AMARANTHUS.

AMARANTHUS, Gibosus.

Most brilliant and showy annual that grows. No plant is more appropriate for the center of a bed or in other places where a striking and stately effect is desired than the Amaranthus. Two or three of these plants in the center of a bed, or several of them massed together, will attract more attention and be more ornamental than any plant of which we know. It is perfectly adapted to our warm summers, very easily grown from the seed in the open ground and well worthy a place in any garden. Allow sufficient space for the plant to develop in all directions. Germinates in from 5 to 7 days. Annual. *Pkt., 200 seeds, 3 cents.*



ARABIS ALPINA.

ARABIS ALPINA.

This is one of the most early of spring flowers, producing its beautiful white blossoms long before most of the other plants in the garden are fairly established. Our illustration shows to perfection the branching stems, each crowned with a multitude of snow-white flowers. In reality this effect is greatly enhanced by the bright green leaves. The blossoms are of a charming, delicate rose-pink, borne on long slender stems; the woolly foliage makes a very effective setting for the flowers. AMPELOPSIS.

These are deservedly among the most popular vines grown for covering walls and arbors. The foliage is very beautiful in autumn. In autumn this unique plant assumes its greatest beauty, the whole foliage being a glowing mass of the brightest shades of crimson, scarlet and orange. 30 to 50 feet. It is so delicate and small that to obtain its full beauty, and the full enjoyment of its fragrance, it should be planted in such quantities as will give it the effect of a pure white sheet in contrast to the more brilliant flowers immediately adjoining. 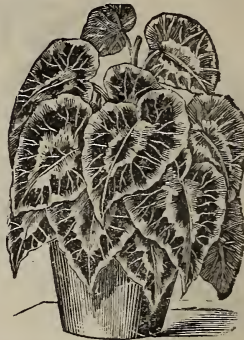

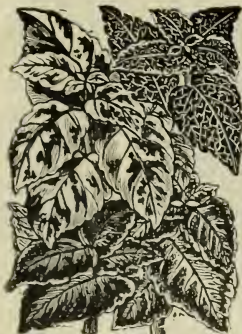

In good soil Coboea will often grow thirty-feet high, branching freely and covering a large surface. Plants commence to flower when quite small, and continue in bloom until killed by frost. Put the seeds in moist earth, edge down and do not water again until the plants appear, unless the soil gets very dry. May be potted and grown in the house during the winter. Germinates in from 15 to 20 days. Tender perennial. *Pkt., 15 seeds, 4 cents.*

CALENDULA—Pot Marigold.

The flowers are very large and very double, and produced in great profusion for several months. Sow the seeds early in the open ground. The flowers are dried and used as an herb for flavoring. Germinates in from 7 to 10 days.

CANNAS.

The Canna is chiefly prized for the beautiful and stately effect it produces when grown in beds. It has greatly increased in popularity in the past few years, owing to the fact that it is not so difficult to grow as has been commonly supposed. The leaves are of various shades of green, purple and red. Will bloom the first year from seed, which are usually sown singly in small pots early in the spring and planted out after danger from frost is past. Soak the seeds in warm water several hours before planting.

CYCLAMEN.

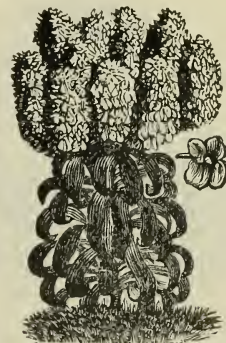
COCCINEA INDICA.

A very ornamental climber, producing ivy-like foliage. Well suited for arbors and trellises. The small flowers are followed by the fruit, which measures about two inches in length, and soon turns to a brilliant scarlet spotted with white. Cocchineia is a member of the gourd family and one of the best of the species, the flower and fruit being produced in abundance. Half hardy perennial. *Pkt., 25 seeds, 4 cents.*



CLEOME PUNGENS. The Giant Spider Plant.

A very free blooming plant, producing flowers in immense spikes two to three feet long. Germinates in from 3 to 5 days.

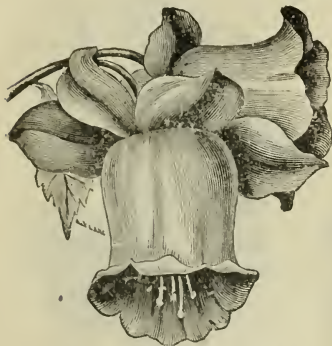

The Cineraria is usually grown as a pot plant in the house, for which purpose it is very satisfactory. It is easily raised from seed, and is valued both for flowers and foliage. The flowers are crimson, magenta, violet and purple. Germinates in from 5 to 7 days. Tender perennial. 18 inches.

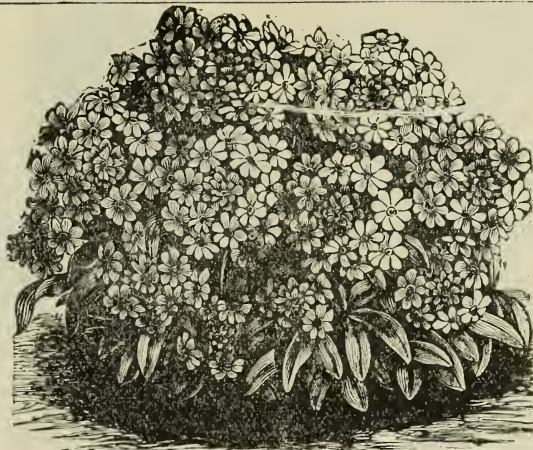

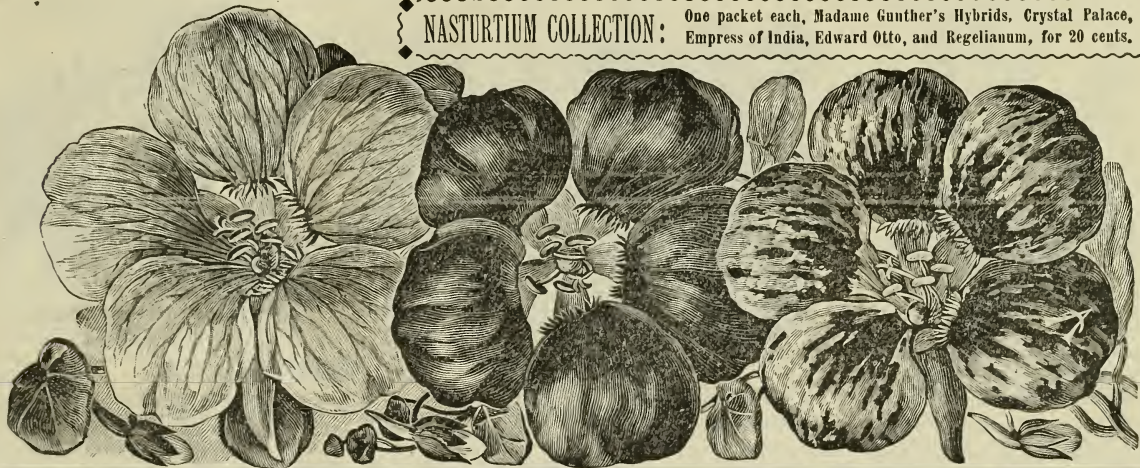

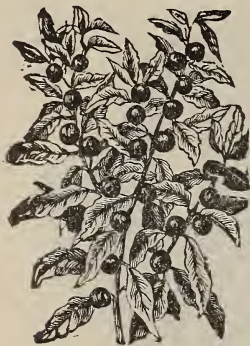
