What can I upload?

- You may upload works that you created entirely yourself.
- This includes photos and videos of almost everything as long as they have educational value.
- You may also upload original graphs, maps, diagrams, and audio.

What is not allowed on Commons

- By default, you can't upload someone else's work.
 This includes material such as: logos, CD/DVD covers, promotional photos, screenshots of TV shows, movies, DVDs, and software drawings of characters from comics, TV, or movies even if you drew them
- Most pictures published on the internet.
- Photos of you not taken by you (the copyright holder is the person who took the photograph unless it is a formal work for hire).
