THE DIRECTORS of THE MOUNT SINAI HOSPITAL submit to its Members their Report for the year 1868.

By reference to the Report of the Executive Committee, it will be perceived that during the year 1868 there were 684 applications for admission to the Hospital.

There were also treated as out-door patients 743.

The causes of death are fully set forth in the Report of the House Surgeon; also, some interesting surgical and medical cases treated in the Hospital.

It will be observed by reference to the Report of the Finance Committee, the amount received during the year by voluntary donations was \$1,555.48, and from the charitable fund of the State of New York, \$2,577.83. The Directors gratefully acknowledge the receipt of a legacy bequeathed to the Institution by the late Joseph Cahn, Esq., of \$100.00.

The Directors congratulate the Members of the Hospital on having obtained from the City a lease of land situated on Lexington Avenue, between 65th and 66th streets, for the

term of 99 years, at the nominal rent of \$1 per annum, for the erection thereon of a suitable building for the object and purposes of the Institution.

A Committee from the Board of Directors has been appointed to visit the various Hospitals in this and other cities, with a view to have all the improvements in ventilation, in arrangements of the Wards, and in the security and protection of those who may seek the benefit of the Hospital.

The Directors feel confident that their appeal for aid, to enable them to erect a Hospital, commensurate with the wants and requirements of our community, will be met with a gratifying response from a charitable and generous public.

Rev. Drs. Lyons, Adler, Isaacs, Einhorn, Hubsch, Mielziner, Goodhein, Sonnenschein and Vidaver continue to pay periodical visits to the Hospital, administering consolation to the sick.

The Medical and Surgical Staff give general satisfaction. Great praise is due to them for their valuable services gratuitously rendered.

The House Physician and Surgeon, Dr. Teller, continues to discharge his duties with ability and satisfaction.

The Superintendent, Mr. Schwarzbaum, merits and receives the approbation of the Directors, for his fidelity and devotion to the interests of the Hospital.

In conclusion, the Directors submit their Annual Report to the Members and Patrons of the Hospital, and trust, through their liberality, its usefulness may be extended.

REPORT
OF THE
EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE
OF THE
MOUNT SINAI HOSPITAL
FOR THE YEAR 1868.

TO THE PRESIDENT AND DIRECTORS OF THE MOUNT SINAI
HOSPITAL IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK:

Another year has passed, and it is once again the duty of the Executive Committee to render to the Board of Directors their annual Report.

They submit the same under the pleasing consciousness that the Institution has, as in former years, sustained its high character for benevolence, and they acknowledge most gratefully the mercy of an all-bountiful God, who has thus far prospered their efforts to mitigate the sufferings of the afflicted.

Every year the detail management must necessarily repeat itself, whilst the object and aim of the Institution remain unchanged. Your Committee, therefore, have seldom a new feature to expatiate upon. It is, however, their privilege this time to acknowledge the interest manifested by the ladies of the Auxiliary Society of the Hospital in visiting and comforting the patients, and also to gratefully acknowledge their liberal contributions of clothing and household linen.

They would suggest that a list of the officers and members of this Association be procured for insertion in the Annual Report, as an evidence of our appreciation of their services, and an inducement to others to emulate their good example.

Your Committee have held 55 meetings during the past year, and have had under consideration 684 applications, of which 614 were received in the Hospital, and 70 were rejected for causes which will appear in the detailed report of the House Physician, which is hereto annexed. Of this number 21 were pay patients.

Books and pamphlets in the Hospital appear to be a great source of consolation to the sick and convalescent. They help to while away time, which must otherwise bear heavily on those who can resort to no other means of amusement.

Your Committee would therefore call attention to the limited number of English and German books of a miscellaneous nature now in their possession, the gifts of various kinds friends. The collection, however, is too small to be of very great service. They, therefore, solicit for this little library the consideration of a generous public.

The average number daily treated in the Hospital was $53\frac{1}{2}$. The average of deaths was $7\frac{1}{6}$ per cent. The number of consumption cases treated was 114. Among the deaths are included 22 from accidents, upon which coroner's inquests have been held.

Doctor Teller, the House Surgeon, continues to give general satisfaction. Your Committee have evidence of his courteous and skillful attention to the duties devolving upon him.

Your Committee also renew their expression of satisfaction with Mr. Schwarzbaum, the Superintendent. His interest in the welfare of the Institution, and his efforts to promote the comfort of the patients, remain unabated.

The disinterested and indispensable services of the Medical Staff and Consulting Surgeons, once again call for our grateful acknowledgments; it is to the skill and devotion of these learned gentlemen that we are indebted to the high position the Mount Sinai Hospital holds amongst kindred institutions.

The reverend gentlemen who have visited the Hospital have been unremitting in their labors of love. Their cheering visits have breathed comfort in the time of sorrow, and kindled hope

in the midst of despair. Your Committee fully appreciate the exemplary zeal of these worthy men, and would bespeak the continuance of their valuable co-operation in the cause of our noble charity.

The usefulness of our Secretary, Mr. Julius J. Lyon, requires from us a passing allusion for his assiduity and unremitting attention in the discharge of his duties. His efficiency deserves our unqualified approval.

Your Committee feel grateful for the success which has attended the efforts of the Directors to procure a site for a new Hospital. At times all the beds in our present building have been occupied, and the necessity for immediate exertions to raise the necessary funds for the erection of a building commensurate with the requirements of this Institution become more imperative every day,

The records, your Committee are glad to add, will show again that our benevolence is not confined in its exertions to those of our own faith. The ear of the Hebrew is never deaf to the cry of the needy, nor is his heart unmoved at the suffering of a fellow man, whatever may be his creed, origin, or nationality. The principles of this institution continue to regard every man a brother, and, like the teachings of our religion, prompt to an unrestricted love and mercy to all mankind.

Trusting the blessings of Providence may ever be showered on the Institution,

Of the applicants for admission, 69 were visited before admitting them, and 76 out-door patients were treated at their residences.

87 patients, accidentally injured, were admitted during the year.

The largest number of patients in the house at any one time during the year was 69, the smallest, 40.

The average number of patients, $53\frac{1}{2}$. Of the patients admitted, 26 were pay patients.

The average time of residence in the Hospital was 21 days.

The number of deaths was 48, making $7\frac{1}{6}$ per cent. of those treated, and after deducting patients admitted in a dying condition, 25, and suffering from incurable diseases, 89; the proportion of deaths amounts to $1\frac{1}{5}$ per cent.

The whole number of prescriptions was 11,413, at a cost of $8\frac{1}{11}$ cents for a single prescription.

The stock of medicines was augmented with 5 new preparations; 16 new surgical instruments were purchased, and 21 books added to the Hospital Library.

The number of consultations was 37, and 189 operations were performed, 43 of which were capital operations.

Compared with last year's Report, the number of patients is larger by 11 per cent., while the number of out-door patients has increased by 18 per cent.

The daily average of patients was about the same as last year.

The proportion of deaths is the same as last year.

The number of incurable diseases received in the house has increased 50 per cent.

After deducting those, the average of deaths is even smaller by a fraction than last year.

The number of accidents admitted is about the same as last year.

The number of pay patients has decreased again from 34 to 21.

Annexed are a few interesting cases which have been successfully treated during the year :

I.—JOHN WHEELER, 27 years of age, an engineer on the Hudson River Railroad, was seriously injured by being thrown from the train when in motion ; was taken up insensible and brought to the Hospital, two hours after the accident, at 5 o'clock on the morning of 28th June, 1868. Patient was insensible when admitted ; had a deep wound on the scalp, a lacerated wound on lower lid of eye, and a severe concussion of the brain ; he remained in an insensible condition, without taking nourishment, for four days, except (at intervals) a spoonful of brandy and water. On the fifth day he was conscious for a short time, but soon was seized with convulsions, and had, during the succeeding 30 hours, 40 convulsions. Almost all the time he was under the influence of chloroform. He gradually after became sensible of his condition, but could not recollect anything about the accident, nor did he recognize his relatives or friends. On the tenth day his strength appeared to be returning, and with it his memory and intellect, and he left the Institution fully restored on 23d July.

II.—JACOB HIRSCH PEISER, 4 years old, while playing on the sidewalk in front of his parents residence, in Allen street, was knocked down by a Second avenue railroad car and run over, sustaining a compound fracture of the leg and arm. He was brought to the Hospital late on the evening of the 26th of May, 1868, to have his arm and leg amputated, the parents being poor could not have the operation performed at their house. The child was so much exhausted by the shock of the injury, and the long distance he had to be carried to the Hospital, that he was cold and pulseless; on admission, under proper care and attendance, he regained his strength; the fractured limbs were put in proper apparatus, and small parts of dead bone were removed in proper time, and, under constant attention, were saved. When the boy left on the 14th of January, 1868, he had the perfect use of his leg and arm, and only a deep scar showed the place of his injury.

III.—MARGRETA UNGER, 24 years, was confined at her house, and two weeks after delivery had swelling of the knee joints. She applied for admission six weeks after the disease had commenced, and when examined in the Hospital the joint was involved in the destructive process. Some time was given to a trial to save the limb, but she lost strength daily, and finally amputation was deemed necessary as the remedy to save her life. The operation was performed, and it took many months before she gained sufficient strength to walk on crutches. She received an artificial limb, and when she left the Hospital to go to Europe, she used her leg without difficulty.

IV.—LINA FRIEDMAN, 11 years, the eldest child of a large family, while lighting the fire by throwing kerosene on the coals, her dress caught fire and she was terribly burned on the lower part of the body—the legs, the arms, and parts of the back. The mother, being a few days after confinement, the family reduced by previous sickness and death of two younger children, the father brought her in this pitiable condition to the Hospital about six hours after the accident had taken

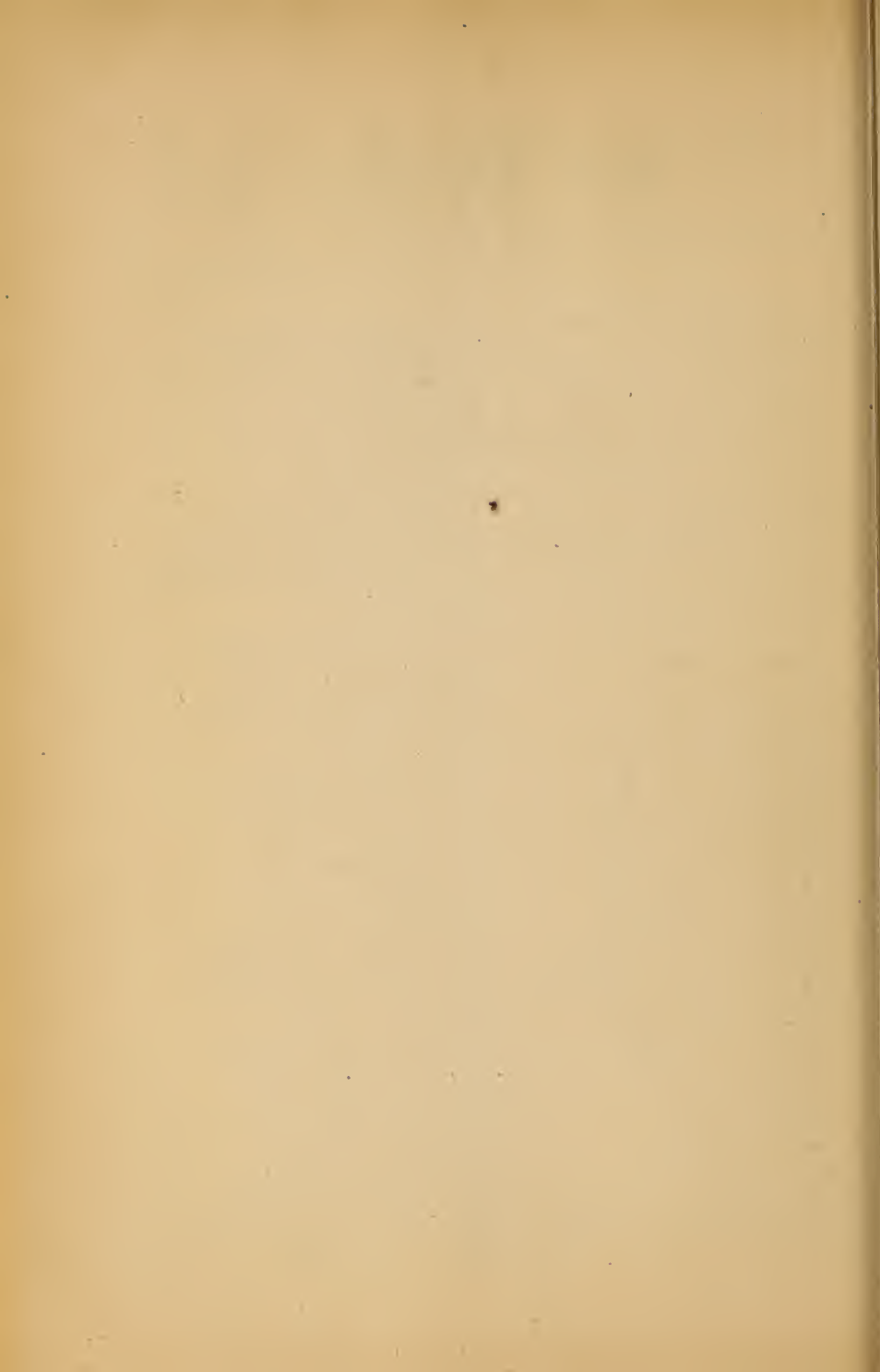
place. Under the appropriate treatment the child gradually improved, and was discharged cured, two months after her admission.

V.—HERRMAN BRAUN, 22 years, admitted May 25, discharged July 27, 1868.

Patient was a laborer at Hudson River Railroad Depot. While in the act of helping to lift a railroad car from the dock to the deck of a vessel, the car fell back and struck him on the head. When admitted he had a large wound of the scalp from the front up to the top of the face; his lip was also cut through. Twenty-six sutures had to be made to unite this large wound. Nevertheless, it healed fully, and hardly a sign was left of it when the patient left the Hospital.
