The Farm, represented above, belongs to the Estate of Henry C. Gefkin dec'd, and is situated on the East side of Rutledge Street between Gadsden and Congress Streets in the City of Charleston, Washington Village, and is here divided into 28 Lots, the boundaries of which are colored yellow. It is composed of the Lot on Rutledge Street conveyed by Thomas Gadsden to James C. Martindale, by deed dated Sept 30, 1813, and of five Lots in the village of Washington numbered in Major Mitchell's original plat thereof 28, 29, 40, 41 and 55. Surveyed at the request of the Executors Sept 16, 1856 By Charles Parker City Surveyor
