





The immense growth of our Canna Business during the last few years has been so great that we have put up a winter storage house with a capacity of 150,000 Clumps, thus enabling us to keep the roots in best condition, and we hope during 1910 to send out better plants than ever before. Cannas should be planted in good, rich garden soil, mixed with half of old, rotten stable manure. Water sparingly for first two weeks after planting. When growing freely, water liberally. Set the plants 18 inches apart each way, and if more than one kind is to be used, be careful to plant the taller kinds in the center and the dwarf ones along the edge, y to planting in beds.

We Recommend the following as most desirable for beds of solid colors:


