 1853- Publishes her translation and condensation of Auguste Comte's Cours de Philosophie Positive
- 1855- With onset of illness, she begins her *Autobiography*, she has it printed and ready to be released after her death. Readies herself for death
- 1855- Publishes her Complete Guide to the English Lakes
- 1856- Publishes Sketches from Life
- 1857- Publishes British Rule in India
- 1859- Publishes Suggestions Towards the future Government of India
- 1859- Publishes Endowed Schools of Ireland and England and her Soldiers
- 1859-65- Publishes articles regularly in *Once a Week*
- 1861- Publishes Health, Husbandry and Handicraft
- 1869- Publishes Biographical Sketches

- 1873- Tribute to Martineau by Monckton Milnes at the Social Science Congress
- 1876- June 27 Harriet Martineau dies, her self-written obituary is published in the Daily News
- 1877- Publication of her Autobiography with Memorials by Maria Westwern Chapman
