


FAMILY TREE OF THE RULERS OF NORMANDY

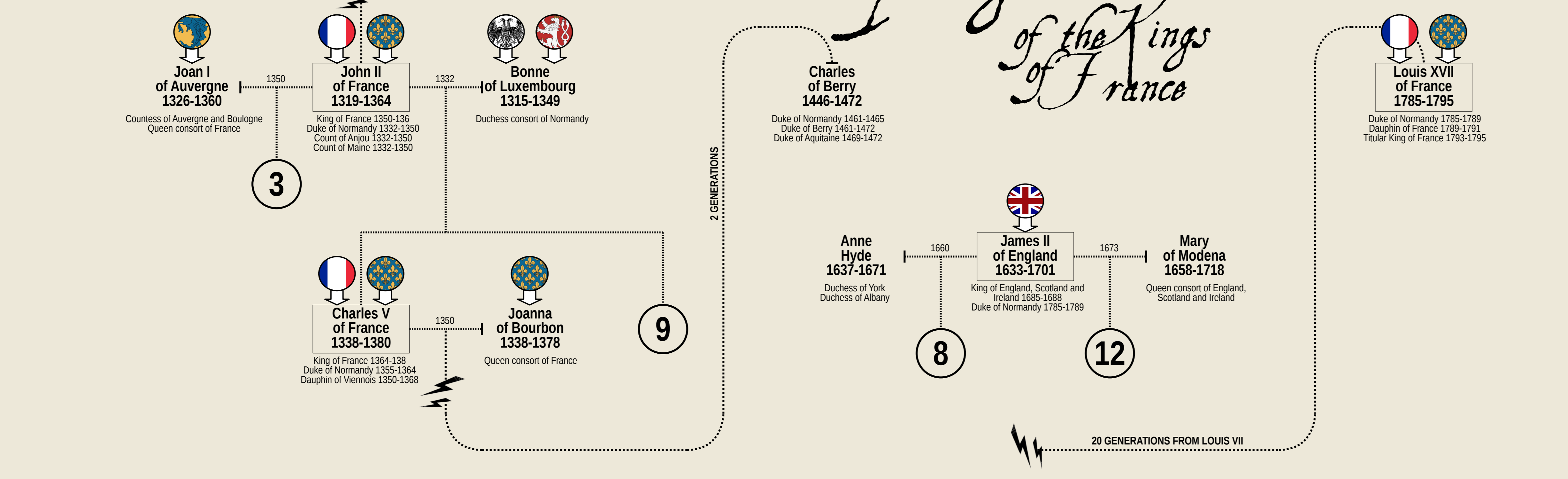
TOWARDS THE PARENTS

- Colored character box with an image (from Wikipedia) of the character represent someone from one of the main lines of the chart. It has the name of the person with dates of birth and death in it. Right under the box: titles and regnal dates of that person.
- A line connecting the two boxes by their sides represents their marriage. The date, if known, is shown on top of it.
- A transparent character box with black text usually (but not necessarily) represents a woman, but always a person who is not directly involved in the chart except through marriage. Names and dates of birth and death are inside the box, but the titles has no regnal dates.

TOWARDS THE CHILDREN

- A line going down from the link between two boxes is about the offspring this union produced.
- A line of dots represents a direct line of continuity without showing all its various representatives. Most of the time it means a direct line from fathers to sons, but not always. It often represents a connection between different members of the chart through direct links but on a secondary level of importance for this chart.
- A transparent character box surrounded by a solid black line (with black text) indicates a monarch (king, emperor, a monarch) from another chart. The person is present here because of his/her relationship to someone in this chart. This box follows the same rules as the secondary black character box. Their is a second variant, the colored one, where the person is from one of the main lines of the chart.
- The number of irrelevant children (in a dynastic sense) that were born of this union.
- Public figure of great renown used to situate the chart in time. Not all charts have those boxes.
- Line arriving on top of a box represents a direct family relationship (parent-child).
- A line connecting the two boxes by their sides represents their marriage. The date, if known, is shown on top of it.
- A transparent character box with black text usually (but not necessarily) represents a woman, but always a person who is not directly involved in the chart except through marriage. Names and dates of birth and death are inside the box, but the titles has no regnal dates.
- A line going down from the link between two boxes is about the offspring this union produced.
