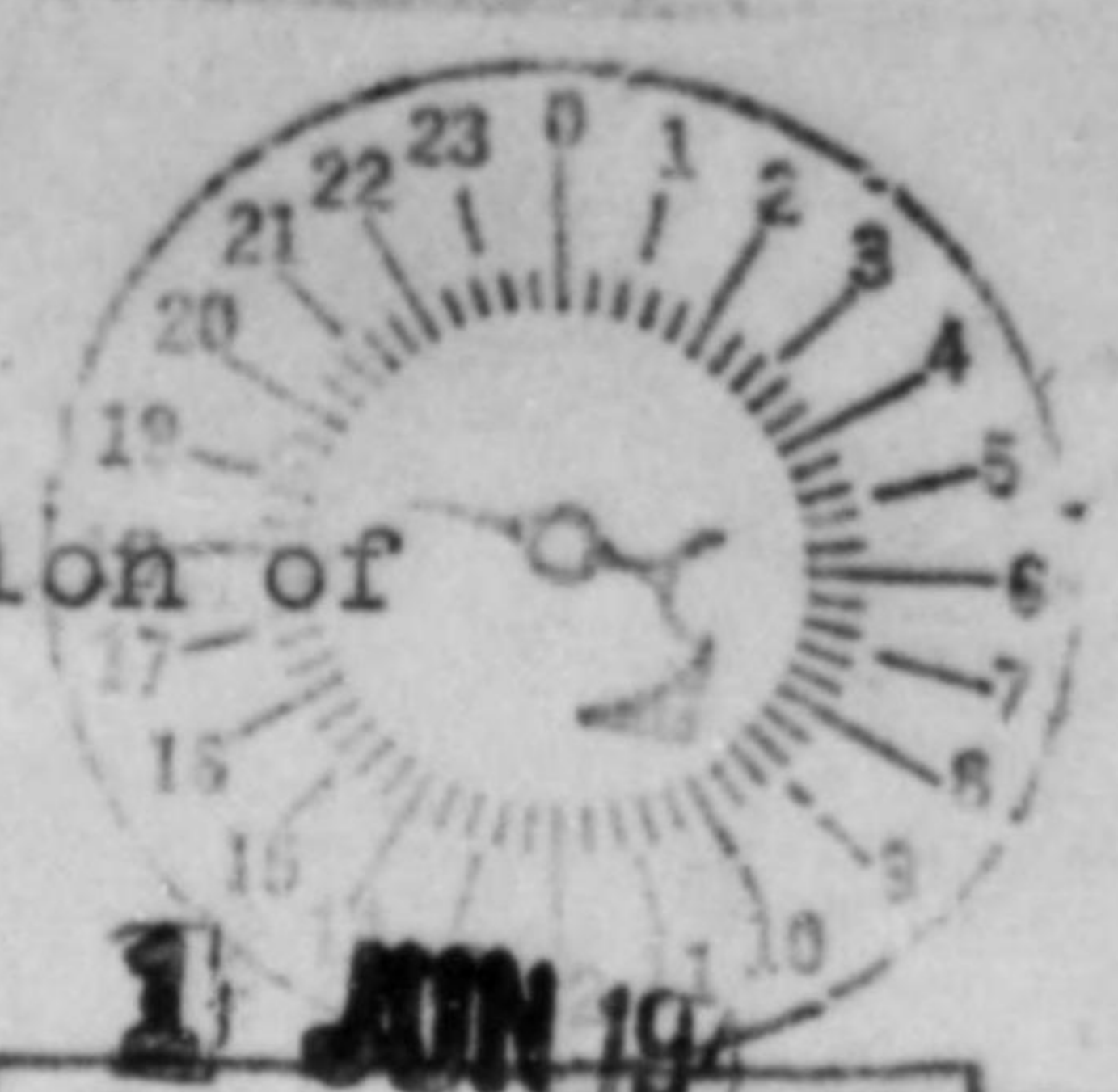

1. The Iwakuni Fuel Factory has been included on a revised list of plants to be held under protective custody for reparations.
2. With reference to par 2, 4th Ind. the size and bulk of machinery and the fact that some machinery is damaged would not exclude this installation from inclusion in the list of plants in custody and control.
3. Considering the additional information pertaining to the subject installation contained in paragraphs 1 & 2 above it is desired that the application be again reviewed.
4. Reference 1st and 5th Indorsements; it is desired that units in the chain of command indicate their approval or disapproval of the actions of subordinate commanders.

1. Pursuant to paragraph three (3) of sixth indorsement, the subject mentioned plant has again been reviewed by this headquarters. It is recommended that the grounds and buildings be released to the Japan Fertilizer Company. However the machinery installed for the express purpose of war production should be held until such time as the reparation requirements are known. Any new machinery brought in by the Japan Fertilizer Company for the purpose of reconstructing the plant would not be considered subject to reparation.

2. It is strongly recommended that permission be granted to put into effect the plan suggested in paragraph one (1) of this indorsement.

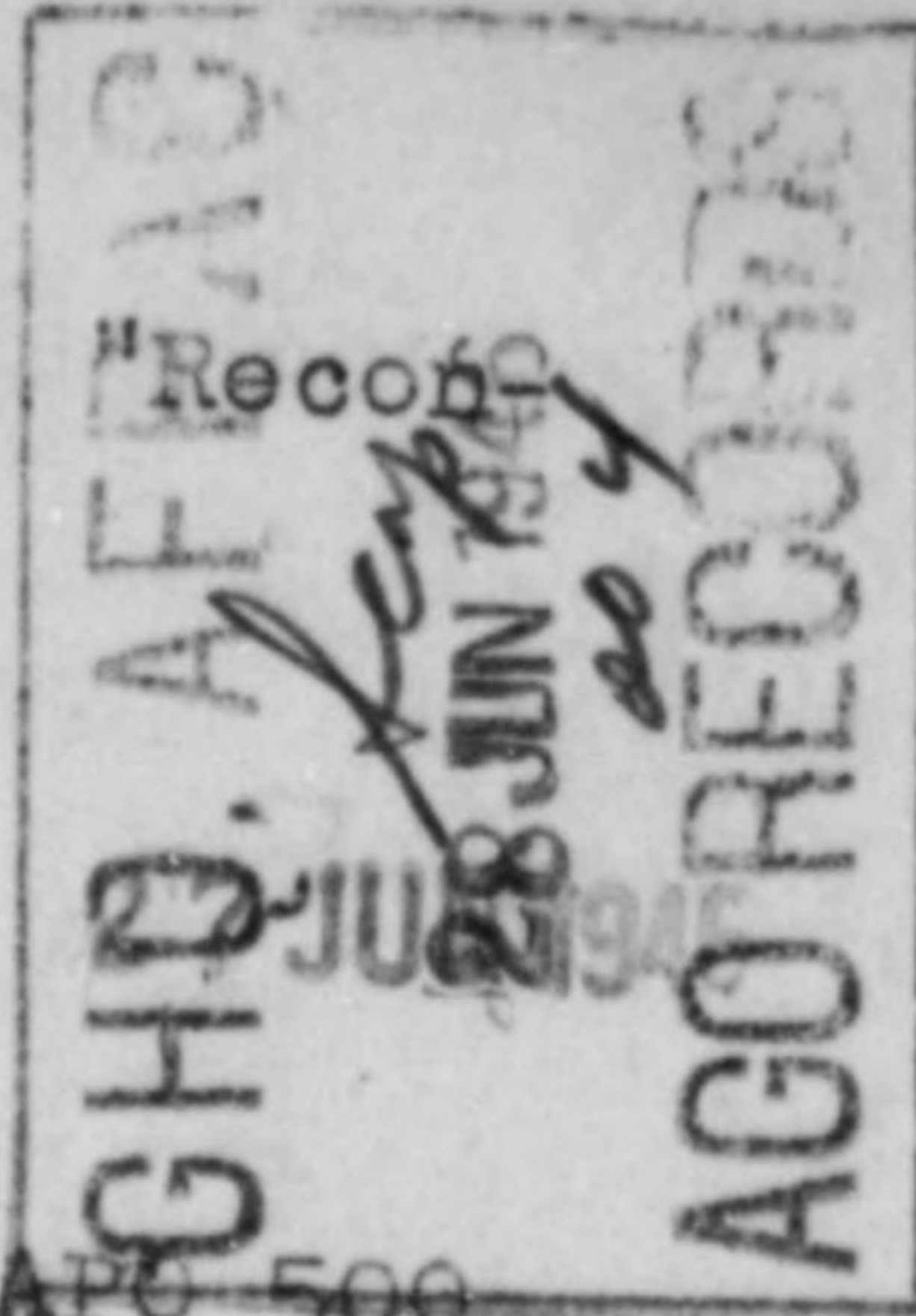

TO: Commanding General, Eighth Army, APO 343.

1. Reference is made to Memorandum for the Imperial Japanese Government, file AG 464.6 (17 May 46)ESS/IN, subject: "Production, Distribution and Use of Fertilizer," dated 17 May 1946.

2. The reference directive implements the plan of General Headquarters, Supreme Commander for the Allied Powers, by which the Imperial Japanese Government is required to concentrate repair and conversion efforts on those plants which can produce large quantities of fertilizer within the critical period of the next few months. The Iwakuni Plant (among other plants of a similar type which were considered) was excluded from the fertilizer program for several technical reasons.

3. Recommendation contained in previous indorsement is not favorably considered.

1. Letter Central Liaison Office, file CLO No. 1, subj: "Conversion of Iwakuni Fuel Factory to Manufacture of Ammonium Sulphate", dated 31 October 45, was transmitted to Headquarters Sixth Army by the Kyoto Liaison Office under date of 7 November 45, requesting that the Japan Fertilizer Company be granted authority to convert and produce fertilizer at the Iwakuni Fuel Factory (government owned) of Yamaguchi Prefecture.

2. This request was indorsed to Headquarters Eighth Army, but was denied for the reason that, on a national basis, sufficient fertilizer production capacity exists to meet national needs of Japan.

3. Subject matter has never been processed through your headquarters, but is forwarded for your information.

→ 4. It is desired that you inform the company of this decision.



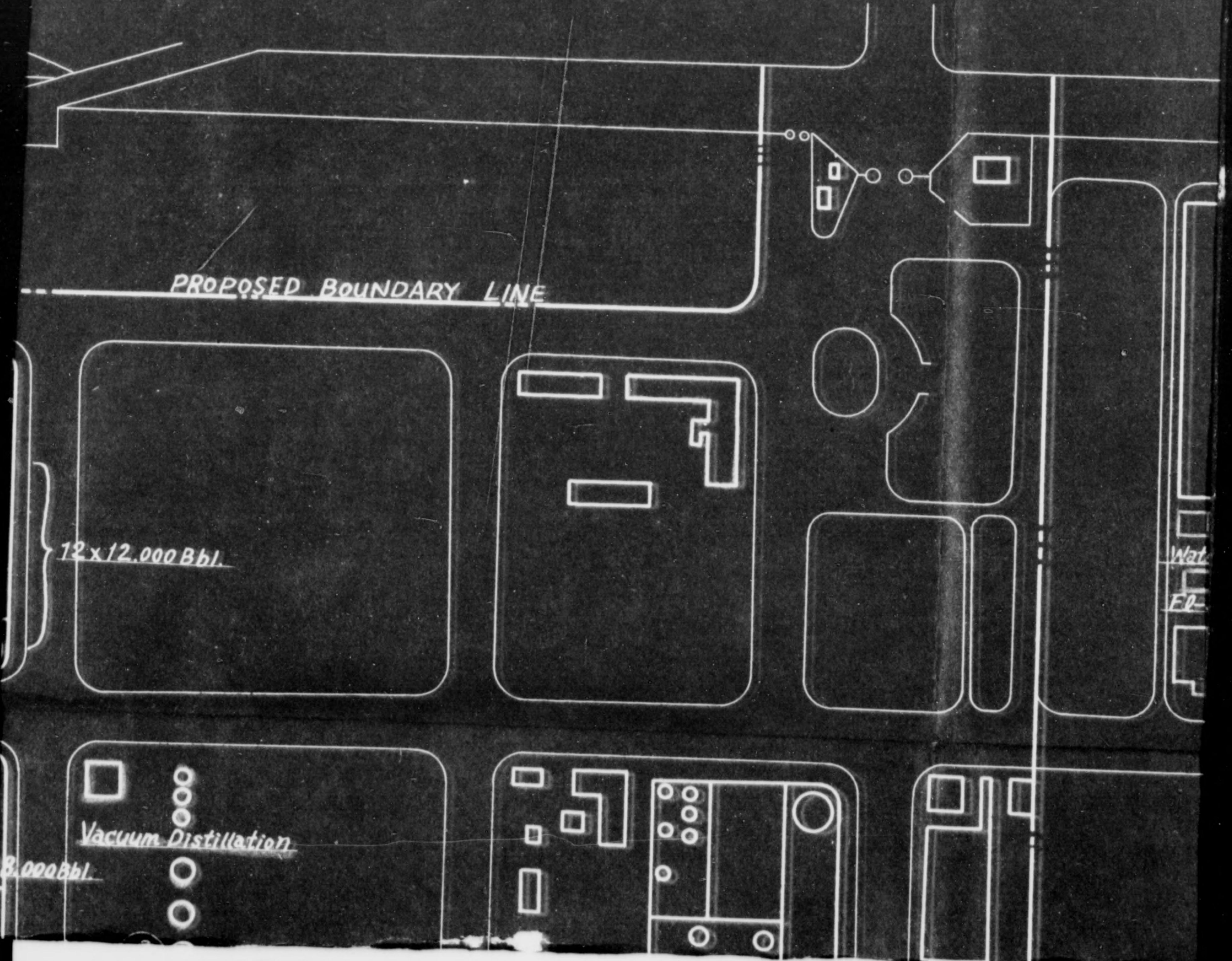
PROPOSED BOUNDARY





# PLAN OF THE MARIFU REFINERY

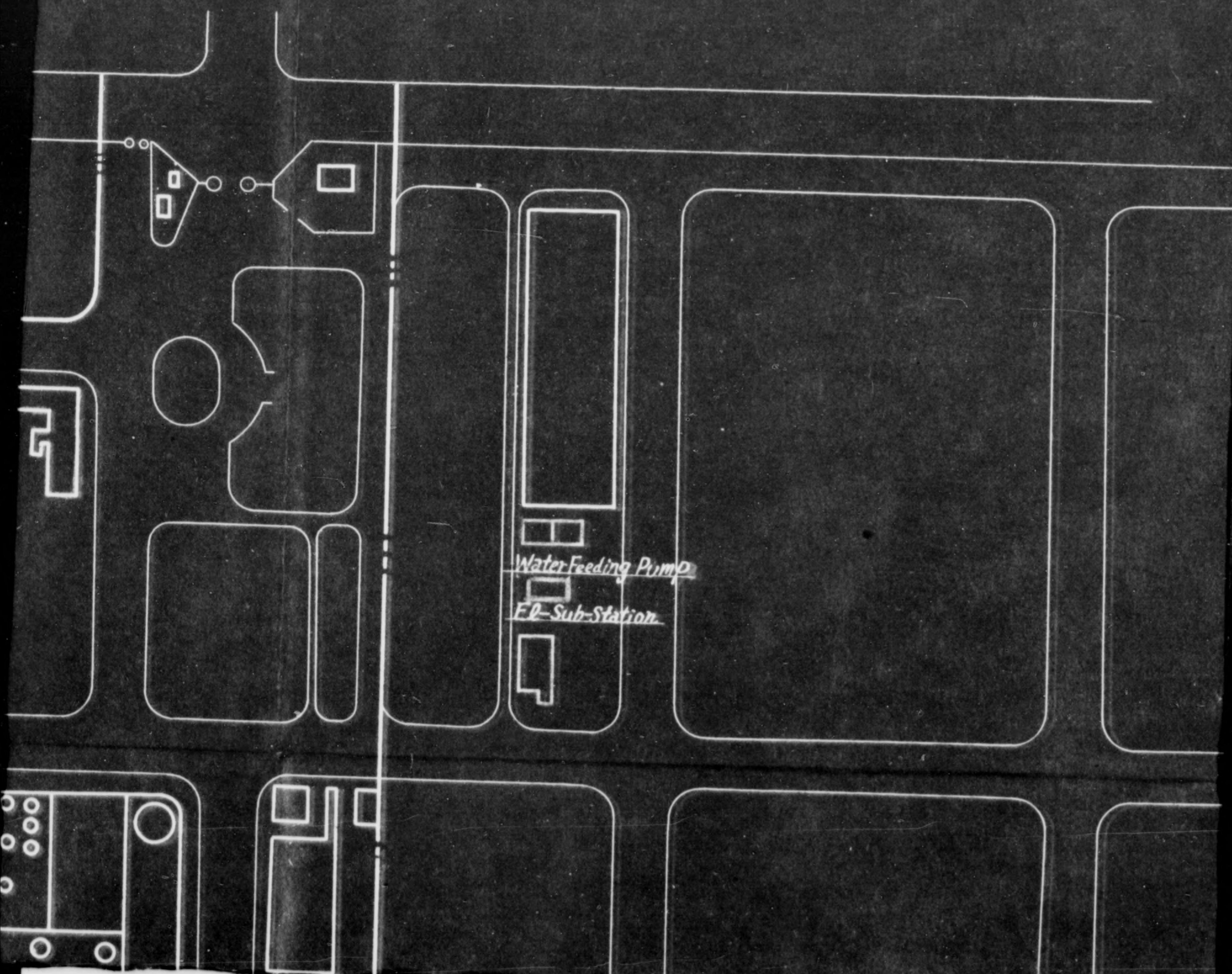
*Combinated With Former Iwakuni Army Fuel Depot*
