	On 10/17/59, (protect identity), Treasurer, Rand Development Corporation, contacted the Cleveland Office and advised that on 10/16/59, he had received a cablegram from JAMES H. RAND in Moscow, USSR. In this cablegram RAND stated he was to meet with the subject in company with (FNU) SCHNEIDER, U. S. Diplomatic Representative in Moscow on 10/17/59. Said that he had just received a long-distance call from RAND on 10/17/59 and that RAND said that he and U. S. Consular Representative met with the subject and a Russian Diplomatic Representative at a Russian Police Station in Moscow, USSR on this date. RAND stated that the subject was in apparently good health and under no form of duress or restraint and the subject formally renounced his U. S. citizenship, stating he wished to remain in the Soviet Union inasmuch as he likes the Soviet system better than the American system. The Russian Diplomatic Representative advised the subject in the presence of RAND and the U. S. Diplomatic Representative that if he remained in the Soviet Union, he would have less than one per cent chance of ever
