The Japanese Government is directed to return to Standard-Vacuum Oil Company, in accordance with the provisions of references 1a and 1b above, the following described properties at the locations indicated: Land, buildings, superficies, merchandise, equipment and fixtures, tanks, storehouse materials, household and personal effects, eight telephones including apparatus, service, and all rights attached thereto, (telephone numbers listed below at the respective locations), pipelines, stocks and stores, together with all other assets, movable and immovable, owned on 7 December 1941 by Standard-Vacuum Oil Company which are at the respective locations indicated below, as well as any other assets belonging to subject company which were at these locations on 7 December 1941 and which may subsequently be found:

- a. Shichijo Plant (Kyoto) located at No. 6, 10, Akashimachi, Nishi Shichijo, Shimo-Kyo-ku, Kyoto, Telephone No. Shimo 2315
- b. Tsuyama Plant located at No. 68-2, Aza Funamichi No. Uye, Tsuyamaguchi, Tsuyama. Telephone No. 42
- c. Sakurai Plant located at No. 923, 924, Oaza Tani, Sakuraimachi, Shiki-gun, Nara Prefecture

2. The Japanese Government is directed to pack the machinery and equipment listed in inclosure 1, preparatory to restitution to the Government of the Republic of China. The responsibilities of the Japanese Government for the packaging, transfer and delivery of the subject property are defined in reference 1b above. Instructions for marking of containers are outlined in inclosure 2.

3. Immediately upon receipt of this memorandum, the Japanese Government will submit L-1 or L-2 Inventory Forms on all property listed in inclosure 1 where such forms have not been previously submitted. CPC numbers as obtained from General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian, will be marked on each machine where that has not been done. The Japanese Government will return one copy of inclosure 1 to General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, Civil Property Custodian within fifteen (15) days from date of this memorandum, listing the L-1 or L-2 Inventory Form number on which each machine was reported as well as the CPC number assigned to each machine.
