Prime Minister received a representation (7.12.2006) from Shri Subrata Bose, MP(Lok Sabha) on the issue of the last remains of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose, kept at the Renkoji Temple in Japan. [F/R]

- 2. In his representation the MP has stated that notwithstanding Government's decision to reject the Report of the Justice Mukherjee Commission, members of the Bose family, the All India Forward Bloc and countless Indians are of the firm view that the ashes in the Japanese temple are not those of Netaji. He further stated that if any decision is taken by Government to take over the remains of Netaji from the temple, it would be opposed "tooth and nail'.
- 3. PM instructed that the matter be examined by the Ministry of External Affairs. In their reply MEA has made the following points: [F/A]
 - > The Government of India has accepted that the ashes in the Renkoji Temple are those of Netaji Subash Chandra Bose.
 - The Head Priest of the Renkoji temple has indicated that he may no longer be in a position to ensure preservations of the remains with due respect and honour.
 - In view of the above, EAM has decided 'in principle' that the remains of Netaji will be relocated to a suitable place in the new building of the Indian Embassy being constructed in Tokyo; actual construction of the new building is scheduled to commence in July this year.
 - Ambassador of India has been instructed to work out appropriate modalities for shifting the remains to the newly constructed building.

It has been reported in one of Bengali newspapers published from Kolkata in its today's issue that during your forthcoming visit to Japan, the Japanese Government may propose to you take some decision in the matter of taking over of the alleged remains of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose kept in the Renkoji Temple in Japan on behalf of the Government of India.

I have to bring too your attention once again that, inspite of your Government's decision to reject the Report of Justice M.K. Mukherjee Commission of Inquiry, overwhelming majority of the members of the Bose family, All India Forward Bloc and numerous people of India are of the firm view that the Government of India should accept the Report of the said Commission of Inquiry which stated that Netaji did not die in an air crash on 18th August, 1945 and that the ashes kept in Renkoji Temple in Japan were not f Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose.

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We, therefore, urge upon you not to consider any such proposal as stated above, if made.

We may also reiterate that if any decision in favour of taking over the alleged remains kept in a Temple in Japan on behalf of the Government of India is taken, members of the Bose family, All India Forward Bloc and people of India shall oppose such an action tooth and nail. We also demand that financial assistance to the Renkoji Temple by the Government of India should be stopped immediately.



2. The undersigned is directed to state that the letter dated 7.12.2006 has been carefully examined in the Ministry. It has been decided in principle by the External Affairs Minister that, bearing in mind that Government of India has accepted that these are indeed the ashes of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose and also noting that the new Head Priest of the Renkoji Temple has conveyed that he may no longer be in a position to ensure preservation of the remains with due respect at Renkoji, the ashes be relocated to a suitable place in the new building of the Indian Embassy in Tokyo. Construction work on the new Chancery will begin in July 2007 and is expected to be completed by July 2009. The Ambassador of India in Tokyo has been asked to suggest appropriate modalities, after which final approval will be accorded.
