

- 2. The reference directive implements the plan of General Head-quarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by which the Imperial Japanese Government is required to concentrate repair and conversion efforts on those plants which can produce large quantities of fertilizer within the critical period of the next few months. The Iwakuni Plant (among other plants of a similar type which were considered) was excluded from the fertilizer program for several technical reasons.


